Fly By Night



To make the quilt pictured:

You need:

- 1 Fly by Night panel trimmed to 23.5" x 42.5"
- 1 ½ yards of black for borders and binding
- 5/8 yard of purple for first colorful borders
- ½ yard of white or very light blue for background of HST on inner border
- ¾ yard light blue for blue border
- 7/8 yard of various blues and purples for outer border with points
- 1-1/2 yards of various lights for background of the pointed border and outermost border

This quilt is built like a medallion quilt, so I will just work in that order as it is created from the middle to the outside.

Note: when a long strip is needed, piece multiple pieces together to get length needed.

- A. First border black
 - Cut 2 -- 1.5"x42.5". Add to sides.
 - Cut 2 -- 1.5"x 25.5". Add to top and bottom.
- B. Second border purple
 - Cut 2 -- 2"x44.5". Add to sides
 - Cut 2 -- 2.5"x28.5". Add to top and bottom.
- C. Third border purple same as second border AND white or very light blue Using your favorite method, make 80 Half square triangles that are 2.5" before sewn together. Using purple/white to look like this: Press half of the HST towards the dark and half towards the light.



Now lay out the borders as shown -2 for the sides like this:

And make two more for the top and bottom like this:

Attach to the sides and bottom as shown on the diagram shown at the end of the pattern.

- D. Fourth border white or light blue
 - Cut 2 1.5"x52.5". Attach to sides.
 - Cut 2 -1.5"x 34.5". Attach to top and bottom.
- E. Fifth border blue
 - Cut 2 4"x54.5". Attach to sides.
 - Cut 2 3.5"x41.5". Attach to top and bottom.
- F. Sixth border black
 - Cut 2 2.5"x60.5". Attach to sides.
 - Cut 2 3"x45.5". Attach to top and bottom.
- G. Seventh border 5" squares that have HST corners –

Using a variety of colors that are found in the panel cut 44 5.5" squares.

Using a variety of very lights – It blues, lavenders, etc. cut 88 2.5" squares.

Place one of the light squares on a corner of the darker block matching the corners.



Sew across the corner as shown. Trim off on broken line- \(\frac{1}{2} \) from the stitched line (solid line)





Press that "out" - now it looks like this:

Repeat for second corner as shown.





and then

Now it looks as shown:



This method is often called the Stitch and Flip method (Lori Holt) or Snowballing method (Jenny Doan) on You Tube. Using a variety of darks as shown in the top, make a variety.

Also cut 4 - 5.5" squares.

Now make the border using 13 of these blocks for the sides and 9 for the top and bottom as shown: Sides:



Top and bottom:




Attach each of these to the center as per diagram at the bottom of this pattern.

- H. Ninth Border lights
 - Cut 2 2"x75.5". Attach to the sides.
 - Cut 2 2"x 58.5". Attach to the top and bottom.

How to put together this quilt:

1. Using layout, follow the step by step directions and put together the quilt.



- 3. Press well.
- 4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
- 5. Quilt as desired.
- 6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
