From the Desk of the Mayor

YOU MUST TURN OFF YOUR WATER SOFTENER!

Water softeners are no longer needed and can be harmful to your pipes within your home if you over soften the water. Vendors will try to convince you otherwise and that is their job. But will they give you a guarantee that you will not have leaks AND will cover your damages if it does happen? You do not want or need to be at 90%+ softened water. If they run tests and tell otherwise, please report to the Village Hall. We can also test your water without the bias of wanting to sell you something.

What do you need in your home? We highly recommend a whole house filter to "catch" any sediment coming into your home as the distribution pipes still have sediment. Personal choice in taste of the water varies for everyone. If you choose to have an RO system that will be based on that taste and personal concerns/needs.

We are actively working on a design and budget for a new Village Hall. We have outgrown our current building and have been overcrowded for many years. The new building will be located by the Police department and will be large enough for future expansion. It will adequately and properly provide workspace for our staff, Board, Clerk and Mayor. It will have a better way to drive up to drop off payments at the building. Once we have more details we will put them out to the public for feedback.

Mayor Monday is suspended until Spring.

Downs project updates:

- 1) Contractors are working on water plant punch list items. We will have an open house in the spring.
- 2) Downs Crossing Tower and watermain extension. Water main to Downs Crossing has been permitted by IEPA. Final punch list items are being worked on until weather allows us to do final testing to bring it online.

- 3) Streetscape project is complete except for punch list items. Lights look amazing and provide a nice welcome to Downs. Supplier issues have delayed the wall cap, but the west side has been completed. We will add trash cans, seating, picnic tables and potentially a pergola to create inviting outdoor spaces in the spring.
- 4) Due to weather S. Lincoln St Road improvements will be pushed to the spring or when weather allows.
- 5) Village Hall: Update above.
- 6) Solar: The board is also considering solar panels on the Les Fitzwater PW building to reduce the cost of electricity for the new water plant. The options being considered could offset costs by 20-40% depending on the option.

Village of Downs Board of Trustees Meeting Overview January 8th, 2025, 7 pm @ Village Hall & via TEAMS

Executive order **2021-9** by the Governor of Illinois allowed this meeting to be held via TEAMS and at the Village Hall.

1. Mayor Mike James called the January 8, 2026, meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
2. Trustees present were Maureen Roach, Diana Reynolds, Stephanie Adkisson, Sarah Gassaway, Brian Warfel and Toby Twyford. There was a quorum present. Also present were Mayor Mike James, Clerk Rachel Eagles, Treasurer Julie Bakewell, and Village Attorney Dawn Wall.
3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
4. Engineers provided updates on the ongoing infrastructure and development projects. They reported that the Downs Water Plant Improvements and the Downtown Streetscape are nearing completion, with final punch list items underway. The Downs Crossing water-main extension project is also progressing, with telemetry now functioning properly and plans to begin filling the new water tank once weather conditions allow, likely by late winter. The Board was also informed that the Village is awaiting word from IDOT regarding a Safe Routes to School sidewalk grant.
5. Mayor James shared updates on planning for a potential new Village Hall, including a draft layout and proposed location near the police department, followed by a discussion on site access and design considerations. Trustees provided department reports, noting early planning for Fourth of July festivities, upcoming parks discussions, and continued coordination on recycling and waste services. The Treasurer reported positive financial news with the payoff of two major equipment loans and encouraged early preparation for the upcoming budget planning season. Public comment was received via email, and the meeting concluded with no executive session held.

Permit Required

Door-to-door solicitation permits are needed PRIOR to doing solicitation door-to-door. No warnings will be granted. Please report anyone that does not have a permit to come to your door. Please try and get their name and car make/model/color. Solicitors without a permit will be fined.



Billing Billing Questions, Issues, and Payments

All questions regarding billing issues including payment arrangements need to be directed to the Village Hall at 309-378-3221 during office hours. Monday - Friday, 8:30am - 12:30pm.

REMINDER: *The billing due date is the 15th of the month. Payments received after the 15th are subject to the late fees. If not paid by the 25th of the month, and the office has to call you regarding payment, there will be an additional fee of \$20. If not paid on the 26th, shut off of water can occur. To reconnect, there is a additional fee of \$30.*

The Village is using an **ACH** (automatic withdrawal) program. This program has **NO FEE** to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15th of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted to the Billing Office by the 1st of the month you wish your first payment withdrawal to be made.

Reminder: If an ACH comes back as NSF it is treated like a check, and cash or money order is needed to cover the \$25 NSF fee + the amount of the bill. A 2nd NSF will result in no longer being eligible for ACH and all payments will need to be in cash or a money order. Please put your service id on your payment.

Billing Rates Increase Reminder January Bill 2026

Several changes have happened to the water billing rates for the January bill. At the end of 2024 we raised the debt service rate to help pay for the new plant loan to the minimum the IEPA would accept at that time. We have now raised it to include the new water tower. The water (OMR) and Capital Improvement rates have not been increased since 2009. Now that the new plant is completed and producing better quality water, we have raised the water rates to cover the actual cost of producing/treating/delivering the water. We have raised the Capital Improvement rates to better cover the actual costs due to inflation. See the chart below to compare the previous rates with the new rates.

Water Sewer report for December 2025.

The average iron concentration for the finished water was **.03** ppm. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished, and distribution samples were all satisfactory; fluoride concentration was **.5**. The volume of water pumped for the month was **2.433** million gallons, averaging **78,483** gallons per day. The sewer lift station pumped **1.885** million gallons for the month, averaging **60,832** million gallons per day.

Village Snow & Ice Removal

Please Help us Make Plowing Easier, Safer, and more Efficient

The Village doesn't have a snow parking ban law, and we prefer not to create one because we know we can rely on YOUR assistance and cooperation to help make our job easier. The following outlines our procedures and will be adjusted as needed:

We will usually precede each storm with salting intersections, hills, curves, and trouble areas. Snow removal will start at ~2" and will focus on getting one pass through all streets and keeping them open, until snow stops. Cars parked along the side of the roads will slow this process down and you may end up with a lot of snow around it. Please help us by parking your car(s) preferably in your own driveway, during storms where we are expecting 4" of snow and/or high winds. Once removal is completed and the snow has stopped, we will come back through to widen, cleanup and spread salt.

Dumpster Use

Please remember, Dumpsters at residences, businesses, and parks are private and not for public use. If you have a need for a dumpster you can call GFL customer service at 309-688-0760 to order one.

Recycling Guidelines

Passed down from our Local Pickup Crew:

- Label recycling with the word Recycle or the Recycle Symbol.
- Place recycling well separated from trash. For example: Place your containers on separate sides at the end of your driveway.

Following the above guidelines will help our Recycle and Trash crews pickup the correct items and not leave some behind.
