CREAM CHEESE PECAN BARS

I love it when a recipe starts with a cake mix and just few ingredients. When it makes bar cookies, it's even better! Less time baking, more time quilting.

1 box yellow cake mix

1 cup chopped pecans

½ cup butter, melted

3 eggs

1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese, softened

1 bag (1 lb.) powdered sugar

Heat oven to 325°. Lightly grease 13 x 9 pan with cooking spray.

In large bowl, stir cake mix, pecans, butter and 1 of the eggs with a spoon until well blended. Press mixture in bottom of pan.

In medium bowl, beat remaining 2 eggs, cream cheese and powdered sugar with electric mixer on medium speed until smooth. Pour over cake mix base.

Bake 40 minutes or until set; cool completely on wire rack. Cut into 15 bars - 5 rows of 3 bars each.
