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Ribbon Candy

1/4" Seam Allowance Check

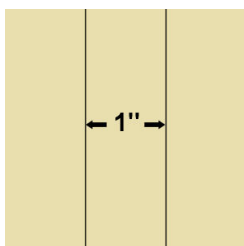
To check if your seam is accurate, cut three 1 1/2" x 3" pieces from scrap fabric.

Sew the pieces together along the 3" side, using what you believe is a 1/4" seam.

Press away from the center piece.

Measure.

The center piece should be exactly 1" wide.



If, when you measure, the center is less than 1", your seam allowance is too large. You need to move the needle to the right.

If it's more than 1", your seam allowance is too small and you need to move the needle to the left.

Consult your machine's owner's manual for instructions on moving your needle position.

Repeat this check until your center strip measures correctly.

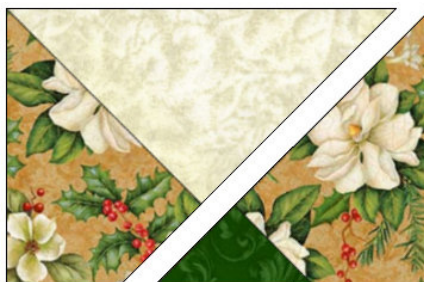

KEY	CUTTING INSTRUCTIONS	WOF=width of fabric
A	(3) 4" x WOF. Subcut: (24) 4" squares (1) 6 ¹ / ₄ " x WOF. Subcut: (6) 6 ¹ / ₄ " squares (5) 2" x WOF. Subcut: (48) 2" x 3 ¹ / ₂ " rectangles (3) 2 ³ / ₈ " x WOF. Subcut: (48) 2 ³ / ₈ " squares (2) 12 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Subcut: (31) 2" x 12 ¹ / ₂ " rectangles	
B	(48) template A	
C	(1) 5 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Subcut: (2) 5 ¹ / ₂ " squares and (6) 3 ¹ / ₄ " squares and (2) 2" squares (2) 2" x WOF. Subcut: (24) 2" squares	
D	(6) 5 ¹ / ₂ " squares, fussy cut, centering on motif	
E	(2) 2" x WOF. Subcut: (36) 2" squares	
F	(2) 2 ³ / ₈ " x WOF. Subcut: (24) 2 ³ / ₈ " squares (4) 2" x WOF. Subcut: (70) 2" squares (1) 4 ¹ / ₄ " x WOF. Subcut: (6) 4 ¹ / ₄ " squares (2) 5 ¹ / ₂ " squares	
G	(2) 2" x WOF. Subcut: (36) 2" squares (6) 2" x WOF	
H	(2) 3 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF. Subcut: (24) 3 ¹ / ₂ " squares (7) 2 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF for binding	
I	(6) 5 ¹ / ₂ " x WOF	

Block A:

Make 6

1. Cut one fabric A 6¹/₄" square twice diagonally. Cut one fabric C 3¹/₄" square twice diagonally.
2. Stitch one fabric B template A to one fabric A 6¹/₄" triangle from step 1.
3. Stitch one fabric B template A to one fabric C 3¹/₄" triangle from step 1.
4. Combine the units as shown. Trim to 4" x 5¹/₂". Make four units.

5. Combine the units along with four fabric A 4" squares and one fabric D 5½" square as shown. Square to 12½". Make six blocks.



Block B:

Make 6

6. Stitch two fabric E and two fabric G 2" squares together to make a four-patch unit. Square to 3½".

7. Use four fabric A and four fabric F 2⅜" squares to make eight half-square triangle (HST) units. Square to 2".

8. Combine two HST units with one fabric E and one fabric G 2" square to make a four-patch units as shown. Square to 3½". Make four units.

9. Use the technique sheet on page 8 to make quick corners on two corners of one fabric H 3½" square as shown. Make four units. Square to 3½".

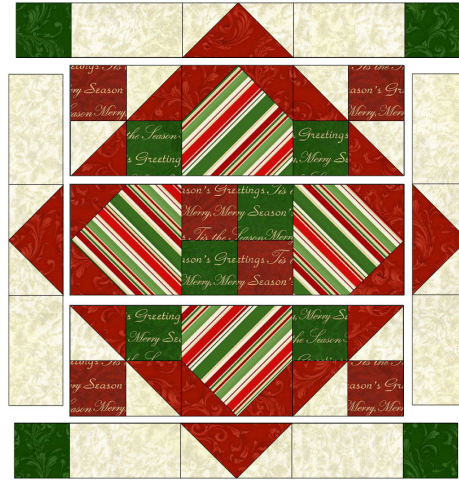
10. Use one fabric F 4¼" square and four fabric A 2⅜" squares to make four flying geese units using the technique sheet on page 7.

11. Add one fabric A 2" x 3½" rectangle to each end of each flying geese unit. Trim to 2" x 9½". Make four units.

12. Combine all the units as shown, adding four fabric C 2" squares. Square to 12½". Make six blocks.

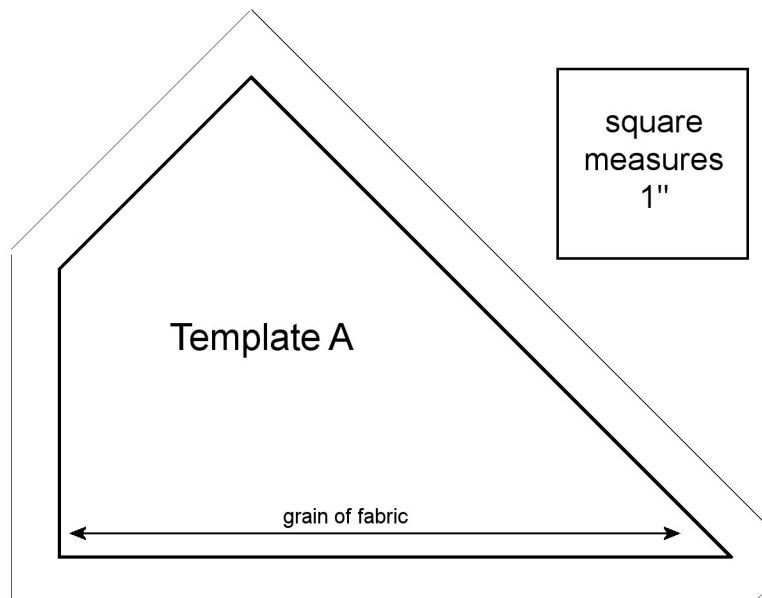


Assembly:

13. Use the assembly diagram on page 6 to stitch the blocks together, adding the fabric A 2" x 12½" rectangles and fabric F 2" squares as shown.
14. Stitch six fabric G 2" x WOF strips together end-to-end. Cut two 2" x 56" pieces and add to the left- and right-hand sides of the quilt. Cut two 2" x 42½" pieces and add one fabric C and one fabric F 2" square to each end of each strip. Add to the top and bottom of the quilt. (see assembly diagram for square placement)
15. Stitch six fabric I 5½" x WOF strips together end-to-end. Cut two 5½" x 59" pieces and add to the left- and right-hand sides of the quilt. Cut two 5½" x 45½" pieces and add one fabric F and one fabric C 5½" square to each end of each piece. Add to the top and bottom of the quilt. (see assembly diagram for square placement)

Finishing:

16. Layer, baste and quilt as desired.
17. Bind with seven fabric H 2½" x WOF strips.

Assembly Diagram



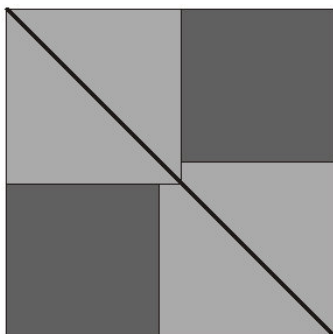

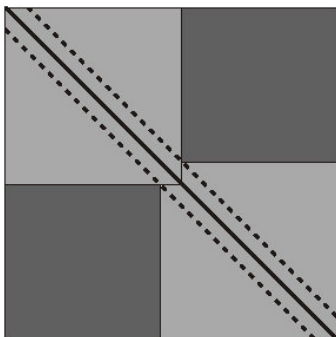
No-Waste Flying Geese

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the smaller squares.

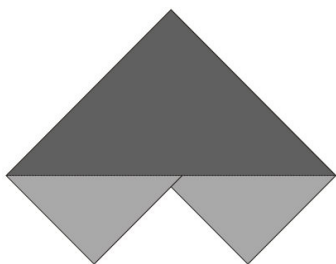
Add two smaller squares to one larger square, right sides together, as shown.



Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.

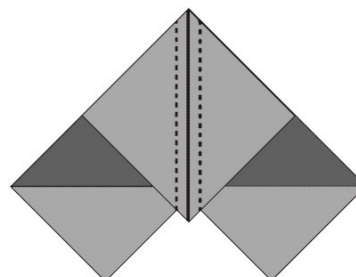


Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward.



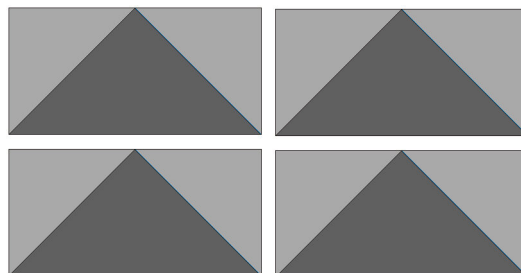
Add one small square, right sides together, as shown.

Stitch a 1/4" seam on each side of the drawn line.



Cut on the drawn line and press small triangles outward. Trim to the size indicated in the pattern.

Each set of one large square and four small squares makes four flying geese units.

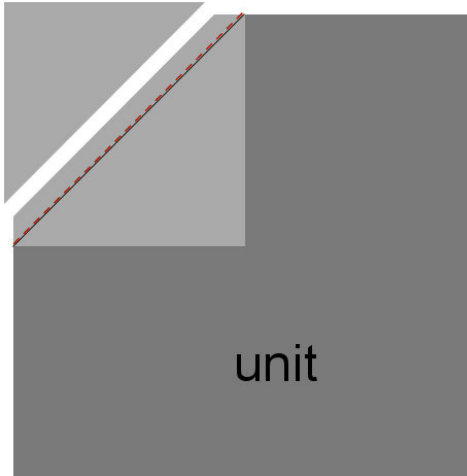
Quick Corners

Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of the small squares (black line).

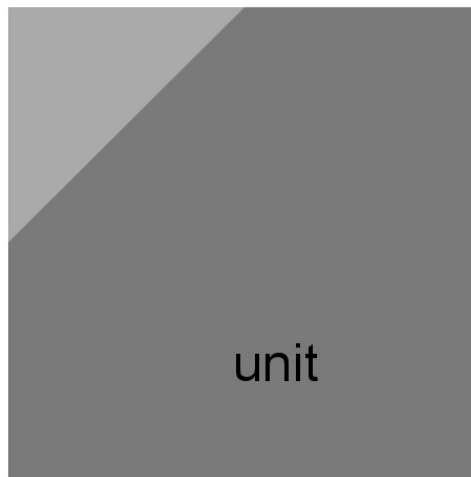
Layer one square, right sides together, on top of the unit.

Stitch on the drawn line (red line).

Cut away excess, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



Press triangle outward.



Repeat as instructed/shown in pattern.
