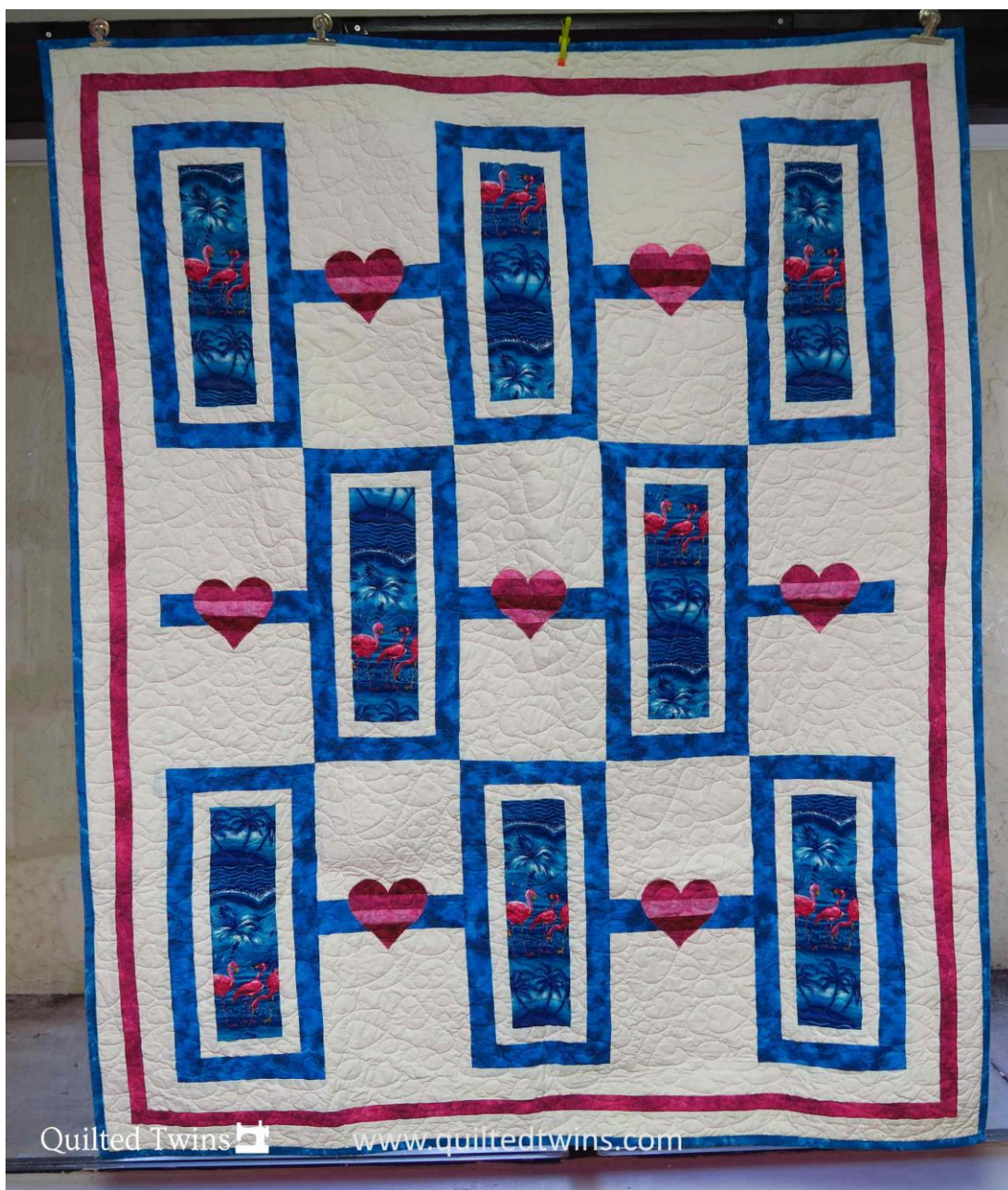


Long View

55" x 68½"

To make the quilt pictured:



You need:

- 1¼ yards of blue
- ¾ yards of pinks – of which one piece is ½ yard
- 2 1/8 yards of white – sashing and border
- 5/8 yard of novelty featured fabric
- ½-5/8 yard of fabric for the binding.

Cut:

- From featured fabric:
8 – 4½" x 15"
- From white:
16 – 1½" x 6½"
16 – 1½" x 15"
14 – 9½" x 9¼"
- From blue:
16 – 2" x 9½"
16 – 2" x 17"
7 – 2½" x 9½"

From pinks – for hearts – make a strip set using 6 - 1½" strips of pink x WOF – about 6" high – so that it looks like this: - your exact colors will vary depending on which pinks you use:

Once you have a flat piece of fabric, iron a piece of Heat n bond or other iron on applique paper to the back of that "long strip of fabric". (This is how I did it- there are several ways to make applique blocks)

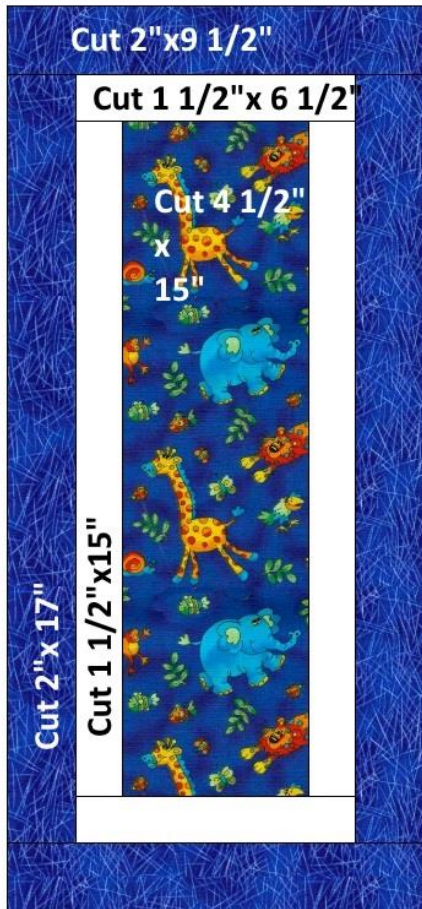


Borders will be discussed later

Construct blocks:

Following this large diagram, take the pieces you have cut and sew together your blocks:

Sew white sides to the novelty rectangle. Then sew white top and bottom strips. Press. Add blue to the sides. And then top and bottom.

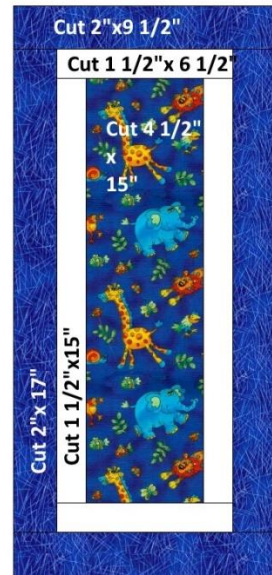

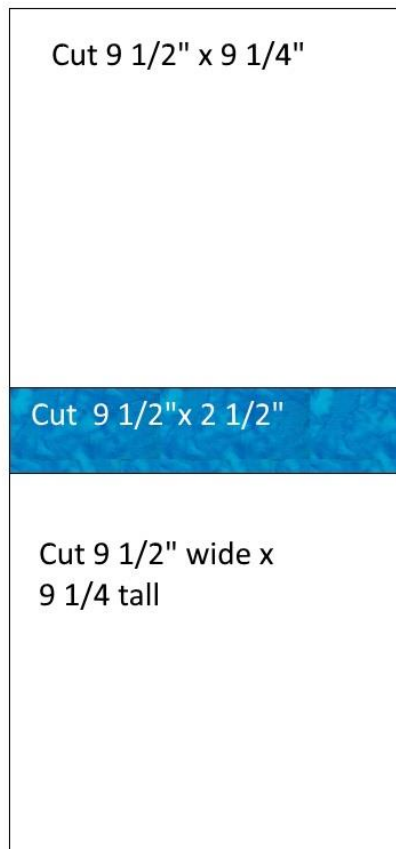

Making sure you place the 9 1/2" WIDTH, add the blue strip to the two whites so that the final block looks like the above picture.

Heart appliques.

I use my die cutting machine, but you can cut out a heart out of the pink strips simply by tracing a heart and making an applique pattern yourself. A sample is at the end of this pattern.

When I finished making the hearts, they looked like this: You can make them however you wish – even one piece of fabric – not striped: Make 7 hearts.



Center one heart on the blue stripe in the middle of the block:



I used heat n bond paper on the back of my hearts – which means I peeled the paper off, pressed the heart down and then sewed around the edge of the heart.

Close up of block after sewn on – using the applique stitch – a narrow blanket stitch

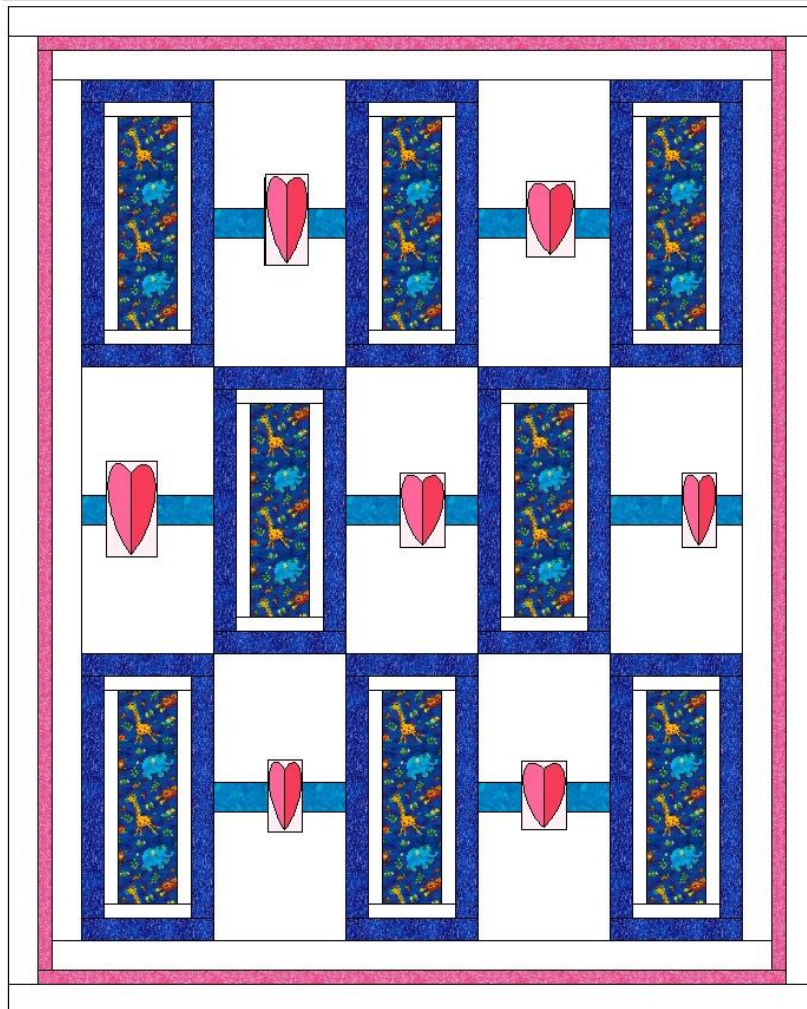


Finished blocks



How to make this quilt:

1. **Construct your blocks as shown above.**
2. **Place blocks as in this diagram.** For now focus on the center layout. The hearts on the diagram are just to show approximate placement.



3. **Sew the blocks in rows.** Attach rows together.
4. **Add the borders:**
 - **First border – white border**
Cut: (piece as necessary)
2 – 2 ½" x 59" . Attach to the sides
2 – 2 ½" x 49 ½" . Attach to the top and bottom.
 - **Second border – hot pink**
Cut: (piece as necessary)
2 – 1 ½" x 63" . Attach to the sides
2 – 1 ½" x 51 ½" . Attach to the top and bottom.
 - **Third border – white**
Cut: (piece as necessary)

2 - 2½" x 65". Attach to the sides

2 - 2½" x 55½". Attach to the top and bottom.

5. **Press well.**
6. **Sandwich**, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
7. **Quilt** as desired.
8. **Bind**, using whatever method you wish.

It's that easy!!!!

Your quilt is finished!
