## Sliding Stars

## $72^{\prime \prime} \times 86^{\prime \prime}$



This quilt is made up of 2 different blocks which finish in the quilt at 12 ". They look like this:


To make the quilt pictured:

## You need:

- $15 / 8$ yards green
- $43 / 4$ yards off white
- $15 / 8$ light pink
- 12.5 " strips roll commonly known as a "Jelly Roll"
- About $1 / 2-5 / 8$ yard of fabric for the binding.


## Cut:

For block 1 - ribbon star block:


I did cut each block individually as I wanted them all different: (make 15 individual sets/blocks):

From white/cream:

- $12-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
- $4-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles

Color 1:

- $4-2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 2 \frac{112 \prime \prime}{\prime \prime}$ square

Color 2:

- $4-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips

Color 3:

- $4-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips

For block 2: - half square triangle block:


From light pink: 8

- 8-13"squares

From green:

- 8-13" squares


## For sashings:

From off white:

- $71-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 12.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips


## For cornerstones:

From leftover $2.5^{\prime \prime}$ strips - I used green -

- $42-2.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares


## Construct blocks:

## For block 1:



The blocks will finish at $121 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. (florals will vary in my diagrams! ())

1. Starting with your cream $2^{1 / 2 \prime}$ " square, add Color $12^{1 / 2 \prime}$ " square

2. Add your cream $-21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip this unit:

3. Add your Color $22 \frac{1}{2} /{ }^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ strips to the side

4. Add your Color $22^{1 / 2 \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips to the bottom like this:

5. "Snowball" both the Color 2 and the Color 3 strips like this using a cream $21 / 2$ " square.

Place the cream square on top of the colorful strips and sew on the diagonal as indicated:


Trim on smaller dotted lines.


Press white towards the outside. Finished block will look like this: (To me it looks like a slanted tulip.)


Make 4 identical such blocks. These block sections finish at $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

Then, sew all four block sections together into one larger block like this:


It should finish at $12 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 121 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

Make 15. I made mine all different.

For block 2:


Make this very large half square triangle block by drawing a line diagonally on the back of your light pink square. Place your $13^{\prime \prime}$ squares of light pink and green right sides together and sew $1 / 4$ " on each side of the line you just drew.

Cut apart on the line drawn. Open up to form a big $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ half square triangle. Press and trim to $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ if it isn't that size.

Make 15-12.5" at this point in the process blocks

## How to put together this quilt:

1. Make blocks as described above.
2. Using this diagram, place your blocks as shown, sewing a sashing piece between each block:

3. Sew your top together in rows. Place a sashing strip between each block as shown: Make 6 as shown in diagram above


Alternating rows make rows using the sashing/cornerstones like this: Make 7

## 4. Press well.

5. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer
6. Quilt as desired. I used curls and swirls
7. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
