To make the quilt pictured:



You need:

- 1 3/4 yards white – for sashings and border
- 5/8 yard – taupe/tan
- 5/8 yard – green blender
- 1 7/8 yards – farmer's market fabric that works with the main fabric for border
- 1 3/8 yards of scraps leftover fabric (main fabric) - enough to cut 99 – 3.5" squares

Cut:

From main fabric used for the blocks – gardening fabrics

- Cut 99 – 3.5” squares

From white:

- Cut 99 – 1.5”x3.5” rectangles
- Cut 12 – 1.5”x37.5” rectangles

How to make this quilt:

Put your center of the quilt together –

- 1. Sew 9- 3.5” squares with a 1.5”x3.5” white strip as shown.**



Make 11 strips as shown.

Place a 1.5”x37.5” white strip between each row.



The entire center consists of 11 rows of 9 squares as shown:



- 2. Add Borders -** (when long pieces are needed, cut and sew together to make length as needed.)

A. Border 1 – green and tan/taupe combination

From green – cut 2 3.5"x45.5" strips and from taupe/tan cut 2 – 1.5"x45.5". Sew a 1.5" tan strip to each side of the 3.5" green strip



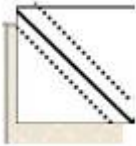
Attach to the sides.

Cut 2 – 3.5"x37.5" green blender and from taupe/tan cut 2 – 1.5"x37.5" strips
Just as above, sew the two 1.5" tan/taupe strips to the 3.5" green blender.



Make the four corner half square triangles

Cut 2 – white 6" squares and 2 tan/taupe 6" squares. Make half square triangles using by marking a line across the middle of the back of the white square diagonally. Place the white and tan fabrics right sides together and sew on either side of the drawn line on the white fabric. Cut on the drawn line. Open. Press. Trim to 5.5" square. Make 4.

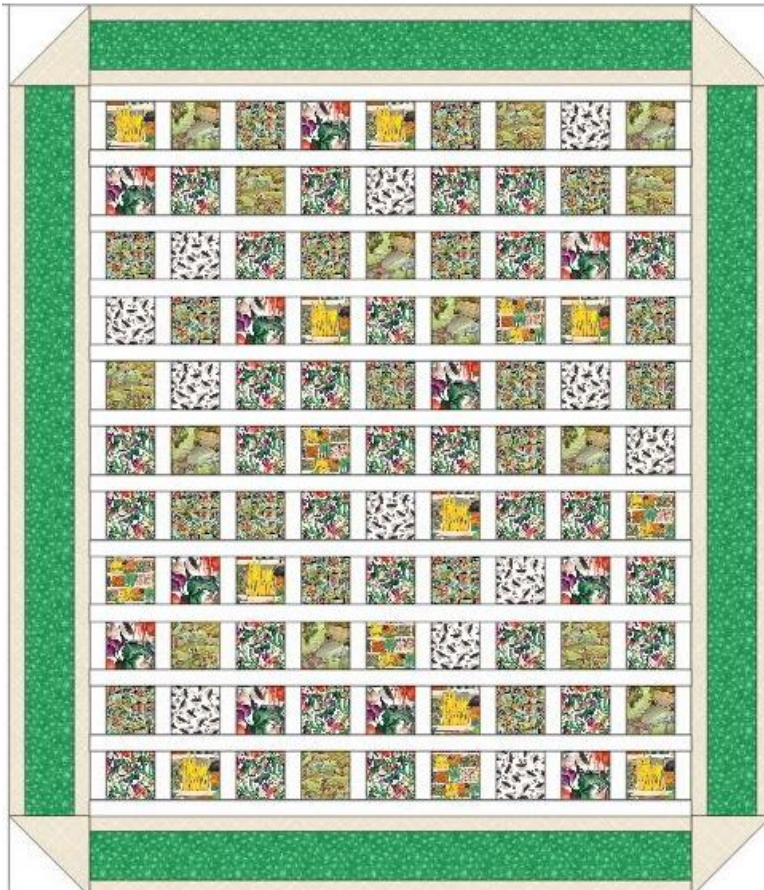


It is now a 5.5" square half square triangle

When making the border – first put on the sides and then add the HST squares to each end of the top and bottom border pieces made with green and tan strips. Make 2.



The center of the quilt now looks like this:



B. Border 2 – white

- Cut 2 – 2.5"x55.5". Sew to sides.
- Cut 2 – 2.5"x 51.5". Sew to top and bottom.

C. Border 3 – farmer’s market fabric

- Cut 2 – 4.5"x59.5". Sew to sides.
- Cut 2 – 11.5"x 59.5". Sew to top and bottom.

3. Press well.

4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer

5. Quilt as desired I used loops all over.

6. **Bind**, using whatever method you wish.

Congratulations! Your quilt is finished!
