## From the Desk of the Mayor

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### PLEASE TURN OFF YOUR WATER SOFTENER!

Water softeners are no longer needed and can be harmful to your pipes within your home if you over soften the water. We are currently at 70% and will be increasing over the next month to our target of 75-80%. You do not want to be at 90%+ softened water.

The water plant continues to perform as expected. The contractors are working on punch list items and will complete as it makes sense. We hope to perform a ribbon cutting and open house for the residents to get insights into the new plant – Probably in the Spring when the weather is nice.

What do you need in your home? We highly recommend a whole house filter to “catch” any sediment coming into your home. Personal choice in taste of the water varies for everyone. If you choose to have an RO system that will be based on that taste and personal concerns. For reference, I don’t have RO but do have a refrigerator filter.

The next question has been how much will the water rates increase? We are finalizing that rate increase but still anticipate a rate increase under \$20 in December/January. We will continue to meet and discuss this change and how best to recommend to the Board for implementation.

Mayor Monday continued this month, but I will probably suspend during the winter. I will be available the Monday before the Village Board Meeting (6 - 7pm @ Viking Brew) in December. The goal is to provide a time for me to listen, be open and approachable without the formality of a stuffy meeting or public hearing. I hope you can take advantage of this monthly scheduled time. If you can’t make it and have something to discuss, please reach out for a one-on-one time to meet.



### Downs project updates:

- 1) The new water plant is 100% operational and a punch list is being completed.
- 2) Downs Crossing Tower and watermain extension. Testing on the water main has been completed, and we have one more test to pass. Once completed they will fill the tower and perform testing on it. Final punch list items are being worked on for this project as well.
- 3) Streetscape project is complete except for a punch list and final lighting of the poles and bollards. We anticipate them being “turned on” next week sometime. Fingers crossed. We are putting a limestone cap on the walls and then all the railings can be installed.
- 4) The sidewalk project has been completed from Seminary to Price St on the southside of Main St.
- 5) Colleen Ln concrete road has been completed to the corner of S. Lincoln St. Due to weather S. Lincoln St. Road improvements will be pushed to the Spring or when weather allows.

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## Village Snow & Ice Removal

### **Please Help us Make Plowing Easier, Safer, and more Efficient**

The Village doesn't have a snow parking ban law, and we prefer not to create one because we know we can rely on YOUR assistance and cooperation to help make our job easier. The following outlines our procedures and will be adjusted as needed:

We will usually precede each storm with salting intersections, hills, curves, and trouble areas. Snow removal will start at ~2" and will focus on getting one pass through all streets and keeping them open, until snow stops. Cars parked along the side of the roads will slow this process down and you may end up with a lot of snow around it. Please help us by parking your car(s) preferably in your own driveway, during storms where we are expecting 4"+ of snow and/or high winds. Once removal is completed and the snow has stopped, we will come back through to widen, cleanup and spread salt.



## Village of Downs Board of Trustees Meeting Overview November 13<sup>th</sup>, 2025, 7 pm @ Village Hall & via TEAMS

Executive order **2021-9** by the Governor of Illinois allowed this meeting to be held via Zoom, telephone and at the Village Hall.

1. Mayor Mike James called the November 13, 2025, meeting to order at 7:13 p.m.
2. Roll Call was taken. Trustees present were Maureen Roach, Diana Reynolds, Stephanie Adkisson, Sarah Gassaway, Brian Warfel and Toby Twyford. There was a quorum present. Also present were Mayor Mike James, Clerk Rachel Eagles, Treasurer Julie Bakewell, and Village Attorney Dawn Wall.
3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
4. Reports from specific departments can be found in the flyer.
5. The board reviewed rezoning recommendations from the Zoning Board of Appeals.
6. Public Comment –Public comment included a presentation from Kailey Gassaway regarding the Village’s Tri-Valley yearbook ad.
7. The board heard several updates and reports from MSA engineers regarding ongoing infrastructure projects. Reports from Village engineers highlighted progress on several major projects: final steps on the Water Plant Improvements, near completion of the Downtown Streetscape Project, ongoing work on the Downs Crossing water-main extension and new water tower site, recent road progress on S. Lincoln and Colleen Lane, and completion of the West Main Street sidewalk.
8. The Safe Routes to School grant application has been submitted by MSA on our behalf, and the Village awaits a decision.
9. The Board also held an Executive Session to discuss development and annexation matters before adjourning for the evening at 10:56 p.m.

### Notary Signed Letters Due January 31st

Letters have been mailed to property owners within the Village of Downs along with a petition of annexation and a signature page. All property owners will need to submit the signed signature page that has to be notarized. You can have the paperwork notarized by a notary of your choice or call the Village Hall at 309-378-3221 to arrange a time.

## Billing

### Billing Questions, Issues, and Payments

All questions regarding billing issues including payment arrangements need to be directed to the Village Hall at 309-378-3221 during office hours. Monday - Friday, 8:30am - 12:30pm.

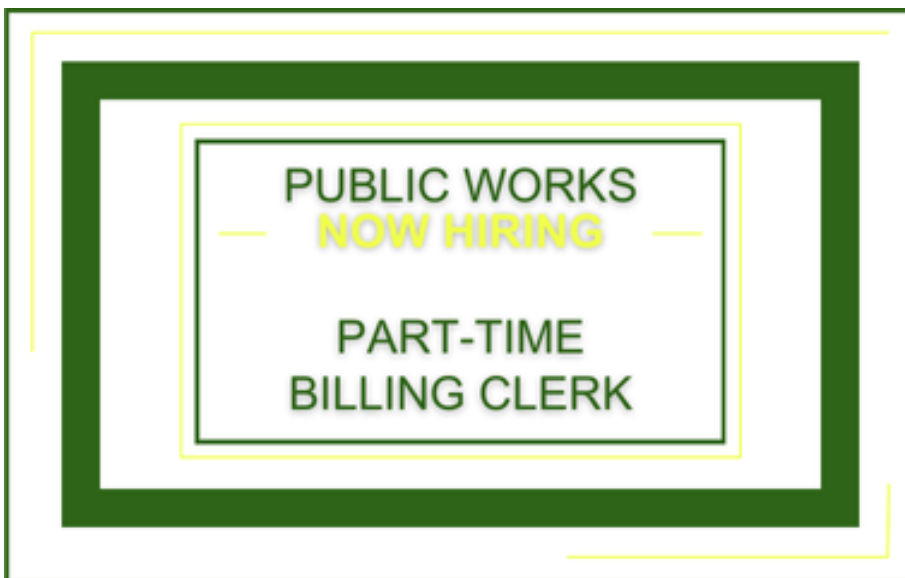
**REMINDER:** The billing due date is the **15th of the month**. Payments received after the 15th are subject to the late fees. If not paid by the 25th of the month, and the office has to call you regarding payment, there will be an additional fee of \$20. If not paid on the 26th, shut off of water can occur. To reconnect, there is a additional fee of \$30.

The Village is using an **ACH** (automatic withdrawal) program. This program has NO FEE to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15th of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted to the Billing Office by the 1st of the month you wish your first payment withdrawal to be made.

**Reminder:** If an ACH comes back as NSF it is treated like a check, and cash or money order is needed to cover the \$25 NSF fee + the amount of the bill. A 2nd NSF will result in no longer being eligible for ACH and all payments will need to be in cash or a money order. Please put your service id on your payment.

### Water Sewer report for October 2025.

The average iron concentration for the finished water was **.04** ppm. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished, and distribution samples were all satisfactory; fluoride concentration was **.5**. The volume of water pumped for the month was **3.038** million gallons, averaging **98,000** gallons per day. The sewer lift station pumped **1.806** million gallons for the month, averaging **58,258** million gallons per day.

The new water plants' softening level is down to what we believe is an ideal level. Any additional water softening is **not necessary**, but that is the homeowner's decision to make. For example, currently our water is being softened to 80 parts per million which is also 4.67 gpg (grains per gallon).

Water meters/transmitters replacement changeout continues. If you have one of the older models, we will be contacting you in the future to schedule a time to replace the old units with updated versions. This will be at no cost to the homeowner as it is Village Property.

This has been another busy season for the streets/public works departments. I want to thank my team for the job they do every day to help continue to make Downs a great place to live and work. When you see Caleb, Ryan, and Jon out and about, let them know you appreciate their dedication.



Please continue to be cautious of our Village workers. We want to make sure the Village is safe for the residents, visitors and ourselves.

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## Bonus Monthly Brush Pickup

### December 2025

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If the designated Monday pickup is not favorable, we will pick up on the next nice day following that Monday. The following are the rules we will follow with no exceptions.

- Items to be picked up must be burnable and free from all nails, screws, and metal (ex: Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- **Leaves must be bagged.**
- All items must be within the Village right away on curb, driveway or as close to the road as possible without creating a hazard in the road. (Note: Since we use a backhoe, in most cases, to do this work, we DO NOT want to tear up or rut yards or ditches. If we can't reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up.
- If you know you will have a larger than normal pile, please contact the office so they can make the streets department aware.

Please note that there is NO BURNING in the ditches or on the road. Doing this causes clogging and backup in the ditches and culverts. It can also damage the road surface causing us to spend what little tax dollars we have, to fix these issues.

### **Illegal Dumping**

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Please do not dump yard waste and ANY other items at the entrances to Kickapoo Park, Village storage yard, and/or along Huff Rd South of Main St. Violators will be caught and fined accordingly!

### **Dumpster Use**

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Please remember, Dumpsters at residences, businesses, and parks are private and not for public use. If you have a need for a dumpster you can call GFL customer service at 309-688-0760 to order one.

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## Door-to-Door Sales

### **Permit Required**

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Door-to-door solicitation permits are needed PRIOR to doing solicitation door-to-door. No warnings will be granted. Please report anyone that does not have a permit to come to your door. Please try and get their name and car make/model/color. Solicitors without a permit will be fined.



## GFL Environmental

### **Bulk Pickup—First Garbage Day Pickup of the Month**

Do not forget that the first garbage pickup of each month is our contracted bulk waste pickup for the Village. If you have a large item or a lot, please call GFL customer service prior to the scheduled pickup. Sample of items not taken - electronics, appliance with a compressor, batteries, landscaping material, bricks, block, construction material. If you have questions call GFL customer service at 309-688-0760.

### **Recycling Guidelines**

Passed down from our Local Pickup Crew:

- Label recycling with the word Recycle or the Recycle Symbol.
- Place recycling well separated from trash. For example: Place your containers on separate sides at the end of your driveway.

Following the above guidelines will help our Recycle and Trash crews pickup the correct items and not leave some behind.

This includes small projects, renovations, and new builds which could take up to 2 weeks to process. Please leave enough time before working on your project.

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## FY2026 (May 2025 – April 2026) Village of Downs Event Plan

### Current Plan—Subject to Change

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The following describes each planned event at a high level. Further details and changes will occur during final planning by the committee or sub-committee in charge of the event. Budgets have been estimated based on last year's expenditures and revenue. Some events have been eliminated due to lack of participation or they were merged with something else.

**Dooley Park Cruise-In** – This event will be held on the first Saturday in June in Dooley Park from 3 – 7 pm. There will be no rainout date.

**Village Cleanup Day** – This event will be held on the first Saturday in June each year. We hope to have containers for garbage, recycle, electronics, batteries, tires (extra fee). Home pick up can be arranged for a donation.

**Freedom Run** – The Freedom Run will be held June 28 (Saturday before July 4) and is a 5K Run, 1 Mile Walk & Kids Fun Run. Event will start and end at the Tri-Valley Middle School & High School. See Facebook/Meta for more information.
