From the Desk of the Mayor – June 2026

This month we had a special presentation from Clayton Adkisson making a case for being Jr Mayor or Mini Mayor as he affectionately calls it. Clayton started at 8 years old volunteering for the Village and has logged over 160 hours. I would like to congratulate Clayton as our Jr Mayor until May 2027, the end of my term.

We are continuing to pursue a solar array to offset the electrical consumption of our building and especially our water plant. We continue to find ways to decrease costs at the water plant to keep rate increases as low as possible. Unfortunately, we will need to adjust rates again shortly (probably July). The water rates had not been raised since 2009 when we raised them the first time December 2025 as required by the IEPA. We raised the rates, increased debt service, and lowered the base water amount from 3000 to 2000. We attempted to calculate what the new rates needed to be without much data from the water plant however, that amount wasn't enough.

Last month, I put a halt on the plan to move forward with the Village Hall using Morton and MDF to get competing quotes as I felt the proposal was too high. We got 4 new quotes and will now be moving forward with Illinois Valley Construction. Consideration has been given to the other locations and ideas suggested. To keep costs low we plan to move forward with the planned building location.

We have signed contracts with MSA for design of the sidewalks for the Safe Routes to School grant project. We are excited to finally get this grant and look forward to getting this project rolling and have it completed so it can be completed by the fall.

We haven't received any information about the grant request for phase II of the streetscape project.

Kickapoo Creek Estates Subdivision developer's agreement was approved but the Board wanted more discussion on the variance request. Diana Reynolds will reach out to the FD and School for feedback on the cul-de-sac size variance.



We approved a company to overhaul our website. This website has served us since 2010 or 2011. I appreciate Michele's work on finding this company and look forward to the new capabilities and look it will provide for village residents.

Downs project updates:

1. Plant is operating as expected with glitches here and there but overall, everything has gone well. Contractors are working on water plant punch list items. We will have an open house in the late July or August.
2. Downs Crossing Tower and watermain extension are operational and they are working on final punch list items and operation tweaks.
3. The streetscape project is complete. We are getting a damaged wall cap replaced and the final items will be trash cans, seating, picnic tables and potentially pergola to create inviting outdoor space in the spring.
4. Roanoke has completed the promised road upgrades on S Lincoln St and Colleen Lane. Final tweaks may need to be made.
5. Village Hall: Update above.
6. Solar: The board is also considering solar panels at the Les Fitzwater PW building to reduce the cost of electricity for the new water plant. The option being considered could offset electrical costs by up to 90% for all village buildings.

Village of Downs Board of Trustees Meeting Overview

June 11th, 2026, 7 pm @ Village Hall & via TEAMS

Executive order 2021-9 by the Governor of Illinois allowed this meeting to be held via TEAMS and at the Village Hall.

1. Mayor Mike James called the June 11, 2026, Village of Downs Board of Trustees Regular Meeting to Order at 7:17 p.m.
2. Trustees present were Maureen Roach, Diana Reynolds, Stephanie Adkisson, Sarah Gassaway, and Toby Twyford. Trustee absent was Brian Warfel. There was a quorum present. Also present were Mayor Mike James, Clerk Rachel Eagles, Treasurer Julie Bakewell, and Village Attorney Dawn Wall.
3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
4. The Village Board received updates on several ongoing projects and community initiatives during its June meeting. Progress continues on the Water Plant Improvements project, with final warranty items and repairs being addressed. The Downtown Streetscape and Parking Lots Project is nearing completion, with final grading and reseeding underway and remaining funds available for finishing touches. Residents can also look forward to a future open house at the new water treatment facility later this year.
5. Planning is also moving forward for the Safe Routes to School project, including engineering and environmental review work. Discussion was held regarding a proposed subdivision variance request involving cul-de-sac dimensions, with additional input being sought from local emergency services and the school district before any board decisions are made.
6. Preparations are well underway for the Village of Downs Fourth of July celebration, including event planning, park improvements, and increased public safety coverage.
7. The Board also discussed updates to employee handbook policies to comply with recent Illinois legislation, ongoing financial and audit activities, and a potential solar energy project that could reduce future water plant utility costs.
8. Additional discussion focused on options for a future Village Hall facility, with further research being conducted on design, cost, and location considerations.
9. Department reports were presented with important updates.
10. The meeting adjourned at 9:58 p.m.

Water Sewer Report for May 2026.

The average iron concentration for the finished water was **.03** ppm. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished, and distribution samples were all satisfactory; fluoride concentration was **.70**. The volume of water pumped for the month was **3.187** million gallons, averaging **102,806** gallons per day. The sewer lift station pumped **3.536** million gallons for the month, averaging **114,077** gallons per day.

The Water Department continues to show well-balanced testing results with an “A” grade quality. We’re continuing water analysis in the four quadrants of the Village with the same test results and grade. This is excellent news for the Village and residents.

Billing

Billing Questions, Issues, and Payments

All questions regarding billing issues including payment arrangements need to be directed to the Village Hall at 309-378-3221 during office hours. Monday - Friday, 8:30am - 12:30pm.

REMINDER: *The billing due date is the **15th of the month**. Payments received after the 15th are subject to the late fees. If not paid by the 25th of the month, and the office has to call you regarding payment, there will be an additional fee of \$20. If not paid on the 26th, shut off of water can occur. To reconnect, there is a additional fee of \$30.*

The Village is using an **ACH** (automatic withdrawal) program. This program has NO FEE to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15th of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted to the Billing Office by the 1st of the month you wish your first payment withdrawal to be made.

Reminder: If an ACH comes back as NSF it is treated like a check, and cash or money order is needed to cover the \$25 NSF fee + the amount of the bill. A 2nd NSF will result in no longer being eligible for ACH and all payments will need to be in cash or a money order. Please put your service id on your payment.

Email billing is going well. Thank you to everyone participating. The Village is saving postage, cost of forms, and labor by using email billing.

Be sure to check your emails each month for your bill. Should you wish to continue to receive a printed bill, please let the office know.

Golf Cart/Utility Terrain Vehicle Permit Reminder

Due date was May 30th

If you haven't already obtained your 2026 permit, your current permit has expired, and you need to apply for a new one. To reapply (or apply) submit your completed application, copy of Insurance and Driver's License(s) and \$60 fee at the Village Hall. Application forms are available on the website or at the Village Hall. You can submit your packet during open hours or using the after-hours drop box. Once your application has been filed with the hall, you can contact the police department at 309-622-2207 to schedule an inspection. You will receive the permit upon passing the inspection.

You will need to schedule an appointment for an inspection immediately. Nonpermitted golf cart owners with no inspection scheduled are subject to a fine of no less than \$75. (Chapter 8, Article X Sections 1-5)



PUBLIC SAFETY TIPS TO AVOID COMMON ORDINANCE VIOLATIONS!

With the completion of our beautiful new downtown streetscape, we want to keep our community clean, safe, and healthy.

Common ordinance violations that occur especially in the summer months are overgrown grass/weeds and garbage/refuse on the property. Tall grass/weeds and garbage/refuse are safety hazards and draw unwanted animals hiding within these conditions. You can avoid violations and fines by complying with ordinances. Here are common violations.

Weeds:

It is unlawful to permit any weeds, grass or plants other than trees, bushes, flowers or other ornamental plants to grow to a height exceeding twelve (12) inches anywhere in the Village (Chapter 16, Art. 1. Sec. 1).

Garbage/Refuse:

The owner, occupant or lessee of any premises shall remove from their premises or otherwise dispose of all garbage, ashes, debris, rubbish, refuse and trash, and shall keep the premises free and clear of any accumulation of such garbage and debris (Chapter 4, Article II, Sec. 4).

Speeding:

We've had a number of complaints about drivers' speeds. Please note that most speeds in the Village are 25 mph. With warmer weather there are more walkers, children riding bikes, dog walkers, and strollers on the roadways. We are increasing traffic enforcement. Follow the speed limits and avoid a ticket! Please slow down and keep our streets safe for everyone!

We have much to be proud of in our community! Let's work together to keep our community safe and healthy, and I wish everyone a fun summer!

Submit to the Village Hall

All Building and Demolition Permit Applications must be processed, approved, and issued a permit number, BEFORE WORK CAN BEGIN. This includes small projects, renovations, and new builds which could take up to 2 weeks to process. Please leave enough time before working on your project.

Do not forget that the first garbage pickup of each month is our contracted bulk waste pickup for the Village. If you have a large item or a lot, please call GFL customer service prior to the scheduled pickup. Sample of items not taken - electronics, appliance with a compressor, batteries, landscaping material, bricks, block, construction material. Recycling and Trash Guidelines

Passed down from our Local Pickup Crew:

- Label recycling with the word Recycle or the Recycle Symbol. **We have stickers in the office!**
- Place recycling well separated from trash. For example: Place your containers on separate sides at the end of your driveway.
- Place your cans with the lid opening towards the road.

Following the above guidelines will help our Recycle and Trash crews pickup the correct items and not leave some behind.

We apologize for any inconvenience or confusion this may cause. Due to a miscalculation by GFL Environmental, the garbage and recycling bins that had previously been offered to the Village are unfortunately no longer available. We appreciate your understanding and patience regarding this matter.



Monthly Brush Pickup

April thru November

Our debris pickup starts in April on the first Monday of the month. If the designated Monday pickup is not favorable, we will pick up on the next nice day following that Monday. The following are the rules we will follow with no exceptions:

- Items to be picked up must be burnable and free from all nails, screws, and metal (ex: Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- **Leaves must be bagged.**
- All items must be within the Village right away on curb, driveway or as close to the road as possible without creating a hazard in the road. (Note: Since we use a backhoe, in most cases, to do this work, we DO NOT want to tear up or rut yards or ditches. If we can't reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up.
- If you know you will have a larger than normal pile, please contact the office so they can make the streets department aware.
- **All items must be at your address. We do not pick up debris piles at unaddressed locations.**
- This is a courtesy service for our homeowners. Contractor debris must be hauled away by the contractor.

Illegal Dumping

Please do not dump yard waste and ANY other items at the entrances to Kickapoo Park, Village storage yard, and/or along Huff Rd South of Main St. Violators will be caught and fined accordingly!

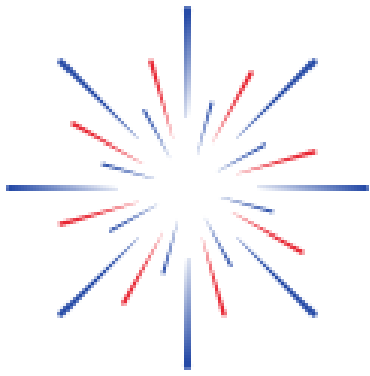
