7/8 yard Snow Allover - Navy (B) 356-77*
$17 / 8$ yards Snowflake - Navy (C) 359-77
$2 / 3$ yard Mittens Allover - Aqua (D) 353-60
$11 / 8$ yards Bias Plaid - Multi (E) 354-9
$21 / 4$ yards Novelty Snowman Stripe - Multi (F) 357-11
$43 / 4$ yards Snowman \& Critters Allover - Navy (Backing)
351-77
*Includes binding

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Snowman Panel - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (1) $211 / 2 " \times 371 / 2 "$ rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Snow Allover - Navy (B), cut:

- (2) $21 / 2 " \times 371 / 2 "$ WOF strips.
- (2) $21 / 2$ " $\times 251 / 2$ " WOF strips.
- (7) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips for the binding.

From the Snowflake - Navy (C), cut:

- (9) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ strips.
- (5) $21 / 2 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 / 3$ squares.
- (5) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (1) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $21 / 2 " \times 101 / 2 "$ strips.
-(3) $11 / 2>\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $11 / 2 " \times 601 / 2 "$ strips.
-(3) $11 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $11 / 2 " \times 461 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Mittens Allover - Aqua (D), cut:

- (3) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) $27 / 8$ " squares.
- (5) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 "$ squares.


## From the Bias Plaid - Multi (E), cut:

- (3) $27 / 8 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) $27 / 8 /$ squares.
-(5) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) $21 / 2 "$ squares.
- (4) $2 "$ x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 " $\times 621 / 2 "$ strips.
-(3) 2 " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 " $\times 491 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Novelty Snowman Stripe - Multi (F), cut:

- (2) $53 / 4 " \times 80 "$ Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) $53 / 4 " \times 64 "$ LOF strips.


## From the Snowman \& Critters Allover - Navy (Backing), cut:

- (2) 84 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68 " x $84 "$ back.

Block Assembly
Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 371 / 2 "$

Fabric B strip to each side of the $211 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 371 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 251 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).
Trim the block to measure $241 / 2 " \times 401 / 2 "$.

2. Place (1) $27 / 8 "$ Fabric E square on top of (1) $27 / 8 "$

Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $21 / 2 "$ square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (80) Unit 1 squares total.


Unit 2
3. Sew (4) Unit 1 squares together into a $2 \times 2$ matrix to make (1) $41 / 2 "$ Unit 2 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (20) Unit 2 squares total.

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4. Place (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric D square on the left side of (1) $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance.

5. Place (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric E square on the right side of the $21 / 2 " \times 41 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 9).
6. Repeat Steps $4-5$ to make (80) Unit 3 strips total.

7. Sew (1) $21 / 2 "$ Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) $81 / 2$ " Unit 4 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (20) Unit 4 squares total.

8. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the left
side of (1) Unit 4 square to make (1) $10^{1 / 2 "} \times 81 / 2 "$ Block One rectangle (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (16) Block One rectangles total.

9. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the left side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) $21 / 2^{\prime} \times 101 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the bottom of the newly sewn block to make (1) $101 / 2$ " Block Two square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.

10. Sew (1) $21 / 2 " \times 81 / 2 "$ Fabric C strip to the right side of (1) Unit 4 square. Sew (1) $21 / 2{ }^{\prime} \times 101 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to the bottom of the newly sewn block to make (1) $101 / 2$ " Block Three square (Fig. 13). Repeat to make a second Block Three square.

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11. Sew together (5) Block One rectangles lengthwise, alternating the orientation from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 14).

## 12. Repeat Step 11 and

 refer to Figures 15-17 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Right Side Border, Top Border and Bottom Border.

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 13. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.
14. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
15. Sew (1) $11 / 2 " \times 601 / 2 "$ Fabric $C$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $11 / 2$ x $461 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
16. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 621 / 2$ " Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x $491 / 2 "$ Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
17. Center (1) $53 / 4 " \times 80$ " Fabric F strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $1 / 4 "$ from the top edge of the block and stop a $1 / 4$ " from the bottom edge. DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS. Repeat with the opposite side.
18. Repeat Step 17 to sew (1) $5 \frac{3 / 4 " \times 64 " \text { Fabric F strip to }}{\text { 1 }}$ the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $1 / 4$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 18).
19. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 18), draw a 45 -degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.
21. Sew the (7) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
22. Bind as desired.
