

# WILD CAT WOMAN



Fabric designed by Loralee Designs for Blank Quilting  
Wild Cat Woman quilt designed by Heidi Pridemore for Blank Quilting  
Finished Size is 80" x 80"



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All seam allowances are 1/4". Please read all directions before beginning and press carefully after each step.

## Fabric Requirements:

**Fabric A:** One panel of 5523 Multi

**Fabric B:** 1-1/4 yards of 5525 Brown

**Fabric C:** 3-1/2 yards of 5524 Blossom

**Fabric D:** 1-1/8 yards of 5526 Brown

**Fabric E:** 3/4 yard of 5526 Gray

**Fabric F:** 5/8 yard of 5525 White

**Fabric G:** 3/4 yard of 5525 Blossom

**Fabric H:** 1/2 yard of Eclipse 3955 Jet

**Fabric I:** 3/8 yard of Rock Candy M4875 Satchet

**Backing:** 5 yards of 5526 Blossom

**You will also need:** 1 yard of Fusible Web

## Cutting Directions:

**Fabric A:** Refer to the quilt photo and cut the panel into two sections. One should measure approximately 22-1/2" x 24-1/2" and the second should measure approximately 21-1/4" x 24-1/2".

**Fabric B:** Cut eight 4-1/2" x width of fabric (WOF) strips.

**Fabric C:** Cut eight 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Piece the strips together to make two 8-1/2" x 80-1/2" strips and two 8-1/2" x 64-1/2" strips. Fussy cut ten 10-1/2" squares centering each one Wild Cat Woman.

**Fabric D:** Cut forty 5-1/2" squares.

**Fabric E:** Cut eight 10-1/2" squares.

**Fabric F:** Cut seven 2-1/2" strips. Piece the strips together into two 2-1/2" x 64-1/2" strips and two 2-1/2" x 60-1/2" strips.

**Fabric G:** Cut eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

**Fabric H:** Cut four 1-1/2" x 28-1/2" strips and four 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" strips.

**Fabric I:** See instructions to eight sets of lips.

**Backing:** Cut and sew the backing into one 88" square.

## Quilt Top Assembly Instructions:

1. Sew one 4-1/2" x WOF Fabric B strip to each side of the two Fabric A panels. Trim the ends of each Fabric B strip flush with the top and bottom of the panels. Sew one 4-1/2" x WOF Fabric B strip to the top and bottom of the two panels. Trim the Fabric B strips flush with the panel sides to make two panel blocks.
2. Trim the two Panel blocks to measure 28-1/2" square, making sure to keep the panel in the center.
3. Sew one 1-1/2" x 28-1/2" Fabric H strip to each side of each Panel Block. Sew one 1-1/2" x 30-1/2" Fabric H strip to the top and bottom of the Panel Block. Set them aside.
4. To make one square-in-a-square block, place one 5-1/2" Fabric D square on the top left corner of one 10-1/2" Fabric C square, right sides together (fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press (fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric 1/4" from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam.
5. Follow Figure 3 for the seam direction to add a 5-1/2" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the 10-1/2" Fabric C square to make one square-in-a-square block.
6. Repeat Steps 4 and 5 to make ten square-in-a-square blocks.
7. To make the Lips block, following the manufacturer's instructions, trace eight lip templates onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
8. Press each template to the back side of Fabric I. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
9. Refer to the quilt photo and press one lips template to the center of each 10-1/2" Fabric E square. Finish the raw edges of the appliques with a decorative stitch such as a satin or button hole stitch.
10. Refer to the quilt photo and sew together five square-in-a-square blocks and four lips blocks to make one nine patch block. Repeat to make a second nine patch block.
11. Refer to the quilt photo and sew together two nine patch blocks and two panel blocks to make the quilt top.
12. Sew one 2-1/2" x 60-1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 2-1/2" x 64-1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
13. Sew one 8-1/2" x 64-1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of the quilt top. Sew one 8-1/2" x 80-1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and bottom of the quilt top.
14. Layer, quilt and bind as desired.






