NEW YEARS RESOLUTION. . . SEW MORE!

To you find yourself always to busy to do the hobbies you Wake up Earlier or Stay Up a Little Later Instead of enjoy, like sewing? This year make it your New Years Resolution to carve out time for yourself to do a little sewing. Here are a few tips to find some extra time:

Be Prepared Have your space set up and ready to sew at a moments notice. If you're lucky that could mean a whole room, but a cabinet in the corner could work great too. Also spend a little time making sure you have all the supplies you need for a particular project and organize them in a project bag. This way you don't have to spend any precious sewing time searching down supplies or getting stalled out with a run to the store.

Write it in Pen on your Calendar Block off time on your calendar and make that appointment just as important and immoveable as a doctor's appointment. To really firm up the appointment, take a class at Rae-Bon. We've got some great beginner and technique building classes happening this month. By popular request, we're starting a group of classes called Advanced Beginner Quilting for those who have completed Beginning Quilting but are looking to build up their skills a bit more before jumping into other projects.

Find a Portable Project Handwork like cross stitch, hand embroidery, binding, and hand quilting are great to take with you on the road. Break Your Project into Manageable Bits It can be overwhelming to thing of completing an entire project and how much time that is going to take. So instead think of your project in more manageable chunks. Don't think of it as I need to find time to work on this throw quilt think of it as I'll spend an evening cutting blocks, a night to complete five blocks, another night to do the next five. Break down your project into pieces you can accomplish with limited time. Block of the Months can also be a great way to help break down a project into smaller parts. There's no pressure to get the whole project down because you only receive a section each month. We've got a couple of fun block of the months in the works that will launch in February or March.






Guide to Gadgets making your life easier

Apliquick System



Appliqué is easy with the Apliquick system! Trace your pattern on the fusible stabilizer (or cut it out with your digital cutter) and fuse to the wrong side of your fabric. The fusible stabilizer has enough body so that seam allowances can be folded easily. Use the Apliquick Fabric Glue Stick on the seam allowance. This glue has a slower drying time so you'll have lots of time to adjust your fabric while turning under the edges. It is also has a more fluid texture than your typical glue stick to better saturate your fabric and make it easier to manipulate. Lastly use the Apliquick rods to turn the fabric edges. The Apliquick Tools include a pronged rod to hold the appliqué piece steady and a pointed rod to turn the fabric over the stabilizer and press it in place. They are easy to use. The fork on one allows you to hold the small piece in place while the other beveled rod is used to brush the fabric over the edge of the foundation paper; use a glue pen or stick to add a slight smear of water soluble glue along seam line; use the pointed ends of your rods to flatten out any puckers or ripples so that everything lays nice and flat. Ruler Handle


Sometimes you need just a little extra grip on your ruler. This ruler handle is large enough to provide a surface to grip, but not so huge that it takes over your entire ruler.

Itty Bitty Scissors

These tiny, adorable scissors are only 1.37" long. Perfect to throw in your bag for a scissor on the go to cut thread. They come with a cover so you and the scissor are protected. Plus they are spring loaded so they'll open automatically. A variety of colors are available.







IQ Designer is a powerful tool allowing you to create your own embroidery designs right on your machine. No software needed! But with all this power it can be a little hard to know how to get started. That's where Baby Lock's new Mastering IQ Designer Book comes in. This resource is packed with tips, diagrams, and tutorials to get you creating in IQ Designer. It includes a whopping 21 projects in addition to overall information. The projects run the gamut including ornaments, mug rugs, bags, pillows, trivets, earrings, and so many more. You'll enjoy creating wonderful projects while also learning great techniques in IQ Designer that you can use again and again when creating your own embroidery.

IQ Designer is included on the Solaris, Destiny, Valiant, Venture, Altair, and Meridian. The version of IQ Designer has changed over time and the tools and capabilities have progressed with each version. Newer versions have brought in bigger hoops sizes, new tools, capabilities, functions, and more. This book covers IQ Designer in all of its iterations. Each project notates which machines have all the features needed to create the project. It also notates which machine Baby Lock Educators used to create the project.

There are many moving parts in a sewing machine and if it moves, it needs lubrication. These days many of the moving parts are housed with computer circuit boards and wires around them and are inaccessible to the home sewer. A factory trained technician needs to open up the machine to lubricate parts that you are unable to access as well as clean areas you are unable to reach. For best performance and years of sewing, we suggest you have your machine serviced annually.

CLASSES

LEARN TO SEW

Sign Up

Tuesday, January 17, 24, & 31 1::00 - 4:00 pm or 6:00 - 9:00 pm

Learn beginner sewing skills including how to use a sewing machine, fabric selection, and making three awesome projects during this three session class.

Class I: During the first class you'll meet the Baby Lock Brilliant Sewing Machine and learn all about how a basic sewing machine works: threading, winding a bobbin, selecting your stitch and more. Jump into your first project needed. However you by stitching up a pillowcase to take home at the end of the first class. We'll help you select fabric and you'll learn to use a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler for perfectly straight cuts.

Class 2: You'll learn to sew a tote bag with interior pockets. While making the tote you'll learn how to install handles, boxing bag corners, topstitching, and more.

Class 3: For the final class, we'll tackle one of everyone's biggest fears . . . zippers! But no need to be afraid, thanks to our tips you'll be ready to sew zippers in everything. You'll leave class with a lined zipper bag.

The \$75 class fee includes nine hours of instruction time. three printed patterns, and use of the Baby Lock Brilliant Sewing Machine. You will also need to purchase fabric and supplies during each class. We'll supply all the tools for you the first week and discuss what you'll need to continue your sewing journey. To give you an idea additional supplies for class will cost approximately \$75. Your cost may be higher depending on which fabrics you select and what tools you need.



BEGINNING QUILTING

Sign Up

Do you want to learn to quilt or improve your skills? This is the class for you; no quilting experience do need to be comfortable with basic operation of your sewing machine including winding a bobbin, threading your



machine, and sewing a straight line. At the end of the four sessions, you will have learned the basic skills of quilt making while making a table topper. We want to make sure your quilt is completed at the end of the four sessions, so there will be homework each week.

Class I: We'll be discussing tools and selecting fabrics. You'll also learn the basics of using a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler to cut your fabric.

Class 2: You'll need to bring your sewing machine to this class. We'll discuss sewing with an accurate 1/4" seam and start piecing your blocks.

Class 3: It's your first quilt so your blocks may not have turned out exactly the right size. It's okay! Diane will help you square up your blocks and determine how to cut your background so everything fits together. We'll also discuss various ways to quilt your table topper and you'll get started quilting.

Class 4: This week you'll finish up the quilting and learn how to finish off the edges with binding.

The \$99 class fee includes 12 hours of instruction. The book, New Patchwork and Quilting Basics is needed for class (\$24.95). This book is a great resource for quilting basics and includes many great project patterns. You will need to bring your own sewing machine to class starting with the second week. During the first session, we'll discuss the tools needed for quilting and help you select fabric. On average students spend \$50-\$150 on fabric and additional supplies for class.

ADVANCED BEGINNER QUILTING: FLYING GEESE TABLE RUNNER

Friday, January 6, 20, & 27 I:00 pm - 4:00 pm

Have you completed beginning quilting and your wondering what's next? Our new Advanced Beginner Quilting classes are the perfect next step. Each class series will focus on a different common quilt block that you'll see over and over again in quilts. First up is the Flying Geese Block. This block can be tricky to sew without losing one of the points. We have some great tips to help you easily and accurately sew this block. Just like Beginning Quilting, the goal is for you to finish the runner at the end of the



three session, so there will be homework each session.

Class I: You've already learned to cut your fabric during Beginning Quilting, so we'll have you do that ahead of time and we can get right to the sewing. During the first class, you'll learn to sew individual Flying Geese blocks and sew Flying Geese four at a time.

Class 2: Have you ever had trouble getting seams to match up? Nesting seams is the solution. You'll learn that and how to attach borders on your table runner this week.

Class 3: This week we'll do a slight twist on binding and add a flange.

Completion of Beginning Quilting is not a prerequisite for Advanced Beginner Quilting, but you do need to be comfortable with basic quilting skills including cutting fabric, 1/4" seam, and pressing.

The \$75 class fee includes nine hours of instruction time and printed pattern. You'll need to bring your sewing machine and basic sewing supplies each week. You'll also need to select fabric prior to class. We encourage you to purchase your fabric at Rae-Bon to better ensure a high quality finished product.





