Simple Framed Squares on Point About 55.5"x65.5"

To make the quilt pictured:



You need:

- 2 3/8 yards red •
- 1 ¾ yards of white •
- 1 5/8 yards of dark gray •

- Enough geometrics to cut 50 4.5" squares I used a variety of prints of scraps
- 1½ yards of solid black
- ½ yard of fabric for the binding.
 This quilt is made up of single block which finishes at 6"



<u>Cut:</u>

From various geometrics -

• Cut 50 – 4.5" squares

From red –

- Cut 60 1.5" x 4.5" rectangles
- Cut 60 1.5"x6.5" rectangles

From white -

- Cut 40 1.5" x 4.5" rectangles
- Cut 40 1.5"x6.5" rectangles

For sashings and cornerstones – From black –

- 120 1.5"x6.5" rectangles
- 22 1.5" squares

From red –

• 24 – 1.5" squares

From white –

• 25 – 1.5" squares

For side setting triangles

From gray -

• Cut 5 – squares – 10"x10" and cut diagonally 2x like this: to make 20 side setting triangles. You will use 18.



For corner setting triangles,

From gray -

• Cut squares 5 ½' and cut across the center once diagonally. Cut 2 like that to make 4 corners.

Construct Blocks:



Sew a single red (or white) $1.5'' \times 4.5''$ strip on each side of the 4.5'' geometric piece: Use $\frac{1}{4}''$ seams throughout.




Press towards the red (or white).

Add a 1.5"x6.5" strip to the top and bottom so now the block is 6.5" square until it is sewn into the top.

Make 30 with red frames. Make 20 with white frames.

How to make this quilt:


Focus only on the middle at this point.



When you put a quilt together on point, you put the blocks on the diagonal – but first make a couple of rows and then sew together


Also put together rows of sashing /cornerstone/sashing and attach to top and bottom of the rows of blocks. Match up the colors of the cornerstones as shown.

Place your gray side setting triangles on position and then make a row like this:





1. Make rows - a block, then a sashing, then another block alternating colors of blocks -




Until you have the middle that looks as shown above.

Once you get the whole middle put together including the corner setting triangles, then trim the center just $\frac{1}{2}$ " to the outside of the center of those cornerstones.



- 2. Add the gray border: (Piece as necessary to get the length needed)
 - Cut 2 3.5"x 59 7/8" attach to sides
 - Cut 2 3.5"x 56" attach to top and bottom

Here is the final layout



- 3. Press well.
- 4. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
- 5. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting.
- 6. Bind, using whatever method you wish.

It's that easy!!!! Your quilt is finished!
