Create the look of curves with just straight line piecing. Careful fabric placement will enhance the illusion of interlocking rings and curves. Construct the units oversized and use the Wedge Ruler from Studio 180 to trim. Another chance to use that ruler if you bought it to make the Alaska quilt. Finished size of the quilt is 77"x77".

Quilt Challenge

It has been awhile since we have done a challenge so here we go! I have a challenge for you.

The theme of the challenge is <u>TEN</u>. Your challenge creation does not have to have the number TEN on it (unless that's what you want), but must represent TEN. It can have ten blocks, ten fabrics, ten items, ten of anything. Just let your imagination go wild and have fun.

Basic Rules;

-We must be able to see the idea of TEN at least once on your item. Your creation can be traditional contemporary.

- -You can make your choice of item, such as a wall hanging, tote bag, clothing, or whatever comes to mind.
- -You are free to use whatever quilting method works best for your creation.
- -It must be made from fabric, there is no limit to the number of fabrics or kinds of fabric unless your representation TEN is ten fabrics and embellishments are optional.
- -Finished size is your choice, but no smaller than 12 inches and no bigger than 160 inches outside perimeter.

Deadline;

Your creation must be submitted by April 21. They will hang in the store and be voted on until May 9 when we will announce the winner.

Prizes;

There will be 2 prizes awarded, to the first and second winners, determined by the number of votes they receive.

1st Prize; A pair of Gingher scissors 2nd Prize; 3 spools of Aurifil thread




Machine Embroidery

Cost: \$15.00 each month




Ten Good Reasons to Buy Fabric

Dash It All Pattern

Dash It All (2 Sizes)





Throw/Twin 72"x80"

This quilt is constructed using a strip-piecing method. Please read all instructions before cutting. Seams are 1/4". Pressing directions are indicated.

Instructions:

- 1. Stitch strips into (throw 24, baby 12) three-strip sets.
- 2. Cut each strip set into (2) 6-1/2"x14-1'/2" blocks and (2) 6-1/2"x6-1/2" blocks.
- 3. Stitch a 6-1/2" square to one end of each 6-1/2"x14-1/2" rectangle as shown. Press toward the 6-1/2" square. Make (48, 24) units.
 - 4. Stitch (4,3) units from Step 3 together in vertical rows. Press seams toward the 6-1/2" blocks. Make (12,8) vertical rows.
 - 5. Stitch vertical rows together, flipping every other row, as shown above. Press seams in either direction.
 - Layer quilt top, batting and backing. Quilt as desired.
 - 7. Stitch binding strips together. Bind the quilt.



Baby 50"x62"

Supplies	Throw/Twin	Baby
Strips	2 Jelly Rolls (72) 2-1/2" strips	1 Jelly Roll (36) 2-1/2" strips
Border	None	1/3 yard Cut (6) 1-1/2" strips
Binding	5/8 yard Cut (8) 2- 1/2" strips	1/2 yard Cut (6) 2-1/2" strips
Backing	4-1/4 yds	3-1/4 yds
