



# Summer Snow

By Colleen Tauke | Finished Size: 60-1/2" x 75-1/2"



### **Yardage**

1/2 yd - (16) prints ranging light to dark  
1/2 yd - white solid  
1/2 yd - navy solid  
5/8 yd - binding  
4 yds - backing

### **Supplies**

Rotary Cutter  
Cutting Mat  
8-1/2" x 24-1/2" ruler or similar  
Fabric marking pen/pencil  
Scissors  
Pins  
Iron and pressing mat



NOTE: Read all directions before beginning the cutting process

WOF is width of fabric

RST is right sides together

### **Cutting**

#### **16 Prints**

From **each of (15) print fabrics** cut the following:

(1) 8" x WOF strip  
sub-cut into (4) 8" squares

From the **remaining print** cut the following:

(1) 8" x WOF strip  
sub-cut into (3) 8" squares

Scrappy style pieced border

Select (1) print and cut (4) 4-1/2" squares for border cornerstones

From the remaining (15) prints cut the following:

(10) 4-1/2" x 11" rectangles for top and bottom borders

**and**

(10) 4-1/2" x 14" rectangles for left and right border

#### **White and Navy solid**

From **each color** cut the following:

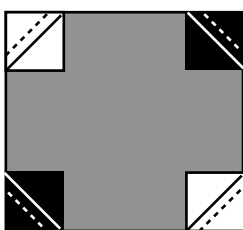
(6) 2" x WOF strips  
sub-cut into (126) 2" squares of white and of navy

From the **navy** cut the following:

(7) 2-1/2" x WOF strips - binding

### **Construction**

1. Using a fabric marking pen/pencil mark a diagonal line corner to corner across each of the (252) 2" white and navy squares.
2. Beginning with the solid white 2" squares, position a square RST in one corner of an 8" print square. Stitch on the solid diagonal line shown below. Press the light triangle outward. Trim the underneath layers to 1/4" outside the stitching line shown as the broken line below. Repeat this process by placing a second white 2" square into the opposite corner. Stitch in the same manner to complete all (63) squares.
3. Next, work this same process with the solid navy 2" squares. Position them into the remaining two corners. Stitch, press and trim to complete all of the (63) blocks.

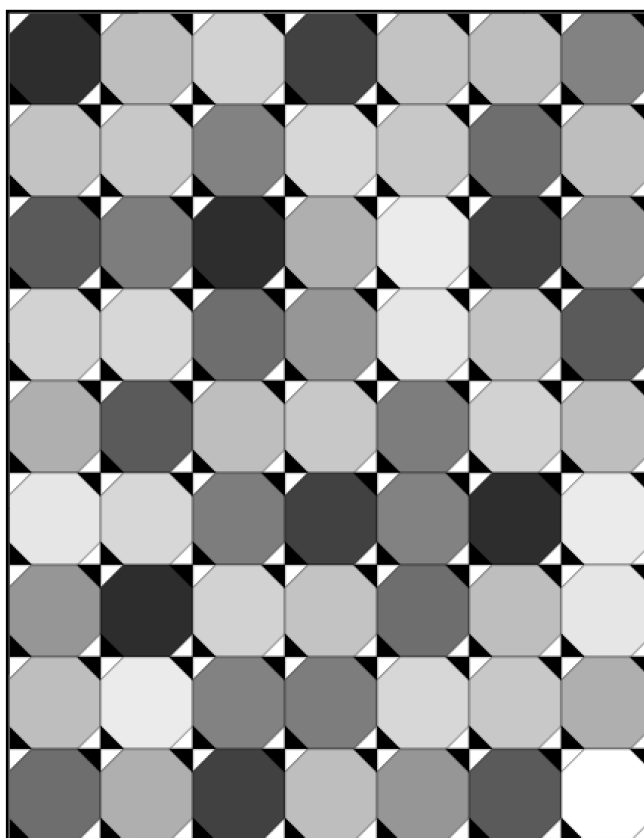

4. Arrange the blocks into a (9) rows of (7) blocks each. Use a design wall to assist in the arranging of the various prints to somewhat balance the lights and darks evenly across the quilt. Join blocks into rows. Press all seams in odd numbered rows to the right and even numbered rows to the left.



5. Join rows to create the center of the quilt.



6. Select the (10) 4-1/2" x 14" rectangles. Join (5) rectangles along the short ends to create one left border and the remaining (5) rectangles to create the right border. Join these to the corresponding sides of the patchwork top.



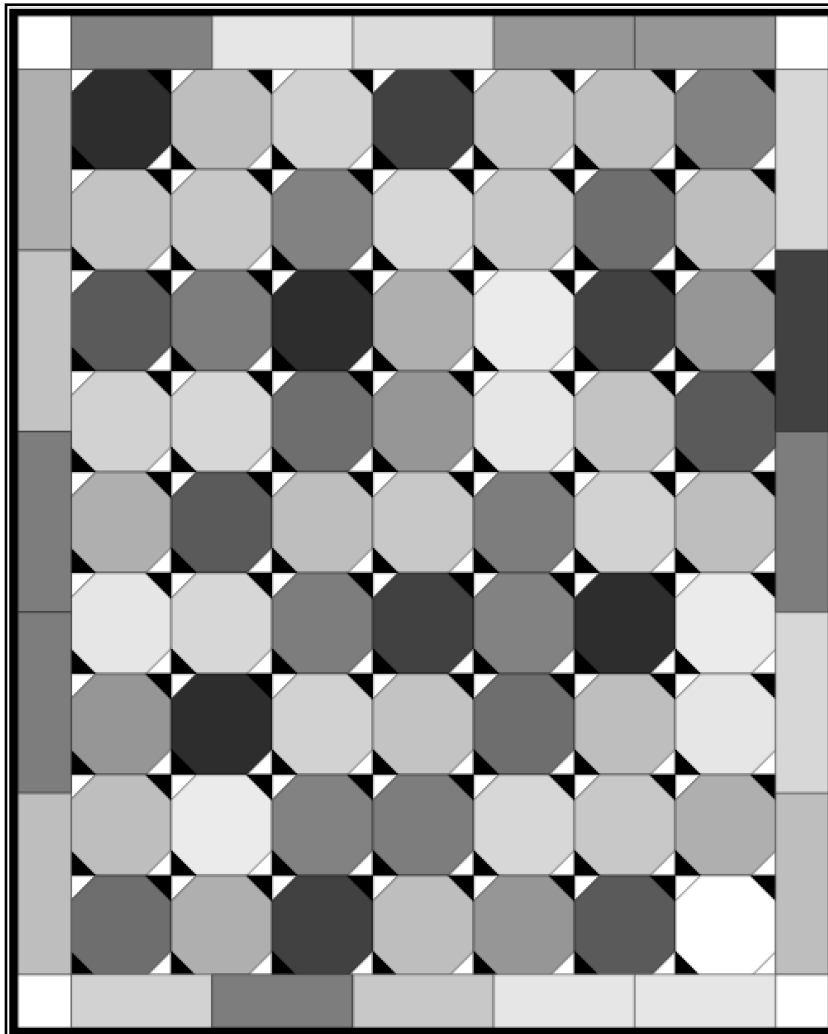

7. Select the (10) 4-1/2" x 11" and the (4) 4-1/2" cornerstone squares. Join (5) rectangles end to end. Then join (1) 4-1/2" square to each end of this the border strip. Make a second border strip in the same manner. Join one to the top and one to the bottom of the quilt center. Your quilt top is complete.

8. Layer the the patchwork top with batting and backing. Quilt as desired. Bind.



9. Below is a photo of the quilting design I used with the plush backing fabric.
