

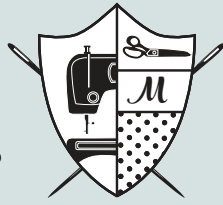

MINT FOR YOU STARS QUILT

BEFORE YOU BEGIN:

Finished Size: 44" x 58"

FABRIC REQUIREMENTS:

1 Mint for You Panel
1/2 Yard Teal Floral
1/2 Yard Super Pink Sprinkle Hearts
1 1/4 Yards Riley White Solid

Sashing:

1 1/2 Yards Blush Sprinkle Hearts

Binding:

1/2 Yard Cranberry Scallops

Backing: 1 · Yards 60" Wide Minky Fabric
OR

3 Yards 42" Wide Quilting Cotton

CUTTING:

From the Mint for You Panel:

12 pieces 6 1/2" x 6 1/2"

From White Fabric (Fabric A):

12 pieces 7 1/4" x 7 1/4"

48 pieces 3 1/2" X 3 1/2"

From Super Pink Heart Print (Fabric B):

24 pieces 4" x 4"

From Teal Floral Print (Fabric C):

24 pieces 4" x 4"

Blush Pink Sprinkle Hearts Fabric:

16 pieces 2 1/2" x 12 1/2"

10 pieces 2 1/2" x 40"

10 pieces 2 1/2" x 5"

STEP ONE: CREATE FLYING GEESE BLOCKS

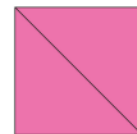
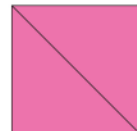
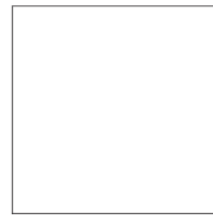
How to Make Four at a Time Flying Geese:

For the flying geese blocks in the Sawtooth Star unit, we will be using the Four at a Time flying geese method.

Begin with:

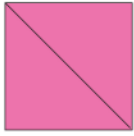
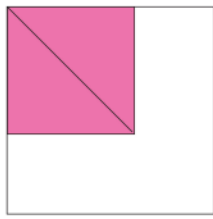
One 7 1/4" x 7 1/4" piece of White Fabric (Fabric A)

Four 4" x 4" pieces of Super Pink Fabric (Fabric B)



Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of all of the 4" x 4" Fabric B pieces.



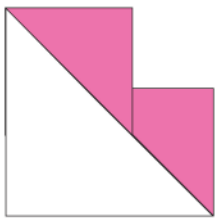
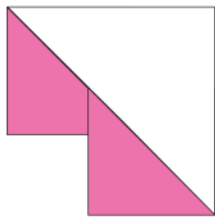


Line up one of the 4" x 4" Fabric B squares to the top corner of the 7 1/4" square of Fabric A. Right sides facing.

Line up a second 4" x 4" Fabric B piece on the opposite corner.

Stitch 1/4" out from the line you drew on both sides.

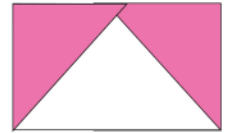
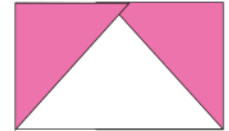
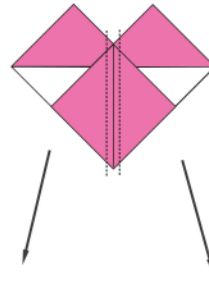
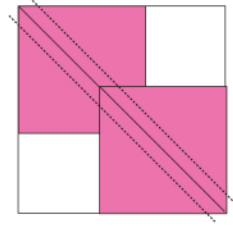
Cut the piece apart along the line.



Flip the Fabric A pieces up and press in place.

Beginning with one of the sewn units, use another 4" x 4" piece of Fabric B and line it up with the remaining corner of the original square.

Sew along both sides of the drawn line with a 1/4" seam allowance.



Cut apart along the drawn line.

Repeat with the second unit.

You will end up with four flying geese units when you are finished.

Trim and square up to 3 1/2" x 6 1/2".

Be sure to complete this step. You will trim quite a bit of fabric off to square up the block.

Repeat this process five more times, so you have 24 Pink Heart/White flying geese blocks.

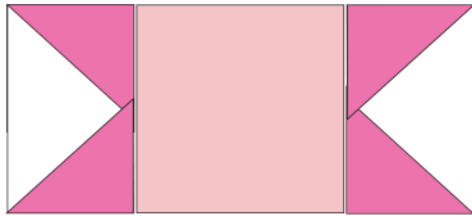


Repeat this process six more times, but with Fabric C (teal floral) instead of Fabric B. You will end up with 24 Teal Floral/White Flying Geese Blocks.



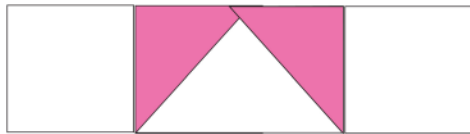
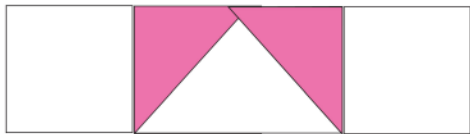
STEP TWO: ASSEMBLE SAWTOOTH STAR BLOCK

Refer to the diagram on the last page for exact fabric placement.



Sew one of your completed flying geese units to two sides of the 6 1/2" square cut from the Mint for You Panel.

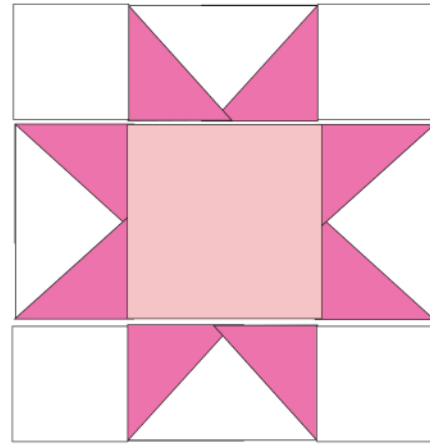
Press seams towards the center.



Sew one 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" piece of Fabric A to both sides of another of the remaining flying geese units of the same fabric print. Repeat with another flying geese unit.

Press the seams towards the outside of the block.

Assemble as shown.



Trim and square up to 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" if necessary.

Repeat until you have twelve completed Sawtooth Star Blocks.

ROWS & SASHING:

This quilt is assembled by rows. You will sew all the pieces in row 1 together, then row 2, 3 & 4. You will then sew the sashing to the rows before you sew the rows together.



Row 1: Sew one 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" piece of sashing fabric to each side of one of your completed Sawtooth Star blocks.

Sew another block to this unit.

Sew another 2 1/2" x 12 1/2" piece to this unit, then another block, then another sashing strip.

Repeat for rows 2-4

FINAL ASSEMBLY:

Sew one 2 1/2" x 5" piece to one 2 1/2" x 40" piece along the 2 1/2" sides. You will end up with a strip of fabric that is 2 1/2" x 44 1/2".

Repeat until you have five 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" sashing strips.

Sew one 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" strip to the top of row 1.
Sew another 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" to the bottom of row 1.

Sew row two to the bottom of the sashing strip below row 1.

Repeat until the quilt top is assembled.
