### E-Bills

OK! Now that we got through the first subject, let's talk about e-billing! This past month was our first e-bill extravaganza. We had soooo many emails bounce back as undeliverable for all sorts of reasons. An entire day was spent on the phone trying to get those cleared up and resent to the correct addresses. Thank you to everyone for your cooperation on the phone while your current email was put into our system. There have been a few more popup over the month with corrections needed. If you would like to update your email or add a second email, call the office so your account can be updated. The next e-billing will be on March 31st with an updated Subject line of "Your Village of Downs E-bill". Hopefully the new subject line makes it look less Spammy.

### Other fun ebill related topics:

- You do not need to print your bill for our needs. Put your service ID on your payment and it will get to the right place! If you have several locations/accounts you can use your Account Number, which is actually a collection of letters. Feel free to call the Village Hall so things can get streamlined!

- Our first ebill pdf looked a bit off, so we had the company make a few tweaks here and there to improve how it looks. We did not change the overall design and placement, so it should look very similar to the previous printed bill.
- Switching to e-billing has many benefits. To name a few:
  - Less paper waste. It is great to reduce paper usage and save some trees.
  - Reducing post office dependency. There are about 10 calls each month from villagers who did not receive their paper bill. There also have been a years worth of bills returned as undeliverable for a couple different addresses in the past. Lately villagers have been receiving their bills later than they used to (or not at all) and the payments that are mailed have taken up to 3 weeks to get back to the village.
  - Money savings for the Village. Less ink is used for printing, less prepaid cardstock billing paper, less postage, less human hours.

## **GFL update**

Here is the update you have all been waiting for! The infamous free trash and recycle bin delivery debacle. The original GFL employee who made the original offer which we ran with, Has assured the village that they are still delivering these cans but had run into a couple obstacles.

First, the delivery truck they use is a light weight vehicle. Some of their vehicles are heavy weight and with the weight limit placed on the roads during the winter, the light weight vehicle had to takes its place. Therefore the delivery truck was unavailable for regular use. Now that the weight limit has been lifted, that truck is freed up for its regularly scheduled program. The second obstacle was employees. They needed more and perhaps still do. But they are training a new guy on our recycle route as well as whatever other routes they need him to do. Having more employees will mean they can send some of them to start the deliveries back up. Unfortunately, he did not have an ETA for me but there is hope. He is also supposed to drop off some recycle stickers at the office that can be placed on any cans that need it. When those are available, there will be an announcement on Facebook and the website for anyone interested in them.

To close this hijacking situation, thank you for all your patience as the ebill process is perfected and the GFL carts are delivered.

## Village of Downs Board of Trustees Meeting Overview

March 12th, 2026, 7 pm @ Village Hall & via TEAMS

Executive order 2021-9 by the Governor of Illinois allowed this meeting to be held via TEAMS and at the Village Hall.

1. Mayor Mike James called the March 12, 2026 Village of Downs Board of Trustees Regular Meeting to Order at 7:10 p.m.
2. Trustees present were Maureen Roach, Stephanie Adkisson, Sarah Gassaway, Brian Warfel, and Toby Twyford. Trustee absent was Diana Reynolds. There was a quorum present. Also present were Mayor Mike James, Clerk Rachel Eagles, Treasurer Julie Bakewell, and Village Attorney Dawn Wall.
3. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.
4. The board received updates on several infrastructure projects and community initiatives. The Downs Water Plant Improvements project is nearing completion, with final punch list items already addressed. Work on the Downtown Streetscape and Parking Lots project is largely complete, with minor remaining tasks. The Downs Crossing water-main extension has received final verbal approval from the Illinois EPA, and the new water tower is expected to be fully operational by late March or April. Village engineers also reported that planning for a potential Phase 2 downtown streetscape project has been submitted for possible congressional funding, and engineering plans are being finalized for a new Village Hall, with potential placement near the police building currently under consideration.
5. The board also continued discussions on the upcoming annual budget prep, including review of departmental needs and updates to employee benefit plans. The Mayor additionally encouraged trustees to consider long-term development goals for the Downs community, particularly future planning for the Downs Crossing area and other potential mixed-use development opportunities.
6. The meeting adjourned at 9:30 pm with no executive session this month.

## Billing

### Billing Questions, Issues, and Payments

All questions regarding billing issues including payment arrangements need to be directed to the Village Hall at 309-378-3221 during office hours. Monday - Friday, 8:30am - 12:30pm.

**REMINDER:** *The billing due date is the **15th of the month**. Payments received after the 15th are subject to the late fees. If not paid by the 25th of the month, and the office has to call you regarding payment, there will be an additional fee of \$20. If not paid on the 26th, shut off of water can occur. To reconnect, there is a additional fee of \$30.*

The Village is using an **ACH** (automatic withdrawal) program. This program has NO FEE to you! If you sign up for this program, you will continue to receive your monthly bill. On the 15th of the month, the Village will withdraw the entire amount due from the checking or savings account you provided on the authorization form. Authorization forms are on the website and will need to be submitted to the Billing Office by the 1st of the month you wish your first payment withdrawal to be made.

**Reminder:** If an ACH comes back as NSF it is treated like a check, and cash or money order is needed to cover the \$25 NSF fee + the amount of the bill. A 2nd NSF will result in no longer being eligible for ACH and all payments will need to be in cash or a money order. Please put your service id on your payment.

### E-Billing Began March 1st

Email billing went very well for the March billing. Thank you to everyone for your patience with us as we use this new method. The Village is saving, postage, cost of forms and labor by using the email billing.

Be sure to check your emails each month for your bill. Should you wish to continue to receive a printed bill, please let the office know.

### Water Sewer Report for February 2026

The average iron concentration for the finished water was **.04** ppm. Monthly bacteriological testing on the raw, finished, and distribution samples were all satisfactory; fluoride concentration was **.7**. The volume of water pumped for the month was **2.649** million gallons, averaging **94,607** gallons per day. The sewer lift station pumped **1.822** million gallons for the month, averaging **65,100** million gallons per day.

- 5 outdated water meters/transmitters replaced with updated units
- 2 Water leaks repaired
- 6 Curb Stop repair
- 10 JULIE tickets within Village
  - 2 Streets/Water Department
  - 8 outside companies (2 were extended ticket, need to remark)
- 6 JULIE tickets outside Village (0 were extended tickets, no need to remark)

The Water Department has been running water quality tests at the water plant, that have shown a well-balanced result with an “A” grade quality. Additionally, we have performed water analysis in all four quadrants of the Village with the same test results and grade. This is excellent news for the Village and residents.

## Monthly Brush Pickup

April thru November

Our debris pickup starts in April on the first Monday of the month. If the designated Monday pickup is not favorable, we will pick up on the next nice day following that Monday. The following are the rules we will follow with no exceptions:

- Items to be picked up must be burnable and free from all nails, screws, and metal (ex: Leaves, sticks, brush, branches, etc.)
- **Leaves must be bagged.**
- All items must be within the Village right away on curb, driveway or as close to the road as possible without creating a hazard in the road. (Note: Since we use a backhoe, in most cases, to do this work, we DO NOT want to tear up or rut yards or ditches. If we can't reach the debris from the road or a driveway, we WILL NOT pick it up.)
- If you know you will have a larger than normal pile, please contact the office so they can make the streets department aware.

Please note that there is NO BURNING in the ditches or on the road. Doing this causes clogging and backup in the ditches and culverts. It can also damage the road surface causing us to spend what little tax dollars we have, to fix these issues.

Bulk Pickup—First Garbage Day Pickup of the Month

Do not forget that the first garbage pickup of each month is our contracted bulk waste pickup for the Village. If you have a large item or a lot, please call GFL customer service prior to the scheduled pickup. Sample of items not taken - electronics, appliance with a compressor, batteries, landscaping material, bricks, block, construction material. ## Recycling and Trash Guidelines

Passed down from our Local Pickup Crew:

- Label recycling with the word Recycle or the Recycle Symbol.
- Place recycling well separated from trash. For example: Place your containers on separate sides at the end of your driveway.
- Place your cans with the lid opening towards the road.

Following the above guidelines will help our Recycle and Trash crews pickup the correct items and not leave some behind.

### GOLF CART and UTILITY TERRAIN VEHICLE PERMIT RENEWAL TIME



It's almost that time again to renew permits as the year runs from May 1st through April 30th. The Board approved two permit changes for the upcoming year. The yearly permit fee will increase to \$60. In addition, drivers must be at least 16 and possess a valid Illinois driver's license. Please see all the policies in Chapter 8 on the Village website for the requirements to operate and obtain a permit and other safety guidelines. An application, copy of Drivers License and Insurance card, along with payment must be submitted to the Village Hall before an inspection can be done. Vehicle must be inspected by the police department to receive a permit.

### Submit to the Village Hall

All Building and Demolition Permit Applications must be processed, approved, and issued a permit number, BEFORE WORK CAN BEGIN. This includes small projects, renovations, and new builds which could take up to 2 weeks to process. Please leave enough time before working on your project.

Our permits are revised and posted on the website throughout the year. Make sure to print out the latest forms. Permit Forms can be found on our Forms and Applications page on the Village Website listed under Quick Links.

## Door-to-Door Sales

### Solicitation Permit Required

Door-to-door solicitation permits are needed PRIOR to doing solicitation door-to-door. No warnings will be granted. Please report anyone that does not have a permit to come to your door. Please try and get their name and car make/model/color. Solicitors without a permit will be fined.

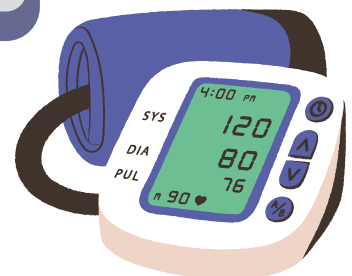

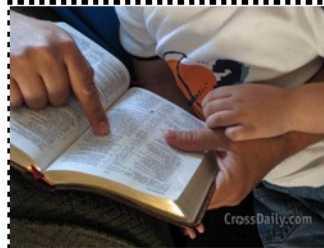
