
"Fancy Rails"

To make the quilt pictured:

You need:

- 2-1/4 yards of white
- ½ yard orange blender for cornerstones
- 1-1/4 yards pink blender for cornerstones and binding
- (1) 2.5" strips roll (commonly known as a Jelly Roll) bright pink and oranges Kaffe Fassett/Free Spirit

This quilt is made up entirely of a single 6.5" rail fence block like this: (plus sashing/cornerstones)



Note: Use ¼" seams throughout.

Cut:

From each of the 40 strips in the 2.5" colorful strips roll:

• $6 - 2 - \frac{1}{2}$ " x $6 - \frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles (total - 240)

From white:

- Cut 12 strips 6-1/2"xWOF*. Then subcut each strip into 2-1/2" x6-1/2" pieces for a total of 178 (2-½" x 6-½") From pink blender:
 - Cut 4 strips 2-1/2"xWOF. Then subcut each strip into 2-1/2" squares. You need 49.

From orange blender:

• Cut 4 strips 2-1/2"xWOF. Then subcut each strip into 2-1/2" squares. You need 50.

Binding will be cut as needed and to width desired. You have enough fabric to use 2.5" width as binding (of the pink blender).

*WOF = width of fabric

How to Construct blocks:

Main Block:

Mixing your strips up, sew (3) 2-½" x 6-½" strips together. Trim to 6-½"x6-½".



Make 80. Each block needs to be 6-1/2" square. Please do not skip trimming to size. (Written from experience!)

How to put together this quilt:

- 1. Make blocks as described above.
- Using this diagram, make rows:
- Sew blocks together into 10 rows of 8 blocks. Between each block, put a white 2-½" x 6-½" sashing strip as shown. Alternate direction of blocks 90 degrees. As shown:




2. Make rows of cornerstones/sashings as shown:

• Make 5 rows with pink as the first and last cornerstones

Make 6 rows with orange as the first and last cornerstones

wake o rows with orange as the first and last cornerstones

3. Sew together the whole top alternating rows of blocks and rows of cornerstones/sashings. Use diagram below being sure to alternate rows with the cornerstone blocks AND the direction of the blocks. I showed the blocks using solids so you could see the direction of the blocks more easily. Press toward the colorful and away from the white.



- 4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
- 5. Quilt as desired.
- 6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
