From the Desk of the Mayor

I feel I owe an explanation for my return without the noise of social media/rumors. I needed to step away for two reasons. Mainly because my wife was done with being Clerk, and felt if I continued, she would be obligated to be clerk and be dragged back into that position. I didn't want that to happen or for her to feel obligated anymore. She has put up with too much over the last 12 years and that was unfair to her. However, when nobody ran for either position, like so many said they would, it made it even more difficult to not throw my name in. Instead, I asked Maureen to step into that position as I felt she had the knowledge and experience to be your mayor.

Maureen did a fantastic job of picking up where I left off and keeping projects moving. She is fully capable of being the mayor, but other circumstances warranted my saying I would accept an appointment if the Board chose me in July. Since the clerk position was filled, I knew Julie would not have to worry about being drug back into being clerk, so I let Maureen know shortly after the June board meeting. I formally sent a letter to Maureen on June 26, 2025, which I posted on Facebook on June 27 for transparency.

The July public comment was a good opportunity to hear concerns that haven't been expressed before or at least not directly to me. When I took my seat, I thanked them for the open and honest comments and said I would consider how to implement change to do a better job. I am open to any discussion about the village and what we are doing. Please reach out and ask for a meeting to talk.

In addition, to be more proactive, I will set up monthly open times for us to talk, if needed, each Monday (Mayor Monday) before the Village Board Meeting (6 pm @ Viking Brew) to hear concerns outside and before that meeting.

It has been a pleasure serving my community and home of the past 20+ years. I am grateful for the 5 trustees that have faith and confidence. I will continue to lead with the honor and integrity of the last 16 years. I am confident other important opportunities will continue to come our way. These opportunities will improve Downs even further and continue the goal of making Downs self-sufficient and not reliant on the State of Illinois.



Village Of Downs From the Desk of the Mayor

I am blessed to have this opportunity to serve two more years to the best of my ability.

Downs project updates:

- 1) The new water plant will be 100% operational, barring any setback, by Friday, August 22, 2025. The watermains will take time for sediment to clear out and we plan to do flushing to help with this process. The water is crystal clear, 50% softened, 0 iron, and 0 tannins. This is a huge step forward for Downs and a long time coming. We will increase the softening over the next few months as long as we don't have any setbacks with operations.
- 2) Downs Crossing Tower and watermain extension. The tower is almost done and is ready for water to complete the remaining tasks. The pressure reducing stations and watermain are installed. The final work is being completed on the pump station behind the water plant. Once completed our new clean water will be used to flush the new watermain, fill the tower, and test the system.
- 3) Our streetscape project is progressing well. The eastside of Seminary Street will be completed hopefully this week or early next week. They will then start on the westside, and we will be finished with this project by this fall. Funding has been set aside and not at risk from federal cuts.
- 4) Illinois Senator Sally Turner secured a \$20k grant for Downs last year and we are using this grant to complete the sidewalks on the southside of W. Main St from Seminary to Price St which are a part of Phase II of the streetscape project.
- 5) Colleen Ln and S Lincoln St Road improvements will start in September. This project is being done by Roanoke Concrete and Stark which will widen and concrete this road.

Village of Downs Board of Trustees Meeting Overview August 14th, 2025, 7 pm @ Village Hall & via ZOOM

Executive order 2021-9 by the Governor of Illinois allowed this meeting to be held via Zoom, telephone and at the Village Hall.

- 1. Mayor Mike James called the August 14, 2025, meeting to order at 7:07 p.m.
- 2. Roll Call was taken. Trustees present were Maureen Roach, Diana Reynolds, Stephanie Adkisson, Sarah Gassaway, Brian Warfel, and Toby Twyford. A quorum was present. Also present were Clerk Rachel Eagles, Treasurer Julie Bakewell, and Village Attorney Dawn Wall.
- 3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- 4. A motion to approve the agenda and order was made and approved.
 - Boy scout presentation was added--Jonathan Alarie, representing the Boy Scouts of America, presented a proposal for his Eagle Scout project. He distributed a handout outlining plans to repair the wood ramp on the creek trail in Kickapoo Park and to install a new bench as part of the improvements. In response to a question from Roach regarding materials, Jonathan confirmed that he will be using pressure-treated lumber. He also noted that he has arranged with Lowe's to purchase the materials at cost. Jonathan aims to complete the project by December.
 - Note: This item will be added to next month's agenda, as it was not listed on this month's agenda.
 - Solar presentation from Solar on Earth—Sumeet presented via Zoom a potential program that would provide solar energy credits on the Village's Ameren electric bills. She explained how the program works through the use of renewable energy credits. Roach inquired about the cost to participate, and Sumeet clarified that there is no direct cost—participants receive at least a 10% discount on their annual Ameren electricity spend. In response to a question from the Treasurer regarding penalties or time commitments, Sumeet stated that there is a one-year commitment, with the discount continuing for up to 15 years. When asked if the solar credits could be adjusted as electricity usage fluctuates, Sumeet confirmed that recalibrations are possible if they are notified of usage changes. Note: no action was taken on this presentation.

 - Adkisson made a statement regarding an interaction and conversation that Diana Reynolds had with Chief Dingler. Conversation ensued.
- 7. Public Comment
 - An email was read from constituent Cheryl Bach: "I would like to know exactly what amount of the government grant for Streetscape has been received by the Village-only that amount not any received from McLean Road Dept."
 - a. Clerk will send MSA report that was presented to trustees at this meeting, with current amounts received, to Cheryl Bach via email.
 - b. Clarification was made by Mayor James that the Village is reimbursed as each bill is





submitted as construction stages are completed on the streetscapes project. Our federal grant was approved, and the money that was awarded to us is secure and is guaranteed to us.

- Julie James—question asked via Zoom why Reynolds addressed Chief instead of Mayor the response was that was previously answered earlier in the meeting.

BACK-TO-SCHOOL PUBLIC SAFETY REMINDERS FOR DRIVERS

When a school bus's red lights are flashing and the stop arm is extended, drivers must stop, regardless of whether they are behind the bus or approaching from the opposite direction. Drivers should remain stopped until the bus resumes motion, flashing lights are turned off, the stop arm is retracted, or the bus driver signals you to proceed.

Pedestrians are trusting drivers to stop and wait for them to cross the road. We have many young walkers on various roads throughout the village and some streets do not have sidewalks, so be on the lookout and especially be careful driving during both morning and afternoon peak traffic times. Be mindful of Village speed limits. The school zone speed limit on Washington St. is 20 mph during school hours. Otherwise, Village speed limits are 25 mph. Also, please be cautious of workers in the work zones throughout construction. Speed limits will be enforced. Let's be extra alert and keep our students safe!

Billing

REMINDER: The billing due date is the **15th of the month**. Payments received after the 15th are subject to the late fees. If not paid by the 25th of the month, and the office has to call you regarding payment, there will be an additional fee of \$20. If not paid on the 26th, shut off of water can occur. To reconnect, there is a additional fee of \$30.

The Village is using an **ACH** (automatic withdrawal) program. This program has NO FEE to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15th of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted to the Billing Office by the 1st of the month you wish your first payment withdrawal to be made.

Reminder: If an ACH comes back as NSF it is treated like a check, and cash or money order is needed to cover the \$25 NSF fee + the amount of the bill. A 2nd NSF will result in no longer being eligible for ACH and all payments will need to be in cash or a money order. Please put your service number on your payment.

Water Sewer report for July 2025.

The average iron concentration for the finished water was .76 ppm. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished and distribution samples were all satisfactory, fluoride concentration was .5. The volume of water pumped for the month was 3.037 million gallons, averaging 97,974 gallons per day. The sewer lift station pumped 2.116 million gallons for the month, averaging 68,283 million gallons per day.

Water meters/transmitters replacement changeout continues. We will be contacting you in the future to schedule a time when our team can replace the old units with updated versions. This will be at no cost to the homeowner as it is Village Property.

Monthly Brush Pickup Continues April thru November 2025

Debris pickup will continue, based on the Streets Trustee's direction, the first MONDAY of each month (weather permitting). If the designated Monday pickup is not favorable, we will pick up on the next nice day following that Monday. The following are the rules we will follow with no exceptions.

- Items to be picked up must be burnable and free from all nails, screws, and metal (ex: Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- All items must be within the Village right away on curb, driveway or as close to the road as possible without creating a hazard in the road. (Note: Since we use a backhoe, in most cases, to do this work, we DO NOT want to tear up or rut yards or ditches. If we can't reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up.
- If you know you will have a larger than normal pile, please contact the office so they can make the streets department aware.

Please note that there is NO BURNING in the ditches or on the road. Doing this causes clogging and backup in the ditches and culverts. It can also damage the road surface causing us to spend what little tax dollars we have, to fix these issues.

Illegal Dumping

Please do not dump yard waste and ANY other items at the entrances to Kickapoo Park, Village storage yard, and/or along Huff Rd South of Main St. Violators will be caught and fined accordingly!

FY2026 (May 2025 – April 2026) Village of Downs Event Plan Current Plan—Subject to Change

The following describes each planned event at a high level. Further details and changes will occur during final planning by the committee or sub-committee in charge of the event. Budgets have been estimated based on last year's expenditures and revenue. Some events have been eliminated due to lack of participation or they were merged with something else.

- **Dooley Park Cruise-In** This event will be held on the first Saturday in June in Dooley Park from 3 7 pm. There will be no rainout date.
- Village Cleanup Day This event will be held on the first Saturday in June each year. We hope to have containers for garbage, recycle, electronics, batteries, tires (extra fee). Home pick up can be arranged for a donation.
- Freedom Run The Freedom Run will be held June 28 (Saturday before July 4) and is a 5K Run, 1 Mile Walk & Kids Fun Run. Event will start and end at the Tri-Valley Middle School & High School. See Facebook/Meta for more information.
- **4th of July** This event will be the first of two large events for the Village. This year will be a one-day event.
- **Creepy Car Cruise-In** This event will be held the first Saturday in October at Dooley Park from 3 7 pm. There will be no rainout date.
- **Downs Haunted House** This event will be the second of the two large events. This event will be every Friday and Saturday in October until Halloween. The Un-Haunted House for kids will be on the last Sunday in October.
- Cookies with Santa This very popular family-oriented event providing free picture(s) with Santa for the family and/or kids, cookies, and drinks.
