BATTING DEMYSTIFIED

When it comes to quilting, we spend so much time selecting the perfect fabrics and pattern to create the guilt top. Hours, days, or event months stitching it together. Similar care is used to select the perfect coordinating fabric for the back. But how much time do you really spend thinking about your batting? You know you need some in the center of your quilt, btu does it really matter which package you choose?

The type and quality of batting you select can make a big difference in your finished project. At Rae-Bon Sew & Quilt Shop, we primarily sell Quilter's Dream Batting because of it's focus on quality. Quilter's Dream uses the longest fibers possible so all of their batting drapes beautifully. Longer fibers also prevent bearding. This is where the batting starts to migrate through the quilting stitches and appear on the top or bottom of your quilt. Quilter's Dream is also a very clean batting. You won't find any cotton hulls or other things mixed in the batting. This means a better looking stitch because there is nothing for your needle to get caught on and nothing to show through your quilt top.

At Rae-Bon Sew & Quilt Shop, we carry wool, cotton, polyester, and blend battings in the thinnest loft. Other loft options are available and we're always happy to special order them for you. Let's dive into the types of batting:



Cotton Bating

Cotton Batting is a great insulator and absorbs moisture so it will be warm in the winter and cool in the summer. It shrinks 1-3% when washed so it will give your quilt a beautiful crinkled appearance. Cotton batting does hold a crease when it's folded, so probably not the best choice for your holiday quilts that stay folded up much of the year. At a minimum, there should be quilting every 8". You should be careful when handling cotton batting as it can be stretched out and hold a hand print.

Blend Batting

Quilter's Dream Blend batting is 70% cotton and 30% polyester. It is the only Quilters Dream Batting with a scrim. The scrim is a polyester layer that the cotton is needle punched into. The scrim layer prevents the batting from stretching out. The scrim layer also allows quilting to be a bit more spread out if desired (up to 12" apart). Blend batting maintains many of the features of cotton batting like shrinking and absorbing moisture.

Polyester Batting

A standard polyester batting has 5 million fibers per pound. Quilters Dream has 60 million fibers per pound. This much larger number of fibers means the batting has a beautiful drape and feel very similar to cotton batting. Polyester batting does not absorb moisture so it will resist staining and the quilt will be quicker to dry-making it a great choice for a toddler quilt that's carried everywhere. It is wrinkle resistant, so it would make a great choice for

a holiday quilt. If you prefer the look of a flat quilt, polyester is the way to go as it will not shrink in the wash. At a minimum, quilting should be every 12".

Dream Green Batting

Dream Green Batting has all the same proprieties as a polyester batting, but it is made from recycled soda bottles. The batting can vary in color from white to light green depending on the color of bottles used for manufacturing.

Wool Batting

Wool batting has a high loft. This can really accentuate your quilting. Similar to cotton it is an natural material make it a great insulator and absorber of moisture. There will be some shrinking with wool but not as much as cotton (<.5%). The wool fibers are thermally bonded. Because of this the quilt should not be placed in a dryer. Even at a low temperature the fibers can melt and cause the batting to be become hard and stiff. Wool has no memory for creases making it an excellent choice for holiday quilts.



Ovrus Delicate Fabric Wash

Ovrus is a pure detergent that does not contain bleaches, enzymes, sulfates, fillers, brighteners, or other



chemicals that might affect textiles. This makes it an excellent product to clean your quilts and needlework. One word of caution—do not add any acids like vinegar to the wash. This can lower the ph of the water and cause the detergent to fuse with the fibers of the fabric.



Heat Press Batting

Do you have leftover batting pieces that aren't quite large enough for your project? Fuse your leftovers together using Heat Press Batting Together. It is 1.5" wide



cloth tape than can be laid over two edges of batting and then ironed to fuse the batting together. The tape is soft and a bit stretchy so it will move with your batting and is easy to stitch through.

Amodex Ink & Stain Remover

Amodex is an eco-friendly ink and stain remover. Of special interest to quilters, Amodex can remove color run and ghosting from a Frixion pen. Plus it removes a host of other stains like blood, sharpie, coffee, and more.







LEARN TO SEW



BEGINNING QUILTING



Saturday, April 29 & May 6 11:30 am - 4 pm

Learn beginner sewing skills including how to use a sewing machine, fabric selection, and making three awesome projects during this two session class.

Class I: During the first class you'll meet the Baby Lock Brilliant Sewing Machine and learn all about how a basic sewing machine works: threading, winding a bobbin, selecting your stitch and more. Jump into your first project bobbin, threading your by stitching up a pillowcase to take home at the end of the first class. We'll help you select fabric and you'll learn to use a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler for perfectly straight cuts. You'll also get started on a tote bag with interior pockets. While making the tote you'll learn how to install handles, boxing bag corners, topstitching, and more.

Class 2: First up you'll finish your tote bag. Then we'll tackle one of everyone's biggest fears . . . zippers! But no need to be afraid, thanks to our tips you'll be ready to sew zippers in everything. You'll leave class with a lined zipper bag.

The \$75 class fee includes nine hours of instruction time, three printed patterns, and use of the Baby Lock Brilliant Sewing Machine. You will also need to purchase fabric and supplies during each class. We'll supply all the tools for you the first week and discuss what you'll need to continue your sewing journey. To give you an idea additional supplies for class will cost approximately \$75. Your cost may be higher depending on which fabrics you select and what tools you need.



Thursday, May 11, 18, 25, & June 1 2:00 - 5:00 pm or 6:00 - 9:00 pm

Do you want to learn to quilt or improve your skills? This is the class for you; no quilting experience needed.

However you do need to be comfortable with basic operation of your sewing machine including winding a machine, and sewing a straight line. At the end of the four sessions, you will have learned the basic skills of quilt making while making a




table topper. We want to make sure your quilt is completed at the end of the four sessions, so there will be homework each week.

Class I: We'll be discussing tools and selecting fabrics. You'll also learn the basics of using a rotary cutter, mat, and ruler to cut your fabric.

Class 2: You'll need to bring your sewing machine to this class. We'll discuss sewing with an accurate 1/4" seam and start piecing your blocks.

Class 3: It's your first quilt so your blocks may not have turned out exactly the right size. It's okay! Diane will help you square up your blocks and determine how to cut your background so everything fits together. We'll also discuss various ways to quilt your table topper and you'll get started quilting.

Class 4: This week you'll finish up the quilting and learn how to finish off the edges with binding.

The \$99 class fee includes 12 hours of instruction. The book, New Patchwork and Quilting Basics is needed for class (\$24.95). This book is a great resource for quilting basics and includes many great project patterns. You will need to bring your sewing machine to class starting with the second week. During the first session, we'll discuss the tools needed for quilting and help you select fabric. On average students spend \$50-\$150 on fabric and additional supplies for class.

ADVANCED BEGINNER QUILTING: **COMBINATION &** HOURGLASS BLOCKS

Monday, May 8, 22, & 29 1:00 - 4:00 pm

Have you completed beginning quilting and your wondering what's next? Our Advanced Beginner Quilting classes are the perfect next step. Each



class series will focus on a different common quilt block that you'll see over and over again in quilts. In this advanced beginner class, we'll be focusing on the Combination and Hourglass Blocks. It can be difficult to sew so the diagonals exactly bisect the square. We have some great tips to help you easily and accurately sew these blocks. Just like Beginning Quilting, the goal is for you to finish the pillow at the end of the three sessions,

so there will be homework each session.

Class I: You've already learned to cut your fabric during Beginning Quilting, so we'll have you do that ahead of time and we can get right to the sewing. During the first class, you'll learn to sew hourglass blocks and combination units. You'll use the Tucker Trimmer to perfectly trim down each block. You'll also be sewing 4 patches and half square triangles.

Class 2: During the second class, you'll use all the blocks you've created to assemble the Queen's Petticoat Block and quilt your pillow top.

Class 3: For the final class, you'll learn how to create piping for the edge of your pillow. You'll also insert a zipper in the pillow back. You'll leave this class with a finished pillow that you can pop a pillow form in at home.

Completion of Beginning Quilting is not a prerequisite for Advanced Beginner Quilting, but you do need to be comfortable with basic quilting skills including cutting fabric, 1/4" seam, and pressing.

The \$75 class fee includes nine hours of instruction time and printed pattern. You'll need to bring your sewing machine and basic sewing supplies each week. You'll also need to select fabric prior to class. We encourage you to purchase your fabric at Rae-Bon to better ensure a high quality finished product.



It's all the great projects and information from our ScanNCut course packed into one week of ScanNCut Camp!

We'll cover a range features of the ScanNCut and CavnasWorksapce. It's easier to remember what different features do and why you would want to use them when making an actual project, so Jennifer has curated a collection of projects across a range of crafts. You'll create beautiful things while learning all your machine can do. We hope you'll love all the projects but if some of them are not your style or interest, please remember you're learning the techniques! Once you have these valuable skills you'll be able to apply them to future projects that you dream up.

The materials you need to create each project are included in your class fee. These classes are your opportunity to try out lots of different techniques and materials to see what you like. No need to buy an entire roll of foil if that's not your cup of tea. We'll have a sample for you to use in class. But if you love the fusible web we're testing out, we will have some on hand for you to purchase.

You will need to bring your ScanNCut to camp as well as any ScanNCut consumables (mats, blades, etc.) and some basic crafting supplies. A supply list will be provided so you know what to bring. You will also need to bring a laptop for hands on practice with CanvasWorkspace, Brother's free online software for editing and creating cutting files.

The ScanNCut Camp is only open to those with a machine from the DX series (machines with an auto blade). The kit fee (\$175) will include all the materials for each project

and a workbook to walk you through each lesson. There is no class fee if your ScanNCut was purchased at Rae-Bon Sew & Quilt Shop. The class fee is \$150 for machines purchased elsewhere.

Materials provided for each project may vary from the color or print pictured.



Session I - Monday, July 24 from I-5 pm

Let's get the ScanNCut out of the box! It's okay if you've never used your machine. We'll start with the basics this session and cut a couple of built in designs. We'll also go over different setting options and tools built into your machine. The ScanNCut makes cutting out appliques a breeze. Did you know the ScanNCut can read a pes file? We'll cut applique for machine embroidery. We'll also use a printed pattern to create a cut file.

Projects: Framed Quilt Block, Wood Ornament, Cupcake Zippered Pouch, Hello Spring Banner, and Camera Applique Mug Rug





Materials to Cut: cotton fabric, iron on foil, fabric with a variety of fusible web, and OESD sparkle vinyl

Sampling of Skills You'll Learn: fussy cutting, drawing seam allowances, resizing designs,

weeding, working with a pes file, scan to cut data, adding an offset, and utilizing the drawing tool

Session 2 - Tuesday, July 25 from 1-5 pm

While the ScanNCut works without a computer, CanvasWorkspace really expands what you can create.

Brother also offer a ton of ready to go projects for you within CanvasWorkspace. This session you'll setup a Canvas Workspace account and play with some of the basic features. Laptop required.



Projects: Cork Notebook Cover, Tear Away Gift Tags & Vinyl Text for Framed Quilt Block

Materials: cork, cardstock, and vinyl

Sampling of Skills You'll Learn: exporting files from CanvasWorkspace, importing SVG files, adding text for cutting and drawing, and how to layer vinyl

Session 3 - Wednesday, July 26 from 1-5 pm

CanvasWorkspace allows you to create your own cut files. This session we'll dive deeper into all CanvasWorkspace can do. Laptop required.

Projects: Collection of Greeting Cards

Materials: cardstock, transparency film

Sampling of Skills You'll Learn: Process overlap features, character spacing, image tracing, creating score lines, and

direct cut



Session 4 - Thursday, July 27 from 1-5 pm

Did you know your ScanNCut could cut wood? Or that you can use a stencil to wood burn? Let's put all of your ScanNCut knowledge to use and create some on trend home décor items.

Projects: Felt Flower Wreath and Wood Round Sign

Materials: felt, vinyl, balsa wood


