## Simple Coins

49" x 71.5"
To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- $35 / 8$ yards of white
- $11 / 2$ yards geometrics
- $1 / 2$ yard of binding fabric

The quilt is made up of one block which finishes in the quilt at 6 " $\times 10.5^{\prime \prime \prime \prime}$ and looks like this:

Cut: For the size quilt I showed, you need 25 blocks.

## For each block:



From white:

- Cut $3-2$ "x $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips (to make 25 blocks, cut 75 strips)

From geometrics:

- Cut $4-2$ "x $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips (to make 25 blocks, cut 100 strips)


## For sashings:

From white:

- Cut 20-3.5"x 11" rectangles

Borders will be dealt with later. Further instructions under "How to make this quilt".

## Construct Blocks:

To construct this simple rail fence block (with a lot of rails), simply sew the strips together alternating geometrics and white - starting and stopping with the geometrics strips. Use $1 / 4$ " seams.

Make 25 blocks.
They will measure $6.5^{\prime \prime} \times 11^{\prime \prime}$ at this point:


## How to make this quilt:

1. Sew the rows together as shown:


Make 5 rows that look like this, putting a sashing strip between each block:


Then when you have finished those rows of blocks, attach the rows together with a sashing strip between the row. Cut a strip $3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 42.5^{\prime \prime}$.
Put one $3.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip between each row as show in the diagram above. Ignore the square that looks like a cornerstone.


Keep going until the center of the top is finished.
2. Add border:

White- Cut pieces as indicated. Sew lengths together to get the length needed.

- Cut 2 pieces $-4^{\prime \prime} \times 65^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides
- Cut 2 pieces $-4^{\prime \prime} \times 49.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.

3. Press well.
4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
5. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting.
6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.

It's that easy!!!! Your quilt is finished!
