## SchoolHouses!

To make the quilt pictured:


This quilt is made up of 1 block that finishes at 9 " and looks like this:


Note: I got the block from this location, so I do not feel comfortable reproducing it here. Start by downloading this block here This is vital!

## You need:

- 7 yards of white which includes binding
- 7 yards of various pastels that are strong enough to contrast with the white but soft enough to read pastel.
Note: WOF means width of fabric. Use $1 / 4 / 1$ seams unless otherwise noted.


## Cut:

For the main house block:


Follow the block pattern after you download it as shown above in the link.
For the sashing blocks:

- From white, cut off 12 pieces that are $9.5^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF and subcut at $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ to make 291 strips that are $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 9.5^{\prime \prime}$. This will make a few more than you need. In theory, you can cut 312.

- From dark pastels as you have - cut off 8 pieces of $9.5^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF. Use a variety of fabrics for a scrappy look. Subcut into $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips. These will be 1.5 " $\times 9.5$ ".


Each one of your wide strips will make $261.5^{\prime \prime} \times 9.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips. You will have some extra if you cut all 8 strips into $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 9.5$ " strips. You need 194 but should get 208.


While cutting these pieces, you will also partially make the block.
If you have extra $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 9.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips of both pastels and whites, you can make little strip sets like this:


Then cut off $1.5^{\prime \prime}$ segments - make a variety of colors and mix things up.


And


This is how they will look with alternating pastel and whites:
$\square$

Press the seams toward the pastels.
Once you have used up any leftover strips from making the sashing strips, go ahead and cut off from your white and pastel fabrics $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times W O F$ and make longer segments and cut off segments as with the shorter ones.
Make 112 segments that are pastel/white/pastel/white/pastel
And
Make 164 segments that are white/pastel/white/pastel/white.
They should nest nicely when it is time to make the blocks.

## How to make the blocks:

The main house block:


Follow the directions for the block as on the pattern for the blocks. Make 48 . I made 2 different blocks - facing opposite directions from 24 different fabrics for this quilt but using fewer fabrics would work. These blocks will finish at 9 " in the quilt so they will be 9.5 " $\times 9.5^{\prime \prime}$ at this point before sewing into the quilt top.

For sashing blocks: (97)
Finished size in quilt -5"x9"


Once your pieces are cut, simply lay them out by alternating white and pastels so it is white/pastel/white/pastel/white. Sew. Press towards the white strips. Mix and match your pastels for a scrappy look.
Make 97 blocks. They will measure 5.5 "x9.5" at this point.

For cornerstone blocks: (56)
Finished size in quilt - 5"x5"


Make the blocks by sewing the segments together to make the 25 patch block shown above.



Each block should measure 5.5 " $\times 5.5$ " at this point.
Make 56.

## How to make the main blocks:

Following the directions on the downloaded pattern linked above, make 42 blocks. I made 21 facing one direction and 21 reversed.

## How to make the sashing blocks:



Once your pieces are cut, simply lay them out by alternating white and pastels so it is white/pastel/white/pastel/white. Sew. Press towards the white strips. Mix and match your pastels for a scrappy look.
Make 97 blocks. They will measure 5.5 "x9.5"

## How to make the cornerstone blocks:

Make the blocks by sewing the segments together to make the 25 patch block shown above.



Each block should measure 5.5"x5.5".
Make 56.

## How to make this quilt:

1. Using this diagram, lay out your blocks in rows. Mix up the colors and direction if you chose to make reversed designs as I did. Here is the overall layout:


Ignore the border and binding for now. Sew each row as shown:
Make 7 rows like this - putting the houses in the colors and direction as you wish.
You will alternate a sashing block/house block/sashing/house/sashing/house as shown.


Then make 8 rows like this - these are the sashing/cornerstone/sashing blocks:


Using the layout shown above, make the center of the quilt.
2. Add border: white (piece as necessary to get length required)

- Cut $2-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 103.5^{\prime \prime}$. Add to sides
- Cut $2-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 91.5^{\prime \prime}$. Add to top and bottom

3. Press well.
4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
5. Quilt as desired. I did straight line stitching diagonally across the quilt.
6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
