From the Desk of the Mayor September 2017

This month's Board meeting continued our talk regarding development; both residential and business. We now have three TIF funding requests. The American Legion requested additional funding for their remodel project to help revive the American Legion. Prairie Woodworks requesting funding to correct drainage and parking lot conditions that hamper their business. Both of these requests were granted.

The final TIF request was for a new business/residential development on Main St. The vacant house and trailer will be torn down/removed and a new multi-use building(s) will take its place. Preliminary plans are for two businesses on the bottom and 3-4 apartments on the top. Although, the land has been purchased and some demolition has occurred, we need to discuss with the developer the funding request, as it is the largest request we have ever received in the downtown.

The Board approved the final plat for the Huff Crossing subdivision, which will be 4 lots (~80′ x 182′) on 1.6 acres of land at the corner of Huff and Main Streets. This development is by TMK Builders LLC (aka Rave). They are required to improve ditch and drainage and extend the Main Street water main around the corner to the edge of their property. The village will then extend the water main to N. Pintail in order to complete the loop. This should improve water pressure and clarity for those residents in that area of Mallard Pt.

The ZBA will be holding its public hearing for the preliminary plan regarding the water detention pond and storm sewer at Downs Crossing on October 3, 2017 at 6:30 pm and possibly a rezoning request from Tim Norman and Stark Excavating Inc. on the land south of Beecher Trails. The land is being positioned for an additional subdivision, but a preliminary plan has not been filed...just the rezoning request from Ag to R2.

The Village Board will consider the ZBA recommendation(s) at it October 5, 2017 meeting, which has been moved to an 8 pm start time due to Tri-Valley Homecoming.

Other discussion items are covered in the meeting overview in the flyer. If you have questions or comments, as always, please contact me or anyone else on the Board.

PLEASE CONSIDER SERVICE TO YOUR VILLAGE

The Mayor will be accepting letters for consideration for this position. Your term of office will be the remaining months until April 30, 2019. If you decide to continue, you will need to run for a two-year term in the 2019 April election. You will be paid \$125 per regular or special board meeting.

You are eligible to be a Trustee if you are a registered voter and a resident of Downs for at least one year prior to the date of the election. A person is not eligible to take the oath of office for a municipal office if that person is, at the time required for taking the oath of office, in arrears in the payment of a tax or other indebtedness due to the municipality or has been convicted in any court located in the United States of any infamous crime, bribery, perjury, or other felony [65 ILCS 5/3.1-10-5(a)(b)] s.

Monthly Brush Pick-up

CLARIFICATION AND REMINDER

The Village provides the service of once a month pick-up of material that can be burned. However, we have been getting swing sets, household items and other stuff with nails, screws, bolts, etc. Some stuff just dumped at our storage (see above notice) and others left on side of road.

The Village will no longer pick up items that have sharp objects, hazardous material, or metal in the mix with burnable items or trimmings. You can remove all nails, screws, bolts, metal, etc. and we will take. Otherwise, it will be left. No exceptions.

Also, the Village doesn't take stumps, logs, branches, etc. that have been cut by a hired or professional company and left. If you hire someone to cut down a tree or do a trim service, they must haul away (not to our village storage field) what they remove. Again, no exceptions.

Additionally, we have contracted with AREA to do once a month bulk pickup as a part of their contract. On the scheduled that was mailed to each homeowner, it contains instructions for how to use that service. Here is the verbiage on that mailing just in case: Bulky items will be picked up at no cost (sofas, desks, old mattresses, etc.) the first pickup of each month. If unable to wait for the regularly scheduled pickup of bulky items, please call to schedule a pickup on a different day and pay \$35 per item.



Water and sewer report for August 2017

9/6/2017

The average iron concentration for the month in the finished water was .40 PPM. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished and distribution samples were all satisfactory, fluoride concentration was .682. Lead and copper sampling was completed with results still pending. Water pumpage for the month was 2.444 million gallons, averaging 78,800 gallons a day. The sewer lift station pumpage for the month was 1.505 million gallons, averaging 48,500 gallons per day. A water service line leak was repaired at 315 S. Lincoln, a phone line was damaged while digging and required repairs by Frontier.

TRI-VALLEY HOMECOMING PARADE:

The Tri- Valley Homecoming parade will be held on Thursday, October 5th at 6:00 pm. The pep rally will immediately follow the parade starting with the battle of the bands in the high school commons.

Please contact Shari Riley (<u>sriley@tri-valley3.org</u>) if you are interested in being in the parade. All are invited to participate. Line up starts at 5:30. If you have a hayrack or trailer, we would like you to line up on Lincoln heading north. Enter Lincoln from Franklin and head north. The band and homecoming court convertibles will be first and then it is whoever gets there first. If you have a pickup and no rack you may line up <u>in the park</u> heading out the west side onto Lincoln. We are asking that you make 2 rows of cars/trucks.

The TVHS marching band and Tri-Valley golf cart will lead the parade so they will line up first on Lincoln by the park.

The parade will begin on Lincoln (and Washington), turn right on Garfield, then a right onto Cleveland and a left on Washington. The parade will then proceed into the high school parking lot and continue on to the middle school where parents may pick up their children. Please <u>DO NOT</u> drop off/unload until you are at the middle school. This is for the safety of the children. It also creates a traffic jam if you unload in the high school parking lot or by the baseball field.

We are asking residents and participants to refrain from parking along the parade route from 5:30-6:30. This includes the high school parking lot. Please only park in actual parking spots at the high school until the parade is finished.

Debris Pickup:

Our debris pickup is scheduled on the FIRST MONDAY of each month, running from April through November (dependant upon the weather). If the designated pickup day is not favorable, we will pickup on the next nice day, usually on Tuesday, the following day. Please re-read the rules below.

- 1. Pickup will be on the 1st Monday of each month. If weather, holidays or unforeseen circumstances prevent us from picking up on this day, then pickup will be the following day.
- 2. Items to be picked up must be burnable (Ex. Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- 3. All items must be on a curb or driveway, as close to the road as possible, without creating a hazard in the road. (NOTE: since we use a backhoe in most cases to accomplish this, we DO NOT want to tear or rut up anyone's yards or ditches. If we cannot reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up. If you cannot get the debris near the road, PLEASE CALL to make arrangements.
- 4. There is to be NO BURNING in the ditches. This causes clogging and backups in our ditches and culverts. This is one of the primary reasons we are providing this service.

Parks Report September 2017

Welcome to our new Parks Committee member, Lindsey Nicholson! She was unanimously approved by the committee and the village board. Lindsey has lived in Downs with her family for six years. She is a kinesiology and parks management teacher at ISU. We welcome her ideas, energy and expertise on the committee.

This past month saw several improvements in our parks. Thanks to Hunter Ferguson, our new fans have been installed in Dooley Park Pavilion. Work to improve fencing on the basketball courts continues, thanks to Karen Bair and friends. Two new sturdy wooden trash cans have been built and installed in Kickapoo Park thanks to the efforts of Girl Scout Troup 1518, their leader, Sarah Gassaway, Bert and Brad Clark, and Jim and Mark Layten. Thanks to Mayor James, most of the mulch in Kickapoo Park has been relocated to the lot at the top of Huff Road. The mulch is available to village members at no cost. Park Committee members have repaired a toilet, spruced up landscaping around the Youth Center, and tightened the bolts on the playground equipment.

Ongoing projects include spraying for bugs and rodents, painting fence poles, improving outdoor lighting, and working on plumbing in the Youth Center. Additionally we're looking forward to working on projects connected to the Boy Scouts, Downs Topnotchers 4-H Club and student groups at Tri-Valley. These include a Gaga Ball Pit, a wood duck house installation, and possibly a skateboard ramp.

At our next meeting we'll discuss several new projects. Installing a 3 basin sink in the pavilion, completing a roofing project at the pavilion, and planning our October fundraiser head the list. We're creating a more detailed plan and exploring funding sources for restoring the prairie floodplain in Kickapoo Park.

Our income in July was \$544.75. Our expenses were \$920.59 leaving a net of -\$375.84. At present we are on target with our proposed budget. However we still want to decrease our gas bill in the pavilion and the electrical bill in the Community Center. We hope to gain information and possible solutions from a free energy efficiency program sponsored by Ameren.

The Food Pantry continues to fulfill needs in our community. They plan to distribute 36 to 38 boxes this month. The pick-up will be a week later than usual due to the Labor Day holiday. Fresh produce is still being offered as a part of this program. As always many thanks to Linda Bowman and the many volunteers who keep this important service thriving.

Our next Parks Meeting is on Monday, September 18 at 6:00 PM in Dooley Park Pavilion.






