$11 / 8$ yards Swirling Snow - Red (B) 9702-88*
$1 / 3$ yard Snowman and Animal Allover - Gray (C) 9704-90
$3 / 8$ yard Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (D) 1063-01W
½ yard Snowflake - Gray (E)
9706-90
$1 / 2$ yard Hot Cocoa Toss - Blue (F)
9705-11
$1 / 3$ yard $\quad$ Squirrels and Birds - Multi (G) 9708-9
$11 / 8$ yards Snowflake - Blue (H) 9706-11
4 yards Squirrels and Birds - Multi (Backing) 9708-9
*Includes binding

## Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

## From the Snowman Blocks - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (6) 11" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Swirling Snow - Red (B), cut:

- (4) 2 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 " x $11 "$ strips.
- (4) 2 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) $2 "$ x $14 "$ strips.
- (3) 1 " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 1 "x $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) $1 "$ x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) $1 " \times 91 / 2 "$ strips.
-(6) $21 / 2 " x$ WOF strips for the binding.
From the Snowman and Animal Allover - Gray (C), cut: -(1) $81 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sub-cut (2) $81 / 2 "$ squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (D), cut:
-(3) $2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2 " \times 481 / 2 "$ strips.

- (2) 2 " $\times 391 / 2 "$ WOF strips.

From the Snowflake - Gray (E), cut:
-(7) 2" x WOF strips.

## From the Hot Cocoa Toss - Blue (F), cut:

-(7) $2 " x$ WOF strips.
From the Squirrels and Birds - Multi (G), cut:

- (1) $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) $8 \frac{1}{2} / 2$ squares.

From the Snowflake - Blue (H), cut:

- (3) $51 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $51 / 2 " \times 511 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips.
- (3) $51 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $51 / 2 " \times 491 / 2 "$ strips.


## From the Squirrels and Birds - Multi (Backing), cut:

-(2) 69 " x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the $57 " \times 69 "$ back.

## Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) $2 " x 11 "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 11" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 14 " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure $121 / 2 " \times 121 / 2 "$. Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.

2. Sew (1) 1 " $\times 8 \frac{1}{2} "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $81 / 2 "$ Fabric C square. Sew (1) 1"x $91 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric C square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 square.
3. Sew (1) $1 " \times 8 \frac{1}{2} "$ Fabric B strip to each side of (1) $8 \frac{1}{2} "$ Fabric G square. Sew (1) $1 "$ x $91 / 2 "$ Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric G square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make a (4) Unit 2 squares total.

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4. Sew together (4) $2^{" \prime} \times$ WOF Fabric E strips and (4) $2 " x$ WOF Fabric F strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Strip Set 1 (Fig. 4).
5. Cut the Strip Set 1 into (12) 2" $\times 121 / 2 "$ Unit 3 strips (Fig. 5).

6. Sew together (3) 2" x WOF Fabric F strips and (3) 2 " x WOF Fabric E strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Strip Set 2 (Fig. 6).
7. Cut the Strip Set 2 into (12) 2" x $91 / 2 "$ Unit 4 strips (Fig. 7).

8. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) $121 / 2 "$ Block Two square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.
9. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) $121 / 2 "$ Block Three square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Block Three squares total.

10. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 10). Repeat to make Row Three.
11. Sew (1) Block Three square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 10). Repeat to make Row Four.
12. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 10-11, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 10).

Quilt Top Assembly (Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 13. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 481 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x $391 / 2 "$ Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
14. Sew (1) $51 / 2 " \times 511 / 2 "$ Fabric $H$ strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $51 / 2 " \times 491 / 2 "$ Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
15. Layer and quilt as desired.
16. Sew the (6) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
17. Bind as desired.
