Finished quilt measures: 56 " $\times 69$ "

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

two 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:
fourteen 5-1/4" squares for the Flying Geese seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
fifty $3^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Half-Blocks
eighty $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles for the Blocks
six $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips. Subcut:
eighty 3 " squares for the HSTs
four 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:
fifty-six 2-7/8" squares for the Flying Geese
eleven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one hundred 2-1/2" squares for the Square-in-a-Square Units.
Mark a diagonal line on the back of each square.
eighty $2-1 / 2$ " square for the Blocks
eleven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:
eight 1-1/2" $\times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strips for the Zig Zag Rows
From each of Fabrics B-F, cut:
two 3" x WOF strips. Subcut: sixteen $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the HSTs
one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: sixteen 2-1/2" squares for the Blocks

## From Fabric G, cut:

two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirteen 4-1/2" squares for the Square-in-a-Square Units

## From Fabric H , cut:

two 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
twelve 4-1/2" squares for the Square-in-a-Square Units
one $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip. Subcut:
twenty 1-1/2" squares for the Blocks
From each of Fabrics I and J, cut:
one 5-1/4" x WOF strip. Subcut: seven 5-1/4" squares for the Flying Geese
two 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: twenty-eight 2-7/8" squares for the Flying Geese

From the Binding, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

Step 1: Place a 2-1/2" Fabric A square in the upper right corner of a Fabric G square, right sides together. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal line. Sew on the marked line, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam allowance. Press. Repeat on each of the remaining corners with another 2-1/2" Fabric A square. The resulting Square-in-a-Square (SIAS) unit should measure 4-1/2" square.


Step 2: Repeat Step 1 to make thirteen Fabric G SIAS units and twelve Fabric H SIAS units.


## Step 3: Gather:

two $3^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangles
one Fabric G SIAS unit
Step 4: Sew the rectangles to the top and bottom edges of the SIAS unit. Press the seams toward the rectangles. The resulting Half-Block should measure $4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 9-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat to make thirteen from Fabric G and twelve from Fabric H.

## Assemble the Blocks

Step 5: Pair a 3" Fabric A square with a 3" Fabric B square, RST. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of one square. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ away from both sides of the marked line. Cut on the marked line, creating two half-square triangles (HSTs). Press toward the darker fabric. Trim to 2-1/2" square. Repeat to make thirty-two A/B HSTs.

Step 6: Repeat Step 5 to make:

thirty-two A/C HSTs

thirty-two A/D HSTs

thirty-two A/E HSTs

thirty-two A/F HSTs


Step 7: Gather:
one 2-1/2" Fabric B square
one 2-1/2" Fabric A square two A/B HSTs

Arrange the units into two rows of two. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 8: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams in opposite directions.
Step 9: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the four-patch.

Step 10: Repeat Steps 7-9 to make four A/B Four-Patch units.


## Step 11: Gather:

one 1-1/2" Fabric H square
four $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangles
four $A / B$ Four-Patch units
Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 12: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams away from the Fabric A rectangles.

Step 13: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the Block. The resulting Block should measure 9-1/2" square.
 Make four B Blocks like this.

Step 14: Repeat Steps 7-13 to make:

four C Blocks

four D Blocks

four E Blocks

four F Blocks

Assemble the Block Rows
Step 15: Gather:
one Block in each of Fabrics B, C, D and E three Fabric G Half-Blocks
two Fabric H Half-Blocks
Arrange together to form Row 1, noting the fabric placement and block orientation in the diagram. Sew together and press.


Step 16: Repeat to make Block Rows 2-5.

## Assemble the Zig Zag Rows

Step 17: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric A squares in opposing corners of a $5-1 / 4$ " Fabric J square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.


Step 18: Sew scant $1 / 4$ " seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 19: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

Step 20: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric A square at the corner of sewn block unit. Draw diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam on each side of diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along diagonal line, creating two identical units.


Step 21: Press the seam toward smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ if necessary. Repeat to make four J/A flying geese blocks.

Step 22: Repeat with all remaining 2-7/8" Fabric A, I and J squares and 5-1/4" Fabric J, A and I squares to make a total of:

twenty-eight J/A
flying geese units

twenty-eight A/J
flying geese units

twenty-eight I/A flying geese units

twenty-eight A/I flying geese units

Step 23: Sew one J/A unit to an A/J unit, as shown. Take extra care to match the Fabric J edges. Press the seam open. Repeat to make twenty-eight units like this.


Step 24: Repeat Step 23 to make twenty-eight units with the Fabric I flying geese.


Step 25: Sew fourteen Step 23 units together to form a row. Press. Sew a $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 56-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A strip to the top and bottom of the row. Press toward the strips. This is a Zig Zag Row. Make two from Fabric J.


Step 26: Repeat Step 24 to make two rows with the Fabric I flying geese.

## Assemble the Quilt



Step 27: Arrange the Block Rows and Zig Zag Rows together. Note the fabric placement and row orientation in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 28: Sew the rows together to form the quilt. Press the row seams open.
Your quilt top is complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
