CROSS STITCH TIPS & TRICKS

Rae-Bon Sew & Quilt Shop has expanded into cross stitch. When stitching it is important to maintain an even tension. We have a variety of patterns, cloth, thread, and tools to get you cross stitching. If you're an avid cross stitcher and have some requests, let us know so we can add to the department.

This month we though we'd share a couple of tips for cross stitching.

It's probably obvious but wash your hands before you get started. This is true of quilting too, but your cross stitch project will likely endure many more hours of handling. While you may not notice it right away, over time the oils from your skin can cause yellowing of the fabric and floss.

Starting with the right length of floss will help cut down on the amount of tangling. The ideal length of floss is the distance from the tip of your finger to your elbow. You can also cut all of the loops on the bottom of your skein thus creating 24 equal lengths of thread. Using the right length of thread will also save you time in the long run because you won't have to pull the floss out so far from your finished piece when stitching.

To get a plumper looking stitch, strip your thread before starting. This means separating out each strand individually from the skein and then put them back together before threading your needle.

When you end your floss, trim the tails as you go. If you leave long tails to trim at the end, the tails are more likely to get caught in future stitches or end up on the front of your project.

You should be pulling the thread tight, but not so tight that you stretch out the hole.

As you're stitching your thread will probably start to twist, we all naturally twist the needle slightly with every stitch. Every few stitches, let your needle dangle and allow the thread to naturally unwind.

Cross stitch likely isn't a one night project (unless you're making a really small project!). When you are not working on your project, remove the cloth from the hoop. By storing your piece outside of the hoop you'll reduce the amount of creasing in the fabric.

You may still end up with a bit of creasing in the fabric and need to iron your project flat. Lay the piece right side down on a wool mat or towel and only iron from the backside. This will reduce your chance of flattening the stitches.





TULA PINK'S BUTTERFLY QUILT PIECED BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Tula Pink brings back her iconic Butterfly quilt using all new fabrics from her latest collections. We'll be offering this as a 10 month block of the month beginning March 1. The finished size of the quilt is $88" \times 94"$.

The first month you'll receive the entire pattern and fabric for the purple blocks. Each month

you'll receive additional fabric and notes on the section to be completed.

There is a \$30 sign up fee and the block of the month is \$22 per month. This includes the pattern and fabric for the top and binding.





HOOPSISTERS DIAMOND SKILL BUILDER MACHINE EMBROIDERY

The Diamond Skill Builder is very versatile! Each block builds a skill to be applied to the next block including basic piecing in the hoop, as well as piecing skills on a sewing machine. The "blocks" are 60° Diamonds that can be laid out in either a Star formation or a strip quilt formation. The Diamond shaped blocks come in two sizes to fit either a 6" x 8" hoop or a 9" x 113/4" hoop.

The back can be completed using the HoopSisters traditional sashing method OR a one piece back attached using a sewing machine with walking foot, or even a long arm. Long arm design files are also included.

The classroom will be open the first Thursday of the month if you'd like a little extra help on the blocks or just to stitch with friends.

CLASS POLICIES

Call, visit our website, or stop in to sign up and pay for the class of your choice. Class fee is due when you register.

The class supply list will be available when you register and pay for the class. Supplies are not included in the class fee unless otherwise specified. Please have supplies purchased before class. Kits required are available at the store. No photocopied or sharing of patterns or books will be allowed in classes.

Please be setup and ready to begin class at the specified time.

We consider your enrollment to be a commitment to take the class and we in turn make a commitment to the instructor. No cancellations are allowed on classes. Thank you for not asking us to make exceptions.

Your sewing machine or serger must be in top working condition before you arrive at class. Students whose equipment is not working properly disturb and slow down the class. We service all brands of machines and sergers so come see us prior to the start of the class.

CLASSES

BEGINNING QUILTING

Wednesday, March 9, 16, 23, & 30 1:00 - 4:00 pm or 6:00 - 9:00 pm

Do you want to learn to quilt or improve your skills? This is the class for you; no experience needed. At the end of the 4 sessions, you will have learned the basic skills of quilt making: fabric selection, rotary cutting, accurate piecing, quilting, and binding. In



the first class, we'll be discussing tools and selecting fabrics. A 20% discount will be given on supplies purchased during the first class. We want to make sure your quilt is completed at the end of the four sessions, so there will be homework each week. Bring your own machine. Class fee is \$75 plus supplies and book.

BEGINNING SEWING: INSULATED LUNCHBOX

2 Session Class: Monday, March 7 & April 4 1:00 - 4:00 pm or 6:00 - 9:00 pm

If you have little to no sewing experience, this class is for you! In this class, you'll learn rotary cutting basics, topstitching, and bag assembly while making an insulated zip up lunchbox. No need



to install the zipper - it's already been sewn in for you!

This bag has a few more steps than are usual beginning sewing project so it is a two session class. No need to bring anything to class; everything is included in the class fee. The class fee of \$75 includes six hours of instructor time, all supplies, and use of a Baby Lock machine. Select your own fabric when you arrive. Class is open to those 16 and older.

CITY STREETS QUILT

Friday, March 4 Noon - 5:00 pm

What direction are you headed in? Learn how to stitch up these arrow blocks and arrange them in whatever directions you'd like. City Streets is a great throw quilt. But if you're looking for something a little bigger it's easy to add more blocks! Purchase of the City Streets Quilt Kit is



required for class. There is no class fee. You will need to bring your own sewing machine and the book, Follow Your Heart.

EMBROIDERY LAB: **TWISTED TOTE**

Tuesday, March 15 & April 19 11:00 am - 4:00 pm

In March & April, we'll be stitching up the HoopSisters Twisted Tote. All the blocks for this tote are made on your embroidery machine. The tote is lined and has four zippered pockets on the outside and four pockets on the inside. The large square bottom makes it easy to tote around bigger items. Choose between two sizes: large (minimum hoop size 7 3/4" x 9") or medium (minimum

hoop size $5 \frac{3}{4}$ " x $6 \frac{3}{4}$ ") Purchase the Twisted Tote Embroidery CD and HoopShape bundler for \$56.99 and the class fee is waived. You will also need to purchase fabric. In the first session, bring your embroidery machine and embroider out the blocks. During the second session, bring your sewing machine to assemble the tote.



GRANDMA'S BLESSINGS

Tuesday, March 22 1:00 - 4:00 pm

Our latest block of the month is a great technique builder. Each month Sandy will show you how to create these classic blocks with a modern twist. You'll be piecing the blocks slightly



oversized and using the Studio 180 tools to trim the blocks to the precise size. Bring your sewing machine and create your monthly blocks in class. The class is only open to those participating in the Grandma's Blessings Block of the Month.

For March's block we'll be using the Magic Wand and the Tucker Trimmer to create combination units.



SERGER PROJECT AHOY BAG

2 Session Class Saturday, February 26 & March 26 10:30 am-4:00 pm

Can you believe this bag is entirely created on the serger!? The Ahoy Bag has 6 pockets: two inside, one on the front, one on the back, and a pocket on each side. There is an internal frame work of webbing to allow for the extra weight in a bag this large. Accents include prairie points and cording. The class fee is \$125 and includes a full color pattern and in person instruction with Sandy and Val. You will also have lifetime access to online video instructions

from the pattern designer, Deb Canham. The bag is designed for an 8 thread serger, but if you only have a 4 thread serger, we will help you figure out modifications. Some of your stitches will appear differently. You will need to bring your own serger, fabric, and supplies.



OPEN SEW

This showstopping bag features a woven back panel and woven front pocket. It's a step up from traditional weaving as the strips are woven in three different directions. In the first class, you'll create the woven panels. During the second session, you'll bring your sewing machine and we'll

assemble the bag. The bag features an interior slip pocket, an interior zippered pocket, exterior zippered pocket, cross body strap, and handles.

The class fee is \$75 and includes the pattern for turning your weaving into a purse. You will need to purchase the Woven Stars pattern, fabric, and supplies.

Were you wowed by a Scan n Cut demo but are a little nervous to get started? Or maybe you just know there is more you could be doing with your Scan n Cut? We've got you can get hands on practice. a class for you!

Jennifer has created a five session class covering a range of the Scan n Cut features. Each session will build on previous knowledge so you become an expert on the Scan n Cut and Canvas Workspace. It's easier to remember what different features do and why you would want to use them when making an actual project, so Jennifer has curated a collection of projects across a range of crafts. You'll create beautiful things while learning all your machine can do. We hope you'll love all the projects but if some of them are not your style or interest, please remember you're learning the techniques! Once you have these valuable skills you'll be able to apply them to future projects that you dream up. The class will meet on the fourth Monday from February-June from I-5 pm.

The materials you need to create each project are

included in your class fee. These classes are your opportunity to try out lots of different techniques and materials to see what you like. No need to buy an entire roll of foil if that's not your cup of tea. We'll have a sample for you to use in class. But if you love the fusible web we're testing out, we can show you how to purchase more.

You will need to bring your Scan n Cut to class each session as well as any

Scan n Cut consumables (mats, blades, etc.) and some basic crafting supplies. A supply list will be provided each session so you know what to bring. Some sessions we will for editing and creating cutting files. For these sessions you will need to bring a laptop (recommended) or tablet so

The Scan n Cut class is only open to those with a machine from the DX series (machines with an auto blade). The kit fee (\$175) will include all the materials for each project and a workbook to walk you through each lesson. There is no class fee if your Scan n Cut was purchased at Rae-Bon Sew & Quilt Shop. The class fee is \$150 for machines purchased elsewhere.

Class I

Let's get the Scan n Cut out of the box! It's okay if you've never used your machine. We'll start with the basics this session and cut a couple of built in designs. We'll also go over different setting options and tools built into your machine.

> Projects: Framed Quilt Block and Wood Ornament

Materials to Cut: cotton fabric and iron on foil

Sampling of Skills You'll Learn: fussy cutting, drawing seam allowances, resizing designs, and weeding



Class 2

While the Scan n Cut works without a computer, Canvas be using Canvas Workspace, Brothers free online software Workspace really expands what you can create. Brother

also offer a ton of ready to go projects for you within Canvas Workspace. This session we'll setup a Canvas Workspace account and play with some of the basic features. Laptop (recommended) or tablet required.

Projects: Cork Notebook Cover, Tear Away Gift Tags, & Vinyl Text for Framed Quilt Block

Materials: cork, cardstock, and vinyl

Sampling of Skills You'll Learn: exporting files from Canvas Workspace, importing SVG files, adding text for cutting and drawing, how to layer vinyl



Class 4

Canvas Workspace allows you to create your own cut files. This session we'll dive deeper into all Canvas Workspace can do. Laptop (recommended) or tablet required.

Projects: Collection of Greeting Cards

Materials: cardstock, transparency film

Sampling of Skills You'll Learn: Process overlap features, character spacing, image tracing, creating score



lines, and direct cut

Class 3

The Scan n Cut makes cutting out appliques a breeze. Did you know the Scan n Cut can read a pes file? We'll cut applique for machine embroidery. We'll also use a printed pattern to create a cut file.

Projects: Cupcake Zippered Pouch, Hello Spring Banner, and Camera Applique Mug Rug

Materials: fabric with a variety of fusible web and OESD
