CLASSES SIGN UP DAYS: We shall discount by 10% the class fee for each class that you sign up for on or before Saturday, July 3.

HOLIDAY CLOSURES: Sunday, July 4 (Independence Day); Monday, July 5 (Independence Day observance), and Monday, September 6 (Labor Day).

WORKSHOP WITH SUSAN HUDSON: We are privileged to be able to host Susan Hudson, renowned Navajo quilt artist for a one-day class. Susan's quilts are exhibited in numerous museums world-wide. She communicates through her quilts issues that are critical to the Navajo, as well as other Native American groups. In that respect, she is a powerful social activist. Her art speaks to issues that are close to her heart, and you will be able to gain a greater understanding of these issues through your participation in her class.

Susan's class is Saturday, July 24, 9:30 – 3:30. She will teach you how to make a small appliqued panel depicting a Navajo woman and child. The figures in the panel are symbolic of some of her concerns affecting both women and children in the Native American community.

WORKSHOP WITH MARIA SHELL: The Quilt Works and the Albuquerque Modern Quilt Guild are honored to host Maria Shell for three, hands-on workshops at the Quilt Works. Handouts with complete information are available at the Shop and on our website.

Wednesday, August 18, 9:30-4:30. Making Prints. Learn how to piece an assortment of prints, solids, and colored fabrics into new units, and use these techniques for creating original quilts.

Thursday, August 19, 9:30-4:30. Circle and Curve Sampler. Improvisationally piece a collection of quilt blocks with circles and curves.

Friday, August 20, 9:30-4:30. Big Botany. With inspiration grounded in the Natural world, work through a design process that emphasizes sketching, developing color palettes, and creating patterns.

THE OUTBACK (AUSSIE COLOR AND DESIGN) ADVENTURE:

Have you ever wondered how quilt designers take fabrics from the bolt and piece them in excitingly imaginative new ways? We have a Meraki (creative, artistic, "labor of love") adventure for you. Lois Warwick leads you in a creative, 45-minute adventure at 8:30 am on the third Saturday of each month, July 17, August 21, and September 18.

. At each class, you will choose a fat eighth of one of our colorful Australian fabrics, be assigned a traditional block, and be challenged to choose complementary fabrics and create your own block, perhaps assembling the pieces in a uniquely different way.

Your "textbook" is *Block Genius, 201 Pieced Quilt Blocks* by Sue Voegtlin. Lois's display on the east wall of the classroom illustrates some of *her* Meraki adventures.

If you are new to quilting or want to sharpen some of your skills, we encourage you to go to our BASIC SKILLS CLASSES page. Our FAVORITE CLASSES have been offered before (in some cases, over and over!). The classes on our NEW CLASSES page are being offered for the first time in our shop (or offered again after a long hiatus).

GIFT CARDS : They are great presents, and can be purchased at the front desk. You may choose any value for the card.

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STAR SAMPLER, THE 2020-2021 BLOCK OF THE MONTH PROGRAM: As always, the pattern for the current month's block is free, and the pattern for each of the prior months is available for \$6.

In addition to the kit for the current month, we have kits for most of the prior months. If you desire a kit for one (or more) of the prior months and cannot find it on the shelf, submit a Special Order at the front desk; at present, we have sufficient fabrics in stock to satisfy these Special Orders.

REWARDS AND DISCOUNTS: In our new POS (Point of Sale) system, you are automatically credited with one Rewards point for every dollar you spend on full-price merchandise (unless a Discount has been applied to the transaction). Upon accumulation of 250 rewards points, your account is credited with \$25.00 that you may spend on a future transaction (and you don't have to look for your VIQ card). Here are the Discounts (you might view them as "instant" Rewards) that can be applied.

SEMI-ANNUAL AND OTHER SALES DISCOUNTS: Read your e-mail for information about the Discount applied to the purchase of full-price merchandise (and other) items for that Sale.

MILITARY DISCOUNTS: To express our appreciation to those who have or are serving our country in the US armed forces (including the National Guard and the reserves), we offer a 10% discount to the member and his/her dependents on all full-price merchandise.

BIRTHDAY DISCOUNTS: Be sure to shop on your birthday: You will receive a 25% discount on all full-price merchandise purchased on that day. (Special arrangements will be made if your birthday falls on a day when the shop is closed.)

STUDENT DISCOUNT COUPON: As an additional incentive to take classes at *The Quilt Works*, we offer Student Discount Coupons. This Coupon entitles you to a one-time 20% discount on full-price merchandise, and is valid for 30 days. You will receive this Coupon at the first class meeting. (*Basic Rotary Skills* and visiting instructor classes are excluded.)

SENIOR DISCOUNT DAY: Each Tuesday is a "Senior Discount Day." Your senior discount (for those 60 and older) is 10%.

"WE'VE GOT YOUR BACK" DISCOUNT: Bring in and show us your finished quilt top, and we shall give you a 20% discount on the cost of the fabric for the back.

END OF BOLT DISCOUNT: If you take all of the full-priced fabric that remains on a bolt, regardless of the amount, your discount is 10%

RELOCATION OF THE HALF-PRICED ITEMS: In the near future, we shall move the half-price fabric and other items out of the classroom, to minimize disruptions in the classes. Please honor closed classroom doors.

OPEN SEWING DAYS

POLICIES: As of the date of publication of this Newsletter, (1) it is our observation that we will remain well within the Governor's occupancy limitations (75% of maximum capacity), (2) we shall continue to expect all persons in the shop to wear masks, (3) and we have discontinued using clothes pins to monitor and limit the number of people in the Shop. We expect customers to continue entering through the west door, and departing through the door by the cash register. Remember that there are hand sanitizer dispensers by both doors.

QUILTS OF VALOR SEW DAYS: 10:00 am to 2:00 pm, on the first and third Thursdays of each month (except August, when we shall meet just once, on the 5th). We are delighted to have Pat Forshaw, the local Group Leader for the Quilts of Valor Foundation, as the host for these days.

FIRST FRIDAY SEW-IN: 4:30 pm – 7:30 pm, first Friday of each month. Join us for three hours in which we devote ourselves to *your* quilting projects. They can be UFOs, quilts on which you are "stuck", etc. It is a full spectrum opportunity, all the way from the preliminary design to putting on the finishing touches. You are welcome to work on your own projects throughout the evening, and/or spend some time sewing (sharpening your skills, perhaps) on our charity quilts. There is no charge.

QUILT SEW LATE – QSL: 4:30 pm - ?::? pm, on the last Friday of each month. This is another opportunity to quilt with your friends. Given the progress we have made in minimizing the spread of the COVID-19 virus, we plan to return to our traditional format with a pot luck supper. The event does not end until the last quilter present unthreads his/her needle. We usually work on our own projects. The cost for the evening is \$5.00

GYPSY WIFE, THE SATURDAY SAMPLER PROGRAM:

We are continuing with our virtual-only format. Danyella's instructions and tips are recorded and made available for viewing at home, and may be viewed as many times as you wish.

We have arrived at the end of this program; the last date is Saturday, July 10. The link to the video presentation will be e-mailed to you on Saturday morning, and your kit will be ready at the shop at the same time. To receive the kit at no additional cost, you may show your completed, current-month's work at the Shop when you pick up your kit. Participants at a significant distance from the Shop may fulfill this requirement by e-mailing pictures of their finished work to the Shop.

DUKE CITY APPLIQUÉ SOCIETY: If your passion is hand appliqué, join us on the second Sunday of each month, 1:00-3:00. The dates are July 11, August 8, and September 12. 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BASICS, BASICS, BASICS

CLASS POLICIES: You may register in person, by mail, or by phone using a credit card; the total class fee is due at time of registration. Class fees are non-refundable unless the class is cancelled by *The Quilt Works, Inc.*, or you notify us five (5) days in advance of the class. **PLEASE REVIEW YOUR CLASS SUPPLY LIST AND THE BASIC SEWING SUPPLY LIST.** Be prepared to have fun in your class by having all your supplies. If you miss a class, a makeup is available for \$13/hour. Skill Level:
* Beginner, no experience needed. ** Rotary skills and machine piecing experience are required. *** Advanced skills needed.

BASIC ROTARY SKILLS * LAURA ECHEVERRIA AND DANA BRABSON (This class, or equivalent experience, is a prerequisite for all machine classes.) Begin your quilting experience with patches that are exactly the right size. In this class, we introduce you to the wide spectrum of rotary cutters, rulers and mats that are available, and to the techniques that enable you to cut fabric patches with accuracy and precision. Complete the class; then use \$10 of your class fee for any store purchase.

LET'S GET STARTED * DANA BRABSON Not sure about the "quilter's scant quarter inch" seam allowance? Need to know about "nesting seams"? Let's get started! This course takes you from the Basic Rotary Skills class to the Introduction to Machine Piecing class. We'll also learn about the quarter inch foot, the walking foot, and about the fabrics, threads, and batting that are best for your quilting project. Note: You must bring your own sewing machine to this class. *Note: This class, or equivalent experience, is a prerequisite for all machine classes.*

INTRODUCTION TO MACHINE PIECING * DANA BRABSON This basic class introduces you to machine piecing, quilting, and finishing techniques, and gives you the experience you need to take any other *Quilt Works* class. You make a different block in each of the first 4 classes, and then quilt and bind a placemat in the 5th class. The placemats are 18" × 12". If you choose to create a table runner with the 4 blocks, it is 63" × 18". A wall hanging with the 4 blocks finishes at 33" × 33", and can be used as a nice table topper. *Note: This class, or equivalent experience, is a prerequisite for all machine classes.*

BASIC HAND QUILTING * MARGARET PRINA Learn the art of quilting by hand. We provide you with a marked top for quilting. Needles and hoops are available to try out.

BEGINNING HAND APPLIQUÉ SAMPLER * KATHI DINEEN The sampler quilt teaches you many different techniques starting with the easiest and building on what you have learned from each class. Whether you are a beginner or have lots of experience you'll love this wall size project.

BEGINNING MACHINE APPLIQUÉ * BECKY WELCH Learn basic appliqué techniques and tips to enhance your projects.

BEGINNING MACHINE QUILTING I * BECKY WELCH Your top is finished and now it's time to bring it to life with the quilting. Becky will show many techniques, threads and tricks to enhance your quilting skills. *You must bring your own machine, it's walking foot, and its free motion or darning foot.*

3 hrs: \$40.00 (Class fee, \$24.00 + kit fee, \$16.00).

Friday, September 10 9:30-12:30

BEGINNING MACHINE QUILTING II ** BECKY WELCH Learn the art of free-motion quilting. Becky will teach the use of templates, marking, and quilting without marking. Specialty threads will also be discussed. *Your own machine with a darning foot is required for this class. Beginning Machine Quilting I is a prerequisite for this class.*

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BINDING BASICS * DANA BRABSON Your project is quilted and needs a binding. Learn how to apply a binding by machine. We apply the binding to curved edges, create faux-mitered corners, and join the binding strips so that the joints are virtually bump-free. Then we add both a wide binding and a binding with a flange to our practice piece, and even learn how to apply a binding to the edge of a quilt with 90-degree notches around the edge.

BAG LADIES –TRAIN CASE ** AMANDA RUDEN AND BECKY WELCH The Bag Ladies continue to make beautiful organizers. This time we're making cases reminiscent of train travel days. Store cosmetics or sewing supplies inside your unique one.

GO APRON OR GO HOME ** BOBBI LUCERO AND BECKY WELCH An apron for quilting? Yes! Comfortably hold your frequently used tools in this practical piece. It was designed by Bobbi Lucero, long arm quilter extraordinaire, and works for either long arm or sit down quilting. (One of Bobbi's mottos is "go big or go home" – thus the title of this class.)

NOT YOUR GRANDMOTHER'S LOG CABIN ** CAROL RISING We will begin by exploring less traditional layouts and shapes for a very traditional block. With Carol's help, you will be able to experiment with colors and layouts, using layout templates and colored pencils. We will then work through constructing your own blocks and laying out your unique quilt. Carol will help with color and fabric selection.

ONE BLOCK WONDER PANEL QUILTS ** DEBBIE WILLIAMS Discussion of fabric design styles. Learn to cut One Block Wonder Hexagons with 60 degree rulers. Arrange OBW hexagons and discuss sewing hexagons with a variety of panel placements.

PICKLE DISH AND PINWHEELS ** CAROL MEINCKE Get out your scraps and practice sewing curves for this fun two-block quilt. We will use a foundation paper piecing technique that has no paper removal.

POPPY! ** MARIANNE BETTINGER Marianne makes fiber art easy. This lovely project teaches her method of appliqué, many embellishment techniques and her special scrap binding.

FAVORITES

COLOR CONFIDENCE ** DANA BRABSON AND BECKY WELCH Gain confidence choosing fabrics for your quilts! Small projects teach value, contrast, and easy ways to incorporate "sparkle." Successive classes will build on your experiences and observations of your classmates' work.

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FRQ (FREE RANGE QUILTERS) ** BECKY WELCH Free range quilting – thinking “outside the box.” Explore design terms, develop improv piecing techniques, and learn starting points toward creating original quilts. The different exercises are short and sweet. FRQ is configured both for onsite learning, and for remote interaction (via a formal Zoom connection). The cost is the same for both. The invitation to attend the Zoom meeting is forwarded to all participants about 24 hours in advance. Thus, one can at the last minute change one’s mind about the method for participating.

OUTBACK ADVENTURE ** LOIS WARWICK Let Lois introduce you to a unique sampler designed by you, using Australian Aboriginal fabrics. Sue Voegtlin’s book Block Genius is the class textbook. You will get to choose a different Australian fat eighth each session to design around.

SANTA ANA WINDS * DANA BRABSON** The basic block in the Santa Ana Winds quilt has almost limitless possibilities for exciting designs. Dana has made the gentle curves easy to sew with room to trim down after sewing. After learning the basic techniques, we’ll spend time exploring some of the unique designs. The quilt may be made in any size, lap to king. *A note from Becky Welch: I recently took this class and was blown away by the engineering of the templates, the block construction technique (there is a trick that makes it easier than it looks!), and especially the enormous design potential. This class should not be missed.*

SEW TOGETHER BAG ** BECKY WELCH This is a distinctive, practical little organizer that is easier to make than it looks. Use it for sewing tools, jewelry or a travel bag – it is fun to make. Cut the fabrics prior to class and it should be done when you leave class.

T-SHIRT QUILT ** DANA BRABSON Think about those T-shirts from concerts you attended, from events in which you participated, from places you have been, etc. A T-shirt quilt will not only be a great memory piece or gift, but will also help you empty the drawers in which the shirts are “residents.” This is an A to Z technique class in which we imagine the design of the finished quilt, practice methods for stabilizing the T-shirt fabrics, explore the juncture between stabilized T-shirts and other fabrics, examine quilting ideas, and much more.
