#### From the Desk of the Mayor - August 2019

This month we got some great news on several fronts. I am excited about where our village is heading, and I hope you will be also. If not, please talk with me about it.

- 1) Streetscape survey was very positive, and we had 137 responses that will help with our planning and next steps. The steering committee met and reviewed the survey and walked around the downtown to discuss options and ideas. MSA will take everything we discussed and start working on options. Soon we will have public forums to showcase these options. Steering Committee meetings are open to the public and you are welcome to attend and voice ideas you may have about this project.
- 2) The water plant study initial results came back, Toby and I are very encouraged by the results and our next steps are to refine and narrow the options. EPA funding for this type of project is available and we would hope to move forward on this project to FINALLY have a water plant that can produce RO or softened water out of the plant. Two things you can expect: 1) you should no longer need RO, to buy water or have a water softener; 2) We will need to increase rates to help cover the cost, BUT we expect favorable rates and principal forgiveness from the EPA grant/loan programs to keep this increase down. I don't think we have raised the rates in over 10 years, but we also felt we couldn't until we fixed the water.

Our strategy and plan moving forward with public works are to hire help to run the plant and work on our infrastructure. The plant operator will continue to train and educate Les Fitzwater who has done a fantastic job since we lost Kevin. Les can continue to run the plant, but we need a licensed operator and we need Les to manage our public works maintenance for streets and now water/sewer. Please thank him for his hard work for our village.

Gameday Grill will open its new facility on August 9th – Congratulations!

#### THIS IS YOUR WARNING

Whomever is dumping their grass, trash, etc. in Kickapoo Park or the Dooley Park dumpsters this will be your warning to STOP! My plea to the folks that care about their village, please be on the lookout for these folks, ask them to STOP and/or report them to MetCom, Chief Dingler, Maureen Roach or Village Hall.

#### MONTHLY BRUSH PICKUP

Our debris pickup is scheduled for the first MONDAY of each month. Pickup will run from April through November (weather permitting). If the designated Monday pickup is not favorable, we will pick up on the next nice day following that Monday. The following are the rules we will follow with no exceptions.

- Items to be picked up must be burnable and free from all nails, screws and metal (ex: Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- All items must be within the Village right away on curb, driveway or as close to the road as possible without creating a hazard in the road. (Note: Since we use a backhoe, in most cases, to do this work, we DO NOT want to tear up or rut yard's or ditches. If we can't reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up.

Please note that there is NO BURNING in the ditches or on the edges of the road. Doing this causes clogging and backup in the ditches and culverts. It can also damage the road surface causing us to spend what little tax dollars we have to fix these issues.

## 4<sup>th</sup> of July Sub-Committee

#### HELP WANTED/NEEDED/REQUIRED!

The time has come to transition the Fourth of July activities to an independent sub-committee as has already been done with almost every other event in the Village. Over the past 6 years during which the Events Committee has organized and run this event, we have considered hiring an event coordinator to help spread the workload. However, we ultimately decided the best use of the dollars raised would be to put as much of these funds as possible back into the festivities themselves to enhance the entire experience for the Village.

If you want to see this tradition carried forward and not die, please volunteer to be a part of this sub-committee. Your responsibilities will be to plan, organize, budget and recruit to make this event whatever you want. You will present your budgetary needs to the Events Committee, which is charged with establishing the overall finances for all Village events each fiscal year (due Jan – Feb each year).

Do whatever you want, change whatever you want, make it great again; the sky is the limit. Well, really, the budget and funds raised outside the budget are the only limits on what you can do. Our fireworks contract is up, so you can change that as well but will have to hire a new source by October. Or we can retain our current provider who will hold the 2019 pricing for another year if we sign a contract and pay before the end of 2019.

The Events Committee will slot Fourth of July activities into the plan for the coming Fiscal Year and will set an initial budget equal to the money raised from the 2019 event. However, the Events Committee will NOT be in charge of ANY organization of the activities you've come to associate with the Village celebration. If you want to see these activities continue, someone will need to step up and take the reins. The current leadership will provide all the help and guidance needed in order to insure a smooth transition for this sub-committee.

Please reach out to any member of the Events Committee should you be willing to take on this task. If no one steps forward, you will have fireworks as already contracted but no other events will be scheduled.

#### Water and sewer report for July 2019

The average iron concentration for the month in the finished water is .43 PPM.

Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished and distribution samples were all satisfactory, fluoride concentration was .663. The volume of water pumped 3.063 million gallons, averaging 98,806 gallons a day. The sewer lift station pumped 1583 million gallons for month averaging 51,604 gallons per day. We had no non-pay turn offs for month.

Put on new meter for the raw total wells. We are having issues with the meter communicating with the plant. Have Dave Schaeffer (Heyworth) looking into issue.



REMINDER: The billing due date is the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month. Payments received after the 15<sup>th</sup> are subject to the late fees.

The Village has started an ACH (automatic withdrawal) program available. This program has NO FEE to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15<sup>th</sup> of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Should the 15<sup>th</sup> fall on the weekend or a bank holiday, it will be pulled the next business day.

Since the amount of your bill can vary each month, the amount withdrawn will be adjusted to match your bill. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted by July 1, 2019 to the Billing Office in order to be included in the July ACH payment.

The Village is working to make paperless billing a future option, so if you would like to receive your bill through email in the future, please include your email address on the authorization form.

Anyone that has used epay in the past to pay after the 15th, and does not wish to enroll in the ACH program will need to make their payment by cash, check or money order and will need to mail it, or drop it in the drop box at the Village Hall.

**Water Emergencies** such as no water or water leaking need to be reported to the Publicworks Department at 378-2137. The water trustee is Toby Twyford and he can be reached at 309-830-3448.



GARBAGE: The Village Garbage contact is Area Disposal and they can be reached at 800-935-5652. Garbage pickup is <u>THURSDAYS</u>, unless there is a holiday during the week and pick up will be Friday. Bulk pick up is the first pick up of each month



Curbside recycling is the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Thursday of the month, unless there is a holiday during the week then pickup will be Friday. Please be advised that there is to be NO Styrofoam, plastic bags and lids from bottles when recycling. Items put by the curb for recycle need to be clean. Please have recycle to the curb by 6am on pick up day.

#### Parks Report August 2019

In Dooley Park, **Lindsey Nicholson** and **Eric Marshall** installed a new tot swing, and Eric removed two small dead trees. Soon to be Eagle Scout, **Nick Ateberry**, completed installation of a horseshoe pit in Dooley Park. Bring your shoes and try it out!

Parks is re-soliciting bids for taking down two trees in Dooley Park in order to comply with prevailing wage rules. Core samples to test for iron levels will be taken on three trees in Dooley Park. The water fountain/fill system is on track to be installed near the basketball courts. Because of hard ground, the design for the Seminary St. entrance to Kickapoo Park had to be altered. The project will be completed this summer.

If you're planning a summer event, the pavilion in Dooley Park is a great venue for all kinds of gatherings. To reserve the pavilion for an event or a meeting, contact the Village Hall between 8 AM and Noon Monday through Friday at 378-3221. To find open rental dates, consult the calendar on villageofdowns.org website or call the Village Hall. You can download the rental agreement and clean-up checklist from the village website. Click forms and applications on the homepage, then click Pavilion rental agreement and checklist separately to download and print the two forms. You can also pick the forms up at the Village Hall. When renting the pavilion, be sure to make plans to pick up the key from the Village Hall during their business hours. Before leaving the pavilion after your event, complete the clean-up checklist and deposit it in the tray on the kitchen counter. The rental fee rate is \$50.00 for a regular rental and \$25.00 for community service organizations. Reminder: reserve early to be sure you get the date you want!

# PUBLIC SAFETY TIPS FOR AUGUST...It's Back-to- School!

Students are heading back to the classroom this month. A new school year brings excitement, new beginnings and educational opportunities.

School days can also bring traffic congestion. School buses are picking up their students, kids on bikes are hurrying to get to school before the bell rings, harried parents are trying to drop their kids off before work and young drivers are driving to school for the first time.

A few tips to help keep everyone safe. Drivers should slow down and pay attention to kids – especially before and after school. Drivers are sharing the road with bicyclists, young walkers, and parents are dropping off and picking up their kids from three school locations. Drivers must yield to those in crosswalks. Drive cautiously as Seminary, Washington Street and Rt. 150 can be extremely busy before and after school.

The Downs' Police Department monitors traffic at the elementary, high school and middle school entrances and exits. However, there are times when we have limited coverage. Please ensure the officer's safety as well as other drivers and pedestrians by obeying school speed zones on school days when students are present.

Back to school also means lots of school activities and a variety of opportunities for police officers to engage with students, faculty, parents and visitors through classroom presentations, emergency drills and safety training, after-school activities such as basketball and football home games and after-prom. Police officers are involved in several community activities and events including Halloween, Cookies with Santa, Easter Egg Hunt, 4<sup>th</sup> of July and Coffee with a Cop. These activities and events provide unique opportunities for community members to meet and greet police staff.

In addition to our police officers, you may have noticed a specially trained "good canine pawfficer" who accompanies Chief Dingler at many of these social events. A furry Siberian Husky who is trained by the American Kennel Club is "on staff" to interact with the community. According to owner Chief Dingler, "his greatest skill is affection." It is our hope that with the aid of Pawfficer Coyote, the Downs community will feel comfortable approaching officers and invite conversations and connections.


Our school and community events are the pride of Downs. The Downs Police Department wishes everyone a successful start of the school year and we look forward to many upcoming opportunities to engage with the public.
