



Canvas Floor Cloth

Eazy Peazy Gal™

This project is based on the instructions found in *Scrap-O-Lator, Quilts and More* by Dianne Springer. Her delightful book goes into depth of how to do this project plus how to use scraps in fun and useful ways. We recommend you purchase it.

Supplies:

Piece of artist canvas...sealed with Gesso if not already primed. Consult with artist supply store.
Fabric scraps of any size
Large jar of Mod Podge either Matte or Gloss finish
Water base Polyurethane Sealer
Several foam brushes
Double faced bonding such as Heat 'n Bond®
Teflon® pressing sheet

General Directions:

Start in center. Brush on some Mod Podge to the canvas. Lay on the first piece, then brush Mod Podge over it. Repeat with subsequent pieces of fabric in the same manner making sure to overlap the pieces a bit.
A border can be added all around.
Apply several layers of water based polyurethane sanding lightly and dusting between coats.
Iron on 1" width of Heat 'n Bond® around the outer edges on the wrong side. Protect the canvas with Teflon® pressing sheet. Turn raw edges under 1" to back side.
Fuse again in small sections using a Teflon® pressing sheet.
