## Bronze Coins

Top finishes at 98 "x $98^{\prime \prime}$
To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- About $51 / 2$ yards of various browns and earth tones scraps to make $480,2^{\prime \prime} \times 7$ " strips
- $55 / 8$ yards of off white
- About $1 / 2$ yard of fabric for binding.


## Cut:

From various browns:

- 480 2"x7" strips

From off white:

- $32-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 23^{\prime \prime}$
- $16-6 " \times 23^{\prime \prime}$


## Construct your blocks

The finished block will look like this and should finish at $23^{\prime \prime}$ square before you sew them all together.
(This diagram show how big it will be once sewn into the quilt $-22.5^{\prime \prime} \times 22.5^{\prime \prime}$.)

A. Sew $152^{\prime \prime} \times 7$ " strips together in one long group like this, lining up ends and using $1 / 4 \prime$ seam allowance. Press.

Make 2 such strips of strips. (The picture is crooked, but your strips should be nice and straight-it is just the way I took the picture.)

B. Sew 6 " $x 23$ " off white piece to the two brown strips of strips so that it looks like this.

C. Sew $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 23^{\prime \prime}$ off white strips to the left side and then the right side of the brown strips. At this point your block is finished and should measure 23 " $\times 23$ ".


Now that one block is finished, you need to make 16 total of these rather large blocks.

## How to put together the quilt:

1. After constructing blocks, place the pressed blocks according to the diagram below.

2. Sew blocks together using a $1 / 4 "$ seam allowance, first in rows and then by sewing those rows together.
3. Press well.
4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
5. Quilt as desired. I did a lot of embroidery in the open spaces on this quilt along with straight line quilting and some wavy lines.


6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
