I think we were probably 2 month's behind in getting started on all the logistics, but in the end it all worked out and I have gotten excellent reviews and compliments. Thank you to everyone whom donated their time to make it a success.

This month I am going to postpone my flash-back to dedicate space for recognition and positive highlights from the Board meeting.

We filled the open spot for Finance Trustee with Sarah Gassaway. Sarah was born and raised in Downs and returned to live in Downs in 2013. She works for their family business and is/was a volunteer for several organizations. Her experience in business, volunteerism, etc. provide her the perfect background for our Finance Trustee position. I look forward to working with Sarah. We swore in a new trustee but yet lost another because he permanently moved out of the corporate limits of Downs. Paul Messamore was elected in 2015 and has been our Public Works Trustee. I will really miss Paul Messamore and appreciate his service during the last few years. Please thank him for his service and commitment. The good news is that I already have a person to fill this position and hope to seat him at the July 21 special board meeting.


At this meeting we passed legislation to allow recycling to change from the 2nd & 4th Saturday to the 2nd & 4th Friday, which will be the same day as the garbage pickup. Please mark your recycle containers from the garbage. Please take advantage of your recycling service. We also approved the final easement agreement with Tri-Valley and the Downs Methodist Church for them to run water and sewer across the school property. The Village will upsize this pipe to be prepared for if any growth occurs in that direction.

Finally, we approved \$10k in TIF 1 reimbursement for the wonderful remodeling project by RHA Holdings, LLC to renovate the buildings that used to house Quin's Grocery, but now dk Designs. This is one of the original buildings in Downs and we are pleased to see it remain. Plus, gain two additional business locations of which, one will be a photography business.




FREE MOVIE, FREE POPCORN, FREE COTTON CANDY!


Light up sticks for cotton candy can be purchased for a \$3. Bring your own drink, blankets, chairs, bug spray, etc.



JULY - PUBLIC WORKS WATER REPORT:

Water and sewer report for June 2016

7/6/2016

The sewer lift station delivered 1,620,000 gallons to BNWRD for the month, averaging 54,000 gallons per day. The total water pumped for the month was 2,504,600 gallons, averaging 83,500 gallons per day. The average iron concentration in the finished water was .33 PPM. One service line water leak was repaired during the month. All fire hydrants were inspected and flushed in June using 167,000 gallons. Hydrant painting is currently taking place and will be completed in the next few days. Nothing new to report on the water tower painting. The sewer and water mains with services for Beecher Trails first addition are installed and tested.

JULY - PUBLIC WORKS/STREETS REPORT:

With the weather starting to change, we will be working on spring clean up from the snowplowing this winter and road repairs. I would also like to remind residences that we will start our debris pickup on the first Monday of each month, beginning in April and continue thereafter. If the weather is bad on that Monday, then the next nice day we will do the pickup. Please re-read the rules below.

The following rules apply:

- 1. Pickup will be on the 1st Monday of each month: If weather, holidays or unforeseen circumstances prevent us from picking up on this day, then pickup will be the following day.
- 2. Items to be picked up must be burnable (Ex. Leaves, sticks, branches, brush, etc.)
- 3. All items must be on a curb or driveway, as close to the road as possible, without creating a hazard in the road. (NOTE: since we use a backhoe in most cases, to accomplish this, we DO NOT want to tear or rut up anyone's yards or ditches. If we cannot reach it from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up. If you cannot get the debris near the road, PLEASE CALL me to make arrangements at 309-838-6031.)
- 4. There is to be NO BURNING in DITCHES. This causes clogging and backups in our culverts. This is one of the primary reasons we are providing this service.

Recycling Change Beginning July 22

A revised agreement was approved at the July 7th board meeting with Area Disposal (formerly with Casili) for a change in service dates for recycling collection to the same date as the scheduled refuse collection. Curbside recycling will be twice a month along with garbage pick-up, on the 2nd and 4th Fridays of each month beginning Friday, July 22nd. Please mark your containers "recycle" or make it clear which containers are garbage and recycling. It is no longer necessary to separate your recyclables for collection by cardboard, plastic, etc.

Parks Committee Report July 2016

Thank you! Thank you! Thank you to all who made the July 2nd Community Breakfast held in conjunction with the 5k Freedom Run/Walk a huge success!! We served over 80 breakfasts and received \$500.00 in donations from our generous guests. We thank Kimberly Jensen and the Events Committee for advertising the event. Special thanks to Scott and Marylou Romine and Dave and Cheryl Bach for their scrumptious donations. Many thanks to the Parks Committee members for putting the event together and stepping up to the plate when a much larger crowd than expected arrived. Tentatively the committee felt donations from this breakfast could best be used to improve the pavilion kitchen by cleaning and tuning up the stove, sealing the sink, repairing/replacing the refrigerator and possibly completing the countertops.

The committee is putting our summer repair plans into gear and planned projects for the pavilion and youth center are slated for July/August. We hope to include several improvements to the basketball courts as well, including additional fencing behind the backboards on the school yard side. It's great to see so many people using the courts this season. A reminder: if you are the last group or person to use the courts before 10:00 PM, please shut off the lights to save energy use, reduce costs, and keep our lighting from impacting houses nearby. The switch is on the light pole near the Youth Center. Thanks.

Pavilion rentals have been steady. Pavilion Rental Checklists and Parks Volunteer Sheets are now available on the kitchen counter for renters' convenience. Please fulfill ALL the clean-up requirements on the checklists. [A lightweight mop has been added to the cleaning supplies to make it easier to clean the floor.] Clean-up is on the honor system. It's vital to a community owned space for everyone to be cognizant of and courteous to the next renters who come in after them. Renters should return the pavilion key to the village office either in person or by putting it into the drop slot on the north side of the village hall.

We have only gotten one citizen response to log pile removal in Kickapoo Park. That level of response seems to indicate we'll have to find another way to remove them. The fire and police departments consider them safety concerns during periods of flooding. The committee is using the i-tree web tool to identify available grants for log removal and for restoring the flood plain habitat that was destroyed when the sewer line was installed.

The Food Pantry distributed 36 boxes in June. Many thanks for the generous donation of a freezer from Mike Reichert. It is a much needed addition. The Pantry is still looking for a chest freezer. Due to the July 4^{th} holiday, distribution this month is on Friday/Saturday July 15 & 16. Volunteers are needed for unloading on Monday, July 11 at 12:30 and packing boxes on Wednesday, July 13 from 10:00-12:00 Noon. Contact Linda Bowman or just show up at the Youth Center. Thanks.


TRI-VALLEY HIGH SCHOOL GARAGE SALE for CHARITY

Please have your recyclables at the curb by 6:00 a.m. Items collected at curbside are picked-up in a single stream process; it is no longer necessary to separate your recyclables for collection. All containers must be rinsed out before pickup, this will reduce contamination and odors.

Acceptable items include:

- · Clear glass bottles and jars
- · Cereal and gift boxes
