

Autumn Glory

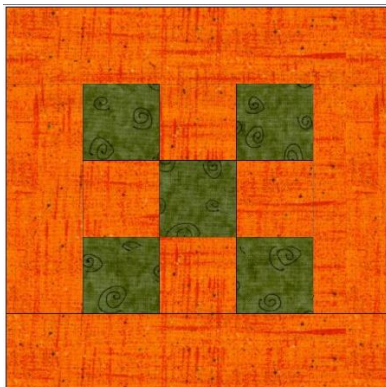
To make the quilt pictured:



You need:

- Autumn colored fabrics – 9 5/8 yards
- Black – 1 7/8 yards
- 3/4 yard of your favorite colors for binding.

This quilt is made up of 1 – 10" finished-in-the-quilt block looks like this:



Cut: *Because I was using my scraps and upcycled pieces I made all my blocks different.*

For each block this is what you need:

For block 1: (finishes at 10.5" at this point – before sewn into the top) Make 42.

From fabric 1:

- 4 – 2.5" squares
- 2 – 2.5"x 6.5" strips
- 2 – 2.5"x10.5" strips

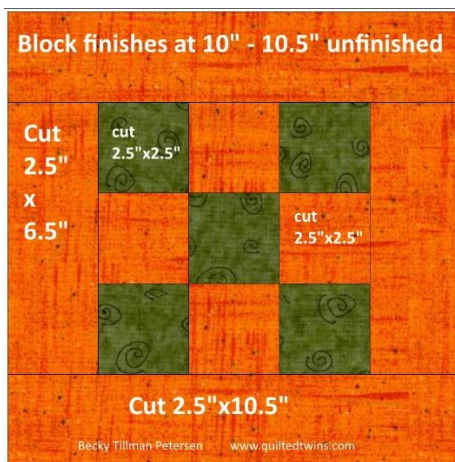
From fabric 2, contrasting color:

- 5 – 2.5" squares

Borders will be discussed later in "How to make this quilt"

Construct Blocks:

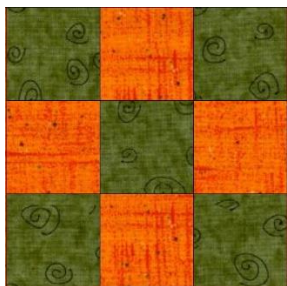
For Framed 9 patch block:



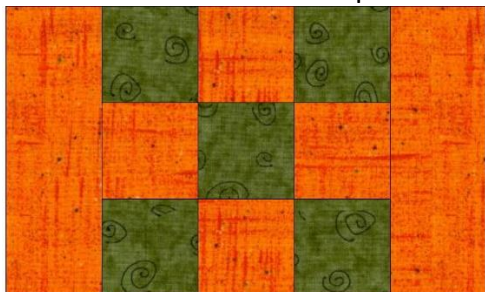
First construct the 9 patch by alternating the 2.5" squares you have cut.



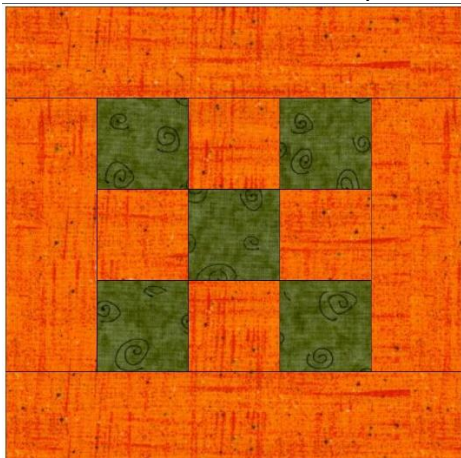
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Next add the 2.5"x 6.5" strips from Fabric 1 to the sides.



Next add the 2.5"x10.5" strips to the top and bottom:

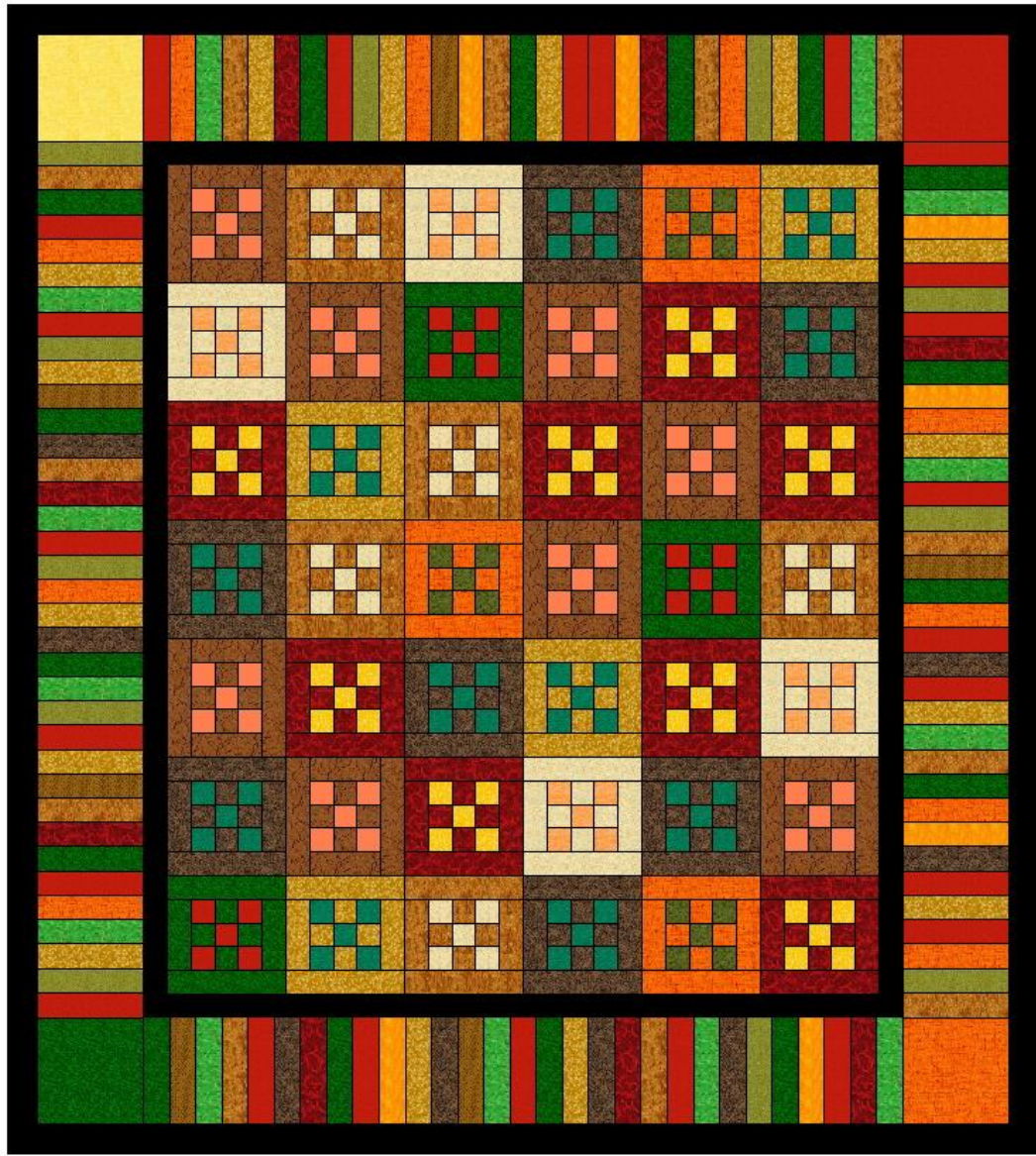


Make 42 of all different color combinations that please you. Try to make enough contrast with your two colors so that the 9 patch part is visible.

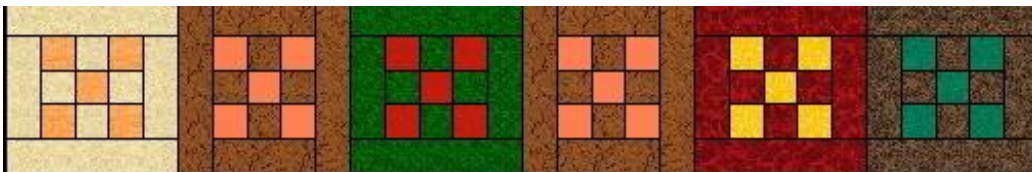
How to make this quilt:

1. Lay out completed blocks according to diagram.

For now we are just looking at the center of this layout:

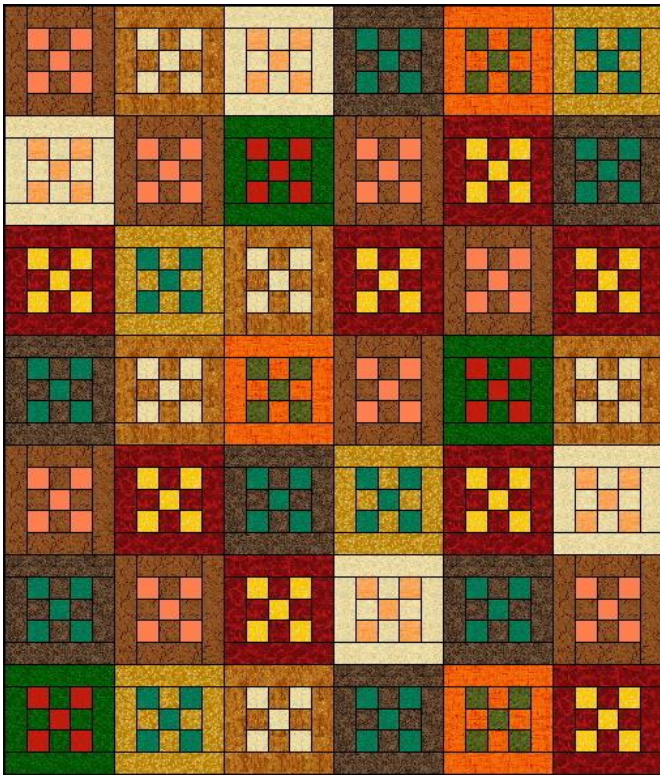


2. Sew together in rows:



Alternate rotation of blocks

3. Connect rows.



4. Add borders: (if they are long, piece together as needed to get the length needed)

Border 1 – black:

Cut 2 pieces of fabric :

- 2.5"x70.5" – add to the sides
- 2.5"x 64.5" – add to the top and bottom

Border 2- piano key from various autumn colored fabrics:

- Cut 138 strips 2"x 9.5" to use as the piano keys.
- Cut 4 – 9.5" squares to use in the corners

Sew 32 of the keys together in a long strip as shown in above diagram for the sides. Make 2.
Attach to the sides

Sew 37 of the keys together in a long strip as shown for the top and bottom. Make 2. Attach
to top and bottom – be sure to add a 9.5" square to each side of the row of piano keys before
attaching.

Border 3 – black:

- 3"x92.5" – add to the sides
- 3"x 87.5" – add to the top and bottom

5. Press well.

6. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.

7. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting along the seam lines.

8. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
