## Simple Rail Fence

To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- $21 / 2$ yards light blue
- $2 \frac{1}{4}$ yards of geometrics
- $1 / 2$ yard of fabric for the binding.

This quilt is made up of 1 block which finishes at $7.5^{\prime \prime}$ after being sewn into the quilt.


## Cut:

From various geometrics -

- Cut 70-2"x8"

From light blue -

- Cut 105-2"x8"

Borders will be discussed later:

## Construct Blocks:



Alternating light blue and geometrics, sew a simple rail fence into a simple 5 strip rail fence block, matching ends of strips. The blocks will now measure 8 " 88 ".

Make 35.

## How to make this quilt:

1. Construct your blocks as shown above.

Alternate blocks so that they are in this layout:

2. Sew them in rows. Ignore the borders in the layout for now.
3. Add the borders:
A. First border - light blue

Cut: (piece as necessary)

- 2- $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 52.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- $2-2 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 42^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.
B. Second border - geometrics
- 2 - $2 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 56.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- $2-2 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 46^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.
C. Press well.
D. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
E. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting.
F. Bind, using whatever method you wish.

It's that easy!!!! Your quilt is finished!
