

## Old World Fantasy Week 3:

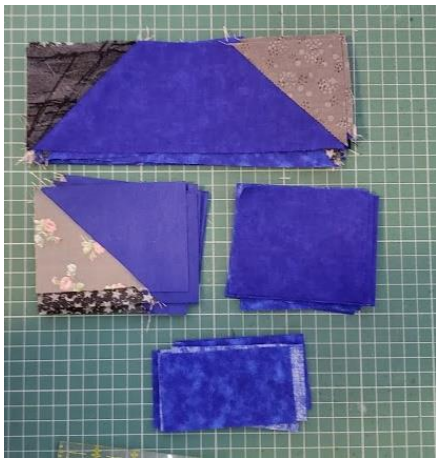
Offering you clues in two color schemes –

Blue/Gray and Red/Brown/Gold

**Do not make BOTH blue/gray and brown/red/gold unless you are making two quilts!**

**We are NOT using our constants today. Use OTHER blues/grays/brown/reds. Save those constants. Pull out something different!**

### Blocks for today:



and



**From your royal blue pieces OR red/brown cut these pieces:**

2" x 3.5"

- lap - 8
- full - 14
- queen – 16

3" x 3.5"

- lap - 10
- full - 26
- queen - 34

3" x 4"

- lap - 8
- full - 14
- queen – 16

3" x 8.5"

- lap - 10

- full - 26
- queen – 34

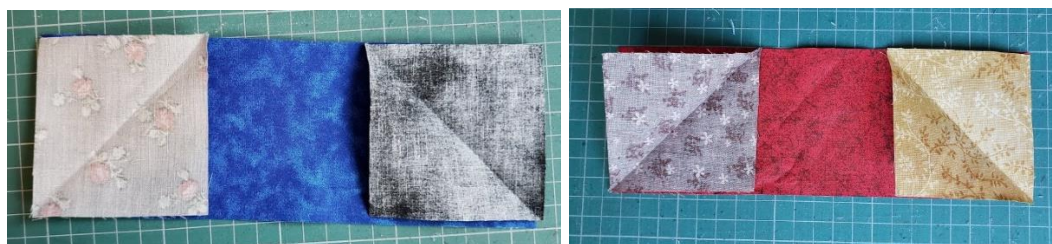
**From your grays and red/browns/golds – use DIFFERENT reds/browns/golds than you used above** – looking for contrast in colors as these will be used to ‘snowball’ the corners:

3” squares

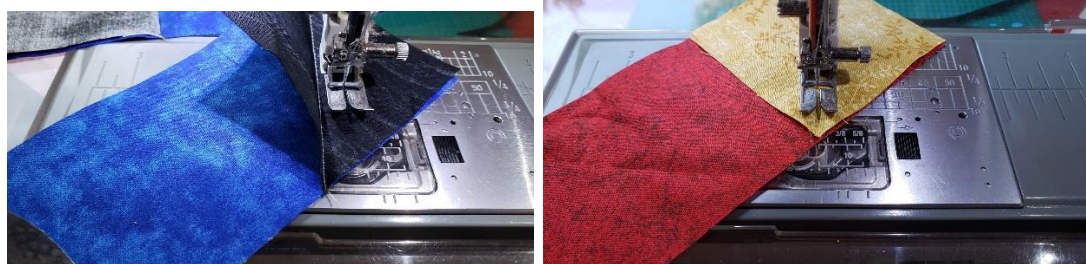
- lap - cut 28
- full - cut 66
- queen - cut 84

Steps for today:

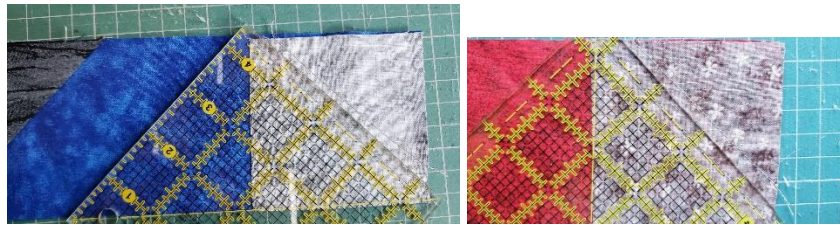
1. Once your 2”x3.5” and 3”x3.5” pieces are cut – put them aside for today. We are not using them now.
2. Using your 3” squares you will snowball the corners of your 3”x8.5” strips and your 3”x4” strips as shown. First the 3”x8.5” strips:
  - a. Using your iron, crease a line in the 3” squares diagonally across the middle.
  - b. Place the opened back up square and place it on the rectangle as shown:



- c. Stitch on the folded lines as shown:



- d. I usually stitch again about ½” away from that first stitching towards the outside of the crease as shown below to make a bonus triangle. You don’t need to do this if you don’t want. Trim between the lines of stitching which I did:

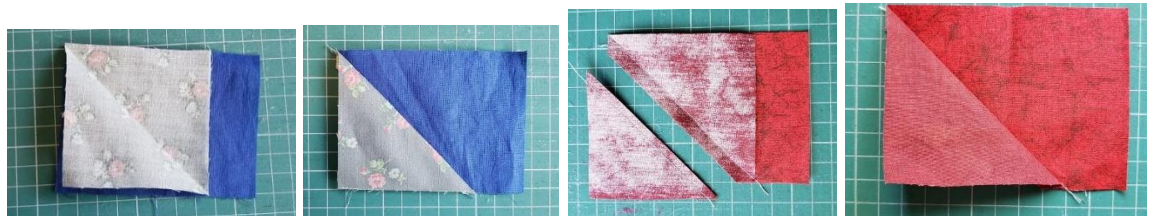


- e. Fold out those corners and press well. You have now “snowballed” those corners. You will find this term quite useful in “quilterese”.



Make this many of these segments:

- lap - 10
  - full - 26
  - queen - 34
3. Using the same method you just did with your longer piece, “snowball” the corner of the 3”x4” rectangle as shown:



You can see that on the far-right picture, the contrast isn't that great on the segment. I left it to show you that you can leave it if you have already made it like this – but going forward, choose a square with more value distinction between the square and the rectangle.

Make this many of these segments:

- lap - 8
- full - 14
- queen - 16

That's all for this week! Easy peasy!

Save all your scraps. If you made bonus triangles, save them.  
Put away your pieces for now and come back next week for week 4!
