## Fly By Night $58^{\prime \prime} \times 78^{\prime \prime}$



To make the quilt pictured:

## You need:

- 1 Fly by Night panel trimmed to $23.5^{\prime \prime} \times 42.5^{\prime \prime}$
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards of black for borders and binding
- 5/8 yard of purple for first colorful borders
- $1 / 2$ yard of white or very light blue for background of HST on inner border
- $3 / 4$ yard light blue for blue border
- 7/8 yard of various blues and purples for outer border with points
- 1-1/2 yards of various lights for background of the pointed border and outermost border

This quilt is built like a medallion quilt, so I will just work in that order as it is created from the middle to the outside.

Note: when a long strip is needed, piece multiple pieces together to get length needed.
A. First border - black

- Cut 2 -- $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 42.5^{\prime \prime}$. Add to sides.
- Cut 2 -- $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 25.5$ ". Add to top and bottom.
B. Second border - purple
- Cut 2 -- $2^{\prime \prime} \times 44.5^{\prime \prime}$. Add to sides
- Cut 2 -- 2.5"x28.5". Add to top and bottom.
C. Third border - purple - same as second border AND white or very light blue

Using your favorite method, make 80 Half square triangles that are $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ before sewn together. Using purple/white to look like this: Press half of the HST towards the dark and half towards the light.


Now lay out the borders as shown - 2 for the sides like this:

And make two more for the top and bottom like this:

Attach to the sides and bottom as shown on the diagram shown at the end of the pattern.
D. Fourth border - white or light blue

- Cut $2-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 52.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to sides.
- Cut $2-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 34.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to top and bottom.
E. Fifth border - blue
- Cut $2-4 " x 54.5 "$. Attach to sides.
- Cut $2-3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 41.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to top and bottom.
F. Sixth border - black
- Cut $2-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 60.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to sides.
- Cut $2-3$ " $\times 45.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to top and bottom.
G. Seventh border $-5^{\prime \prime}$ squares that have HST corners -

Using a variety of colors that are found in the panel cut $445.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
Using a variety of very lights - It blues, lavenders, etc. cut $882.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares.
Place one of the light squares on a corner of the darker block matching the corners.


Sew across the corner as shown. Trim off on broken line- $1 / 4$ " from the stitched line (solid line)


Press that "out" - now it looks like this:


Repeat for second corner as shown.


Now it looks as shown:


This method is often called the Stitch and Flip method (Lori Holt) or Snowballing method (Jenny Doan) on You Tube. Using a variety of darks as shown in the top, make a variety.
Also cut 4-5.5" squares.
Now make the border using 13 of these blocks for the sides and 9 for the top and bottom as shown:
Sides:


Top and bottom:


Attach each of these to the center as per diagram at the bottom of this pattern.
H. Ninth Border - lights

- Cut $2-2$ " $x 75.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut $2-2$ " $\times 58.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.


## How to put together this quilt:

1. Using layout, follow the step by step directions and put together the quilt.

2. Press well.
3. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
4. Quilt as desired.
5. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
