## Wonky Haven

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88^{\prime \prime \times 108^{\prime \prime}}
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To make the quilt pictured:


## You need:

- About 6 yards of various lights for the strips - I used 2" strips to make up blocks first
- About 6 yards of bright colors for the bright border and the inner border
- $3 / 4$ yard of fabric for the binding. I used various brightly colored $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strips I already had

This quilt is made up of one $10.5^{\prime \prime}$ block in 2 colorways and they look like this:


## Cut:

From your various lights, create $2^{\prime \prime}$ strips and make up blocks that look like this: Make them $12.5^{\prime \prime}$.


You could also just use cut pieces $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ - not made of strips. Make 24 blocks (or squares).
From various brights, cut 24 pieces 12.5 " square (to make the quilt the size I made mine).

## Construct blocks:

## Main block:

Place the pieces in alternating pieces - light/bright/light/bright, etc. Right sides up. I used stacks of 6 lights/ and 6 darks. I couldn't cut more than that well but if you wanted to make more blocks and could cut through in one cut, you could do more at a time. I repeated this process 4 times to give me 48 blocks. (Each time you do it you will get 12 blocks.)

After stacking it up nicely, follow these pictures and make your blocks:
Line up the edges nicely - try to keep them even: Place every other square - bright/light/bright/light, etc.


Line up the edges nicely - try to keep them even:
Cut like this:


Take the top piece and put it on the bottom. Straighten it back up:


Sew each block back together as stacked. Restack, press and line up as best as possible:


Place the ruler as shown and make a cut:


Remove the top piece on the right and put it on the bottom::


Sew them together again in the order as they are:


Turn your stack 90 degree as shown: Place the ruler over the stack as shown:


Cut: Then place the top piece on the bottom:


Sew those together as they are stacked: Make them nice and neat again:


Put the ruler over the right side as shown and cut:


Then take the top piece and move it to the bottom: Then sew them together in the order as they are stacked (I forgot to take a picture of this last step.).

Now you will have a stack of blocks that can be trimmed to $10.5^{\prime \prime}$. You will have some blocks that will have dark pieces in the corners and some with lights in the corners:


I repeated this process $4 x$ to make 48 blocks. I did not worry about making them all look the same. That was part of the charm of the wonky top.

Borders will be discussed under "borders"
Make 48 blocks.

## How to put together this quilt:

1. Construct your blocks as described above.
2. Lay out the blocks so the they are pleasing to you:

Here is the plan


This layout is $6 x 8$.

3. Attach borders:
A. Border 1 - Light:

- Cut $2-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 80.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut $2-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 64.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.
B. Border 2 - Dark - shown above is blue:
- Cut $2-2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 84.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut $2-2.5$ " $\times 68.5$ ". Attach to the top and bottom.
B. Border 3 - wonky pieces:
- Cut (from lights) $-4-6.5^{\prime \prime}$ squares for the corners
- From brights - cut 78-4.5"x6.5" - For each piece of the border - make the wonky pieces as shown below the border strips:
- Cut 2 smaller pieces of light that look as shown. After making the wonky points, sew 22 together for the sides and 17 for the top and bottom:
- For sides: (22)


For top and bottom: (17)


How to make the wonky points:
Taka piece of bright $4.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$ and 2 small light pieces:


Place a piece of light over one corner: Sew along one side:


Trim out under the sewing. Press back as shown:


Repeat on other side by placing a light piece across the other corner: Sew:


Press out as shown: (shown is also underneath)


Trim to size: (4.5"x6.5")


Trim again:


After trimming it will be $4.5^{\prime \prime} \times 6.5^{\prime \prime}$.
I then trim out from behind the white/light corners:


Make a total of 78 of these blocks: I made a variety of colors.


After sewing 22 of these blocks together ( 2 x ), attach them to the sides.
Then sew 17 blocks together and a $6.5^{\prime \prime}$ light square to each end. Attach these strips to the top and bottom:

D. Border 4 - light:

- Cut $2-4.5^{\prime \prime} \times 100.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the sides.
- Cut $2-4.5^{\prime \prime} \times 88.5^{\prime \prime}$. Attach to the top and bottom.

4. Press well.
5. Sandwich, using whatever type of batting and backing you prefer.
6. Quilt as desired. I used swirls
7. Bind, using whatever method you wish.
