## Simple Framed Squares

## 58"x76"

To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- $17 / 8$ yards hot pink
- 3 yards of geometrics
- $21 / 2$ yards of solid black
- $1 / 2$ yard of fabric for the binding.

This quilt is made up of single block which finishes at 6"


## Cut:

From various geometrics -

- Cut 35-4.5" squares

From pink -

- Cut 70-1.5" $\times 4.5^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
- Cut 70-1.5"x6.5" rectangles

From black -

- $28-3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ pieces for sashings
- $6-3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 60.5^{\prime \prime}$ (piece as needed to make the correct length.)

Borders will be dealt with under "How to put together this quilt".

## Construct Blocks:



Sew a single pink $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 4.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip on each side of the $4.5^{\prime \prime}$ geometric piece: Use $1 / 4$ " seams throughout.


Press towards the pink.
Add a $1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ strip to the top and bottom so now the block is $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ square until it is sewn into the top.
Make 35.


## How to make this quilt:

Focus only on the middle at this point.


1. Sew the blocks in rows.

Sew a block, then a $3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ sashing black piece like this:


Do that 7x
Now lay out the middle to the black sashing strip like this and sew together:


Until you have the middle that looks as shown above.
2. Add the borders: (Piece as necessary to get the length needed)
A. First border: - black

- Cut $2-3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 60.5^{\prime \prime}$ - attach to sides
- Cut $2-3.5^{\prime \prime} \times 48.5^{\prime \prime}$ - attach to top and bottom
B. Second border: hot pink
- Cut $2-1.5^{\prime \prime} \times 66.5^{\prime \prime}$ - attach to sides
- Cut 2-1.5" $50.5^{\prime \prime}$ - attach to top and bottom
C. Third border: geometrics
- Cut $2-4.5^{\prime \prime} \times 68.5^{\prime \prime}$ - attach to sides
- Cut $2-4.5^{\prime \prime} \times 58.5^{\prime \prime}$ - attach to top and bottom

Here is the final layout

3. Press well.
4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
5. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting.
6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.

It's that easy!!!! Your quilt is finished!
