
To make the quilt pictured:




You need:

- 7 yards of various greens preferably in darks and mediums
- 3 ¼ yards of tan/beige
- 1 ¼ yards of white
- ¾ yard of a single green for binding

Note: this quilt is made up of 3 different 8" finished blocks which look like this Block 3 has 2 colorways:








Note: When sewing this quilt top, use ¼" seams. When cutting and a long strip is called for, sew together strips til you get the length needed.

Cut: (for one block)

Block 1: This quilt used 42 blocks. Total number needed for this quilt in parenthesis



From white:

12 – 1.5" squares

1 – 2.5" square

• From a dark green:

8 – 1.5" squares

8 – 1.5"x 2.5"

4 – 2.5"x 3.5"

• From a lighter green:

1 – 2.5" square

Block 2: Need 71 blocks




From tan:

2 – 2.5" x8.5"

• From greens:

8 - 1.5"x 4.5"

Block 3: make 15 blocks of each colorway



and #2 colorway



1 colorway

#1 colorway (for one block)

• From tan:


- 8 2.5" squares to make star points
- From green:
 - 4 2.5"x 4.5"
 - 4 2.5" squares
 - 1 1.5" square
- From white:
 - 2 2"x4.5"
 - 2 1.5"x 2"

#2 colorway: (for one block)

- From tan:
 - 8 2.5" squares to make star points
- From green:
 - 4 2.5"x 4.5"
 - 4 2.5" squares
 - 1 1.5" square
- From a different VERY dark green to make the centers stand out from the rest:
 - 2 2"x4.5"
 - 2 1.5"x 2"

Construct blocks:

Block 1:




Using a dark green so that the white stands out as the chain part, make the 4 corner blocks like this. Sew a white 1.5" square to 1.5"x2.5" green strip (2x).



Sew a little strip with green/white/green using all 1.5" squares like this:



Now make this little block which will be 3.5" square with these units:





Make 4 of these little sections for each block.

Once finished, now add the rest. You have previously cut the pieces needed.


Using a 2.5"x 4.5" green piece, make the 2 sections like this:



Now make the center piece using your 2.5"x 4.5" green pieces and the white 2.5" square like this:



Now put the block together:




This block should now measure 8.5" square. For my quilt, I needed 42. I used a variety of fabrics that read as "dark" green as the background.

Block 2:



Take your cut 1.5"x 4.5" green strips and sew together all 8 to make a long piece like this:





This block will now measure 8.5" square. Make 71 as they act as the sashing strips but are just alternate blocks.

Block 3:





I will show you using the white variation – the other one is made the same way only using a darker green instead of white.

Sew a 1.5"x 2" white piece to the 1.5" green square and then another 1.5"x 2" white piece as shown:



Now sew a white strip that is 2"x4.5" to the top of and bottom of this to create this unit:



Now we want to create the star point units.

Take a darkish green 2.5"x4.5" unit and place a 2.5" square white piece over one end and sew diagonally across to form a triangle effect on the end of the piece. As shown.


Like this:



Now trim about ¼" to the outside of the sewing line and press so it looks like

this:





Repeat for the other point of the star to create a little 2.5"x 4.5" unit that looks like this:



Make 4.

Now add a corner green 2.5" square to the unit like this to form the top and bottom rows of this block:




Make 2.

Take a star points unit and add to each side of the center section like this:



Now make the block by combining units:



This makes this block:



It should measure 8.5" square. Make 15 of this colorway.

To make the blocks with the Dark green center, choose a green center which is lighter than the dark center piece for contrast.


Make these blocks in the same way as the ones above only the colors will look like this:




It should measure 8.5" square. Make 15 of this colorway.

How to put together this quilt:

1. Sew together in rows and create center. This is the layout. I will show you these different rows. Make 7 rows like this -




When you finish these rows, put them together as a whole top following the layout below.



2. Add border: beige

- Cut 2 2.5"x 104.5" add to sides.
- Cut 2 2.5"x 92.5" add to top and bottom.

Final layout of quilt:



- 3. Press well.
- **4. Sandwich**, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
- **5. Quilt** as desired.
- **6. Bind**, using whatever method you wish.
