From the Desk of the Mayor

In the month of September, we all enjoyed clear and great water! The water plant has performed fantastically and automated during the last month. The contractors are finalizing the removal of the old system and wrapping up the final changes. We will still have punch list items, but hopefully, the work in the plant will be complete before year-end. We hope to perform a ribbon cutting and open house for the residents to get insights into the new plant. Softening continues around the 60% level as we stabilize chlorine, fluoride and phosphate injection requirements of the IEPA.

What do you need in your home? This is a personal choice because taste to everyone varies. However, we do highly recommend a whole house filter to "catch" any sediment coming into your home. I and others have bypassed our water softener. I don't have RO but do have a refrigerator filter and I drink the water from both now. Again, your preference may be different, and it is up to you if you keep using those expensive items.

The next question has been how much will the water rates increase? Right now, we can't answer that because we don't have enough data on the plant running. We have stated all along we will try to stay close to the survey number of \$15-17 / month. We will continue to meet and discuss this change and how best to recommend to the Board for implementation.

I apologize for not being able to do the Mayor Monday discussion due to work obligation. I will continue to be available each Monday before the Village Board Meeting (6 - 7pm @ Viking Brew). The goal is to provide a time for me to listen, be open and approachable without the formality of a stuffy meeting or public hearing. I hope you can take advantage of this monthly scheduled time. If you can't make it and have something to discuss, please reach out for a one -on-one time to meet.



Village Of Downs From the Desk of the Mayor

Downs project updates:

- 1) The new water plant is 100% operational. Deconstruction of the old plant inner workings is about 95% completed. I hope all work will be completed before the end of October but will likely spill into November.
- 2) Downs Crossing Tower and watermain extension. The pressure reducing stations now have power and we are waiting for the booster station to be powered (needed extra parts). Pressure tests are completed, and we must pass IEPA required tests. The tower will be filled and tested once the water main has been given the green light. Hopefully we will be operational by November.
- 3) Our streetscape project is progressing very well. Striping and signage are complete, and lighting is being installed as I write this update. Hopefully power poles will be removed this week as well. The Board discussed adding a "top cap" to "sitting walls". We are pursuing doing this work on our own with left over funds. I don't know if we will get the planters done this fall or not (hope they do). We are waiting for examples of the proposed plants from the contractor.
- 4) Illinois Senator Sally Turner secured a \$20k grant for Downs last year and we are using this grant to complete the sidewalks on the southside of W. Main St from Seminary to Price St which are a part of Phase II of the streetscape project. Knapp was the only contractor to bid on this project, and the price was \$43k. The village will use its employees to do some of the work on this project to get the price closer to \$20k. This work will be completed this fall as well.
- 5) Colleen Ln and S Lincoln St Road improvements got delayed but are starting to ramp up as I write this update. This project is being done by Roanoke Concrete and Stark and will widen and concrete this road. The Village will take the opportunity to upgrade old culverts during this work.

Village of Downs Board of Trustees Meeting Overview October 9th, 2025, 7 pm @ Village Hall & via ZOOM

Executive order 2021-9 by the Governor of Illinois allowed this meeting to be held via Zoom, telephone and at the Village Hall.

- 1. Mayor Mike James called the October 9, 2025, meeting to order at 7:03 p.m.
- 2. Roll Call was taken. Trustees present were Maureen Roach, Diana Reynolds, Stephanie Adkisson, Sarah Gassaway, and Brian Warfel. Trustee Toby Twyford was absent. There was a quorum present. Also present were Mayor Mike James, Clerk Rachel Eagles, Treasurer Julie Bakewell, and Village Attorney Dawn Wall.
- 3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
- 4. Reports can be found in the flyer.
- 5. Public Comment –public comments were received via email and were read and answered.
- 6. The board heard several updates and reports regarding ongoing infrastructure projects. Engineer Greg Crowe reported that the water plant project is nearly complete, the Downtown Streetscape project is progressing with final work on street lighting and markings, and the Downs Crossing water main extension is nearing startup. Additional updates included plans for the S. Lincoln and Colleen Lane road project, sidewalk construction on West Main Street, and submission of the Safe Routes to School grant. Mayor James announced that board meetings will move from Zoom to Microsoft Teams beginning next month. The board entered Executive Session twice for TIF Agreements and Potential Litigation.
- 7. A Motion to Continue the Village of Downs Regular Board of Trustees Meeting on October 23, 2025, at 7 p.m. at the Village Hall was made and approved.

Billing Billing Questions, Issues, and Payments

All questions regarding billing issues including payment arrangements need to be directed to the Village Hall at 309-378-3221 during office hours. Monday - Friday, 8:30am - 12:30pm.


REMINDER: The billing due date is the **15th of the month**. Payments received after the 15th are subject to the late fees. If not paid by the 25th of the month, and the office has to call you regarding payment, there will be an additional fee of \$20. If not paid on the 26th, shut off of water can occur. To reconnect, there is a additional fee of \$30.

The Village is using an **ACH** (automatic withdrawal) program. This program has NO FEE to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15th of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted to the Billing Office by the 1st of the month you wish your first payment withdrawal to be made.

Reminder: If an ACH comes back as NSF it is treated like a check, and cash or money order is needed to cover the \$25 NSF fee + the amount of the bill. A 2nd NSF will result in no longer being eligible for ACH and all payments will need to be in cash or a money order. Please put your <u>service id</u> on your payment.

Water Sewer report for September 2025.

The average iron concentration for the finished water was .05 ppm. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished, and distribution samples were all satisfactory; fluoride concentration was .5. The volume of water pumped in September was 3.334 million gallons, averaging 111,113 gallons per day. The sewer lift station pumped 1.831 million gallons for the month, averaging 61,040 million gallons per day.

Water meters/transmitters replacement changeout continues. We will be contacting you in the future to schedule a time when our team can replace the old units with updated versions. This will be at no cost to the homeowner as it is Village Property.

Please continue to be cautious of our Village workers and all the new construction workers who are out and about. We want to make sure the Village is safe for the residents, visitors and ourselves.

The Public Works department would like to welcome Jon Bettisch and Ryan Lee to our team. Jon has been a local resident for years and was involved with the Haunted House back in the day. With his knowledge of the Village and residents he's quickly learning what the Public Works handles and doing a great job. Ryan comes to us from Heyworth where he recently worked for Adkisson Construction for the past 4 years. Ryans background includes building, concrete, maintenance among many other skills. Final Monthly Brush Pickup November 2025

If the designated Monday pickup is not favorable, we will pick up on the next nice day following that Monday. The following are the rules we will follow with no exceptions.

- Items to be picked up must be burnable and free from all nails, screws, and metal (ex: Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- Leaves must be bagged.
- All items must be within the Village right away on curb, driveway or as close to the road as
 possible without creating a hazard in the road. (Note: Since we use a backhoe, in most
 cases, to do this work, we DO NOT want to tear up or rut yards or ditches. If we can't
 reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up.
- If you know you will have a larger than normal pile, please contact the office so they can make the streets department aware.

Please note that there is NO BURNING in the ditches or on the road. Doing this causes clogging and backup in the ditches and culverts. It can also damage the road surface causing us to spend what little tax dollars we have, to fix these issues.

Illegal Dumping

Please do not dump yard waste and ANY other items at the entrances to Kickapoo Park, Village storage yard, and/or along Huff Rd South of Main St. Violators will be caught and fined accordingly!

Permit Required

Door-to-door solicitation permits are needed PRIOR to doing solicitation door-to-door. No warnings will be granted. Please report anyone that does not have a permit to come to your door. Please try and get their name and car make/model/color. Solicitors without a permit will be fined.

Sample of items not taken - electronics, appliance with a compressor, batteries, landscaping material, bricks, block, construction material. Recycling Guidelines

Passed down from our Local Pickup Crew:

- Label recycling with the word Recycle or the Recycle Symbol.
- Place recycling well separated from trash. For example: Place your containers on separate sides at the end of your driveway.

Following the above guidelines will help our Recycle and Trash crews pickup the correct items and not leave some behind.







All Building Permits

All Building and Demolition Permit Applications must be processed, approved, and issued a permit number, BEFORE WORK CAN BEGIN. This includes small projects, renovations, and new builds which could take up to 2 weeks to process. Please leave enough time before working on your project.

FY2026 (May 2025 – April 2026) Village of Downs Event Plan Current Plan—Subject to Change

The following describes each planned event at a high level. Further details and changes will occur during final planning by the committee or sub-committee in charge of the event. Budgets have been estimated based on last year's expenditures and revenue. Some events have been eliminated due to lack of participation or they were merged with something else.

- **Dooley Park Cruise-In** This event will be held on the first Saturday in June in Dooley Park from 3 7 pm. There will be no rainout date.
- Village Cleanup Day This event will be held on the first Saturday in June each year. We hope to have containers for garbage, recycle, electronics, batteries, tires (extra fee). Home pick up can be arranged for a donation.
- Freedom Run The Freedom Run will be held June 28 (Saturday before July 4) and is a 5K Run, 1 Mile Walk & Kids Fun Run. Event will start and end at the Tri-Valley Middle School & High School. See Facebook/Meta for more information.
- **4th of July** This event will be the first of two large events for the Village. This year will be a one-day event.
- **Creepy Car Cruise-In** This event will be held the first Saturday in October at Dooley Park from 3 7 pm. There will be no rainout date.
