## Granny Squared <br> $102 " x 102^{\prime \prime}$

To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- 3 yards of pink for the side setting half square triangles
- $4 \frac{1}{2}$ yards of white for all the backing and sashings
- $31 / 4$ yards of light green for the chain block
- $21 / 4$ yards of various green scraps for the granny square blocks

Note: this quilt is made up of 2 different $10^{\prime \prime}$ finished in the blocks which look like this:


## Cut:

For block 1 (the chain block) (need 36 blocks - total numbers needed in parenthesis)

- From light green:
$4-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 4.5^{\prime \prime}(144)$
$4-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}(144)$
$4-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}(144)$
- From pink:

16 - 1.5" squares (576)
1 - $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ square (36)

- From grass green:

4 - 1.5"x2.5" (144)
For block 2 (the granny square block) (need 25 blocks - total numbers needed in parenthesis)

- From green scraps-

In groups of 1, 4, and 8-2.5" squares (325 squares)

- From white/cream -

12 - $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares (300)

## For sashings/cornerstones/side setting triangles:

- From white:
$144-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 10.5^{\prime \prime}$ pieces
- From pink:

84-2.5" squares
5-15 $1 / 2$ " squares which would then be cut diagonally $2 x$ as shown which $=20$ hst (half square triangle) pieces for the side setting triangles

$2-8$ " squares cut once diagonally for the corner setting triangles. This makes 4 small hst


## Construct blocks:

## Block 1:



Using the pieces you have previously cut, construct your block as follows:

1. Add the green $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$ green strips to the pink $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ square as shown:

2. Sew 2 pink $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares to a green $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 3.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle as shown. Make 2 :

3. Add these two pieces to the top and bottom of your center:

4. Now add a light green $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 4.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the sides of this center as shown:

5. Add a pink $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ square to each end of a light green $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 4.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip as shown: Make two:

6. Add these two the top and bottom of the previously made center as shown:

7. Add 2 light green strips 1.5 " $\times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ to the sides of the center made so far:


Using the same methods as before, make strips such as shown using 2 pink $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares and a 1.5 "x6.5" square:

8. Add these two strips to the top and bottom of the block so far:

9. Add two $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 8.5^{\prime \prime}$ light green strips to the sides of the square so far:

10. Now make 2 more strips like this using $2-1.5^{\prime \prime}$ pink squares to a lt. green 1.5 " $\times 8.5$ " strip.

11. Add these two strips to the center of the block:



The block looks like this:

it is now $10.5^{\prime \prime}$ square.
Make 36.

## Block 2:

Granny Square block.


Using this layout, make a square using this design. Lay the squares out in rows and then sew together in rows and sew the rows together. I pressed the seams all one direction. When sewing together, nest the seams.
Like this:



I made all of mine different. The block is 10.5 " $\times 10.5$ ".
Make 25.

## How to put together this quilt:

1. Sew together in rows. Use the layout as shown:


This will be put together in rows as I showed with arrows:
The rows that go between the blocks are made of sashings and cornerstones: Put together the rows as shown: I will put pictures at the end of the pattern as to how I put together this top.


## 3. Press well.

4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
5. Quilt as desired.
6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
