

# Simple Rail Fence

45.5"x60.5"

To make the quilt pictured:



## You need:

- 2 ½ yards light blue
- 2 ¼ yards of geometrics
- ½ yard of fabric for the binding.

This quilt is made up of 1 block which finishes at 7.5" after being sewn into the quilt.



## Cut:

From various geometrics –

- Cut 70 - 2"x8"

From light blue –

- Cut 105 – 2"x8"

**Borders will be discussed later:**

## Construct Blocks:



Alternating light blue and geometrics, sew a simple rail fence into a simple 5 strip rail fence block, matching ends of strips. The blocks will now measure 8"x8".

Make 35.



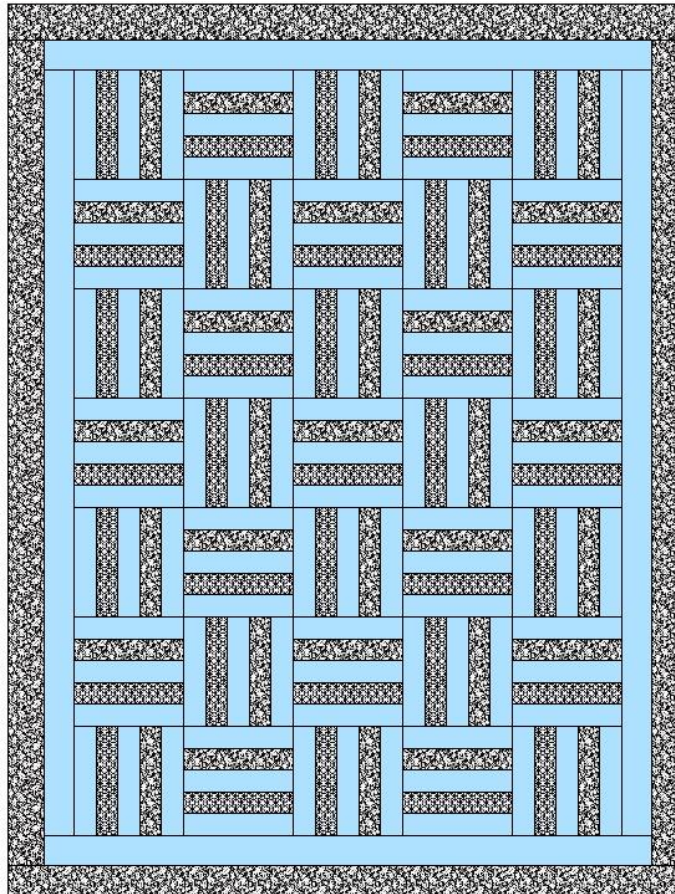

## How to make this quilt:

1. Construct your blocks as shown above.

Alternate blocks so that they are in this layout:



2. Sew them in rows. Ignore the borders in the layout for now.
3. Add the borders:
  - A. First border – light blue
    - Cut: (piece as necessary)
      - 2 -  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x52.5 ". Attach to the sides.
      - 2 -  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x 42". Attach to the top and bottom.
  - B. Second border – geometrics
    - 2 -  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x56.5 ". Attach to the sides.
    - 2 -  $2\frac{1}{2}$ "x 46". Attach to the top and bottom.
  - C. Press well.
  - D. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
  - E. Quilt as desired. I did straight line quilting..
  - F. Bind, using whatever method you wish.

It's that easy!!!! Your quilt is finished!
