THE MULITPLE STITCHES OF A SERGER

When you think of a serger, your mind likely goes to the standard four thread overlock that is most commonly used. But did you know sergers have multiple different stitches? Let me break down the types of stitches and when you'd want to use them.

Overlock

The Overlock stitch is the most commonly used stitch on a serger. The upper and lower looper threads lock together evenly over the fabric edge to encase all of the



raw edges and prevent fraying. This is a very sturdy stitch. If the seam does not need to be pressed flat the overlock stitch can be used for construction as well. If the seam needs to be pressed flat, each piece of fabric can be stitched with the overlock stitch before sewing on a sewing machine. Many people also like to use a 4 thread overlock to attach binding to one side of a finished quilt before hand sewing the second side. An overlock stitch can also be created using 3 threads. The stitch will just be a little less durable.

Rolled Edge

A rolled edge is the narrowest stitch possible on a serger. Rather than the seam laying flat as it did with an overlock



stitch, the serger will roll the fabric edge around the stitch finger. The upper looper thread will still wrap around the fabric to seal in raw edges, but the lower looper thread will be almost invisible on the back side. This stitch works well for seaming sheer or lightweight fabrics. It also makes a good decorative finish like on the edge of a napkin.

Flatlock Seaming

A flatlock seam works well to join two fabrics together. After the seam is stitched the edges are pulled open and flattened within the stitch to create a non-bulky joint. This is best done with fabrics that do not ravel. The flatlock stitch can be done with 2 or 3 threads. The Flatlock stitch also makes a great decorative stitch.



Blanket Stitch

When stitching the blanket stitch on the serger, the top stitching will look very similar to the blanket stitch on a sewing machine. The backside however, will look like a more traditional serger stitch with the thread woven back and forth. This stitch is frequently used to finish off the edges of a blanket (thus the name).

THE MULITPLE STITCHES OF A SERGER CONTINUED

Ladder Stitch

The ladder stitch is a decorative stitch that can created anywhere on a piece of fabric. The fabric is folded together and the stitch is created on the fold. The fabric is then gently pulled open and revealing the



ladder stitch. In the photo, you will see both sides of the ladder stitch.

Wave Stitch

The wave stitch is a specialty decorative stitch only available on some Baby Lock Sergers. The upper and lower loopers threads gradually switch places every 25 stitches to make the appearance of a wave.



Chain Stitch

The chain stitch will appear like a straight stitch from a sewing machine on the top of the fabric. However on

the bottom, the looper thread creates a chain. The chain stitch has much more stretchability than a traditional sewing machine straight stitch. It is great to attach elastic to garments or apply bias tape. The chain



stitch could also be used as a decorative stitch. On the purple cork pictured the chain stitch was stitched with the right side up for the horizontal lines and with the wrong side up for the vertical lines.

Safety Stitch

A safety stitch is a combination of a chain stitch and an overlock stitch. A 4 thread or 5 thread safety stitch can be sewn. This thread is used to seam and overlock the edge of fabric in one step and is the garment industry standard stitch.

Cover Stitch

A cover stitch is frequently seen in finished commercial garments. The top appears as two rows of straight stitches with an overlock stitch on the underside of the fabric. A cover stitch can also be created with 4 threads (triple cover stitch) resulting in three rows of stitching on the top.




Not all sergers will be able to do all stitch types. It depends on the machine and the number of threads. These stitches can also be used in various combinations. On the Baby Lock Triumph, this results in 87 different stitch combinations.

Serger Trim Bin by Baby Lock

Sergers do such a nice job of cleaning up all your raw edges and removing all those fibers. But they have to go somewhere! Usually all of your table or floor. The Serger Trim Bin eliminates this problem by sliding securely under your serger and collecting all the bits in a bag that can be easily dumped in the trash.

Clear Foot for the Serger by Baby Lock

Using a clear foot on your serger allows for better visibility because the foot is see through. All stitch types can be stitched with this foot. There are also raised guidelines on the foot to aid in stitching accuracy.

Fabric Guide by Baby Lock

To stitch precise stitching lines every time when chain stitching or cover stitching, the Fabric Guide is a must. This firmly attaches to the bed of your serger and provides a guide for your fabric.



Serger Guide Stickers by Creative Notions

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The Serger Guide Stickers stick to the bed of your serger providing useful guides for stitching. They are easy to install, just line up the red line with your needle and press firmly on the bed of the machine.










THE CRAFTY GENTLEMAN'S GUIDE TO MODERN PAPER PIECING


The first thing you'll notice with this book is the unique packaging. hardcover case with bungee cord closure opens up to reveal two pockets. One contains paper templates that can be photocopied as needed to complete the projects. The second pocket contains a soft cover book with all the details. If you've never paper pieced, this book is a great guide! The first section walks you through the whole process—what is paper piecing, what kind of fabric should you use, what tools do you need, etc. I liked the handy page of the essential rules to paper piecing. It really maps out all the major points.


The next section walks you through in detail (with great photos) how to paper piece. A really simple block is used so you can see exactly what is being done. The third section includes seven



The final section includes seven projects that make use of the paper pieced blocks. But they are also great basic projects so you could substitute a solid fabric if your heart isn't into paper piecing.

Various tips are sprinkled throughout the book, that will translate well to other projects. The tip that stuck out the most to me was what to do when you can't press a seam allowance to the darker fabric. You can't control the seam

Saturday, April 29 & May 6 11:30 am - 4 pm

Learn beginner sewing skills including how to use a sewing machine, fabric selection, and making three awesome projects during this two session class.

Class I: During the first class you'll meet the Baby Lock Brilliant Sewing Machine and learn all about how a basic sewing machine works: threading, winding a bobbin, selecting your stitch and more. Jump into your first project bobbin, threading your by stitching up a pillowcase to take home at the end of the first class. We'll help you select fabric and you'll learn to use a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler for perfectly straight cuts. You'll also get started on a tote bag with interior pockets. While making the tote you'll learn how to install handles, boxing bag corners, topstitching, and more.

Class 2: First up you'll finish your tote bag. Then we'll tackle one of everyone's biggest fears . . . zippers! But no need to be afraid, thanks to our tips you'll be ready to sew zippers in everything. You'll leave class with a lined zipper bag.

The \$75 class fee includes nine hours of instruction time, three printed patterns, and use of the Baby Lock Brilliant Sewing Machine. You will also need to purchase fabric and supplies during each class. We'll supply all the tools for you the first week and discuss what you'll need to continue your sewing journey. To give you an idea additional supplies for class will cost approximately \$75. Your cost may be higher depending on which fabrics you select and what tools you need.



Thursday, April 6, 13, 20, & May 4 2:00 - 5:00 pm or 6:00 - 9:00 pm

Do you want to learn to quilt or improve your skills? This is the class for you; no quilting experience needed.

However you do need to be comfortable with basic operation of your sewing machine including winding a machine, and sewing a straight line. At the end of the four sessions, you will have learned the basic skills of quilt making while making a



table topper. We want to make sure your quilt is completed at the end of the four sessions, so there will be homework each week.

Class I: We'll be discussing tools and selecting fabrics. You'll also learn the basics of using a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler to cut your fabric.

Class 2: You'll need to bring your sewing machine to this class. We'll discuss sewing with an accurate 1/4" seam and start piecing your blocks.

Class 3: It's your first quilt so your blocks may not have turned out exactly the right size. It's okay! Diane will help you square up your blocks and determine how to cut your background so everything fits together. We'll also discuss various ways to quilt your table topper and you'll get started quilting.

Class 4: This week you'll finish up the quilting and learn how to finish off the edges with binding.

The \$99 class fee includes 12 hours of instruction. The book, New Patchwork and Quilting Basics is needed for class (\$24.95). This book is a great resource for quilting basics and includes many great project patterns. You will need to bring your sewing machine to class starting with the second week. During the first session, we'll discuss the tools needed for quilting and help you select fabric. On average students spend \$50-\$150 on fabric and additional supplies for class.

ADVANCED BEGINNER QUILTING: HALF SQUARE TRIANGLES

Monday, April 3, 17, & 24 1:00 - 4:00 pm

Have you completed beginning quilting and your wondering what's next? Our Advanced Beginner Quilting classes are the perfect next step. Each class series will focus on a different common quilt block that you'll see over and over again in quilts. In this advanced beginner class, we'll be focusing on the Half Square Triangle. It can be difficult to sew so the diagonal exactly bisects the square. We have some great tips to help you easily and accurately sew this block. Just like Beginning Quilting, the goal is for you to finish the



tote at the end of the three sessions, so there will be homework each session.

BEYOND THE FRAME

Thursday, April 20 starting at 11:00 am

Looking for embroidery machine inspiration? Well look no further! Join Zandra Shaw for her new



webinar series, Beyond the Frame! This series will teach and inspire you while you learn how to get the most out of your embroidery machine. There's something for everyone regardless of the size of your embroidery field. Join us each month to watch the webinar, enjoy some snacks, and visit with fellow embroiders. Bring a USB stick and receive the design files for that month's project. Everyone who attends will have a chance to win a design pack from Zandra! Best of all there is no charge for this club. No need to sign up, just show up for the fun!

Class I: You've already learned to cut your fabric during Beginning Quilting, so we'll have you do that ahead of time and we can get right to the sewing. During the first class, you'll learn to sew half square triangles two at a time. To make a lot of half square triangles in record time, you'll also learn to sew the blocks eight at a time. Lastly you'll learn to use the Bloc_Loc ruler to perfectly trim down each half square triangle.

Class 2: You've got a week off between sessions to stitch the front of the tote together. We'll add side panels to your bag and talk about quilting options for your bag front, back, and handle. This a great project to try out some fun variegated thread.

Class 3: For the final class, you'll assemble your tote bag learning to create a slip pocket, box your corners, and complete assembly.

Completion of Beginning Quilting is not a prerequisite for Advanced Beginner Quilting, but you do need to be comfortable with basic quilting skills including cutting fabric, 1/4" seam, and pressing.

The \$75 class fee includes nine hours of instruction time and printed pattern. You'll need to bring your sewing machine and basic sewing supplies each week. You'll also need to select fabric prior to class. We encourage you to purchase your fabric at Rae-Bon to better ensure a high quality finished product.

EVANS STREET OPEN SEW


