## Simple Framed Nine Patches

55.5" x 64 "

To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- $17 / 8$ yards solid lime green
- $21 / 8$ yards of white
- $1 \frac{1}{2}$ yards of geometrics pieces
- $11 / 8$ yards of black for border
- $1 / 2$ yard of binding fabric

The quilt is made up of one block which finishes in the quilt at $6.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ in the quilt and looks like this:


Cut: For the size quilt I showed, you need 30 blocks.

## For each block:

From lime green:

- Cut 4-2" squares
- Cut 2-1.5"x5" strips
- Cut $2-1.5$ "x6.5" strips

From geometrics:

- Cut 5-2" squares


## For sashings:

From white:

- Cut $24-2.5$ "x 7 " strips

For sashings between rows - piece as necessary to get length needed:

- Cut $5-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$

Borders will be dealt with later. Further instructions under "How to make this quilt".

## Construct Blocks:

Take your 5 geometrics and 4 lime green 2" squares and make a 9 patch.
Lay out the pieces in rows. I was unable to strip piece for this part for most of it because I was using my smallest of pieces i.e. single squares.

Now add lime green $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 5^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the sides like this


Add the final $1.5^{\prime " x} 7$ " lime green strips to the top and bottom. It now looks like this:


Make 30 blocks. They will measure 7 " $\times 7$ " at this point:

## How to make this quilt:

## 1. Sew the rows together as shown:

Make 5 rows that look like this, putting a sashing strip between each block:


Then when you have finished those rows of blocks, attach the rows together with a sashing strip between the row. Use your cut strips of white that are $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$.
Put one $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip between each row as show in the diagram above. Ignore the square that looks like a cornerstone.


Keep going until the center of the top is finished.

3. Cut pieces as indicated. Sew lengths together to get the length needed.
A. First border- white-:

- Cut 2-2"x 49.5". Attach to the sides
- Cut 2-2" $\times 44$ ". Attach to the top and bottom.
B. Second border - geometric design:
- Cut $2-2^{\prime \prime} \times 52.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut 2-2" x 47". Attach to the top and bottom.
C. Third border - white:
- Cut $2-2^{\prime \prime} \times 55.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut $2-2^{\prime \prime} \times 50^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.
D. Fourth border - black:
- Cut $2-3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 58.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut 2 - $3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 60^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.

4. Press well.
5. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
6. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting.
7. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
