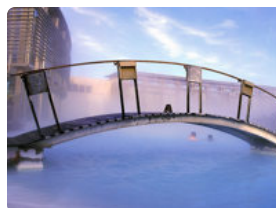

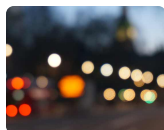
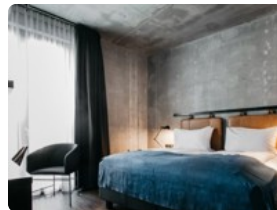

Exeter Hotel is located right by the old harbour in Reykjavik. The hotel's main building is a restoration of a house originally built in 1904 as storage and later used as a house of residence and trade. Along the way, guests will learn about Icelandic knitting customs, contemporary fibre arts, and the enduring importance of wool in Icelandic culture, while enjoying ample time to browse and shop for unique yarns, patterns, and handcrafted souvenirs.

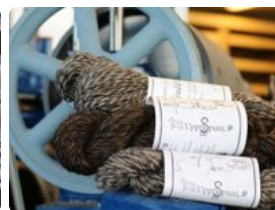
The Woollen Circle – South Iceland's Wool & Heritage Route

A playful twist on Iceland's famous Golden Circle, the Woollen Circle showcases the country's rich wool heritage while taking in some of South Iceland's most beautiful landscapes.

Accompanied by your private guide, travel through the scenic countryside with a visit to Þingvellir National Park, a UNESCO World Heritage Site and the birthplace of the Icelandic nation, before continuing to some of the key stops along the Woollen Circle route.

Highlights include visits to Þingborg, one of Iceland's best-known wool centres; Uppspuni Mini Mill, where Icelandic fleece is transformed into premium yarn; and Hespa, renowned for its natural dyeing techniques and handcrafted wool products. The day also includes a stop at the spectacular Gullfoss waterfall and Geysir hot springs.

Combining Iceland's iconic scenery with authentic textile experiences, the Woollen Circle offers a unique insight into the traditions, craftsmanship, and creativity that have made Icelandic wool famous around the world.





Lunch at Friðheimar - Greenhouse

Learn more about how Iceland produces fresh vegetables all year 'round through **geothermal horticulture** by visiting the geothermal greenhouse at **Friðheimar**. The main produce of the Friðheimar farm is tomatoes, in many different forms. First, you'll get a private introduction to the processes of the greenhouse, and after, of course you'll get to taste the fresh produce with a delicious lunch amidst the tomato plants.

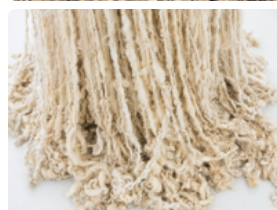

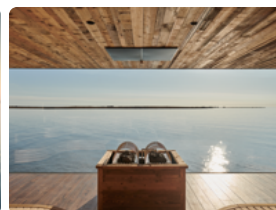
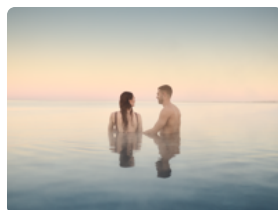


Sky Lagoon - Sér Admission

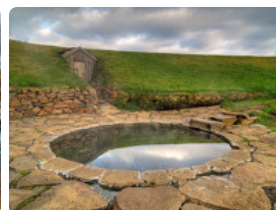
Day 5

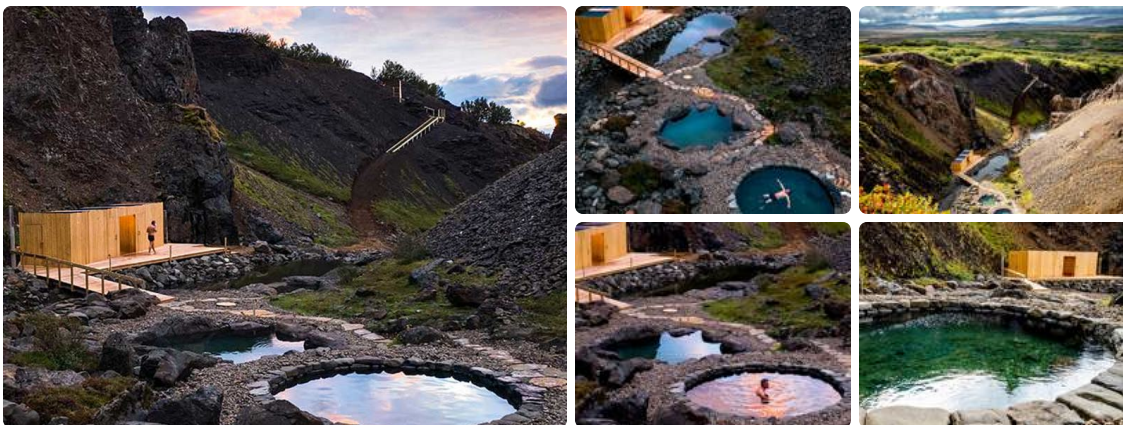


Húsafell Giljaböð - Canyon Baths

Húsafell Giljaböð

Led by a knowledgeable local guide in English, this year-round tour begins with a short ride from the **Húsafell Activity Centre** to the trailhead in the remote Icelandic Highlands. On this 2-hour tour you will enjoy a relaxed walk among natural wonders not found in many guidebooks, including the spectacular two-tiered waterfall **Langifoss**. You'll also learn about Iceland's renewable energy practices, cross an icy stream of glacial meltwater and see the site to **Okjökull**, Iceland's first glacier claimed by climate change. Note that the route can change due to unforeseen weather circumstances such as snow, ice, mud or water.

The highlight of our excursion is a serene soak in the Húsafell Canyon Baths, a surreal hot spring paradise that has to be seen to be believed. Enjoy half an hour of relaxing, recharging and breathing in the pure Icelandic air before heading back to Hotel Húsafell.

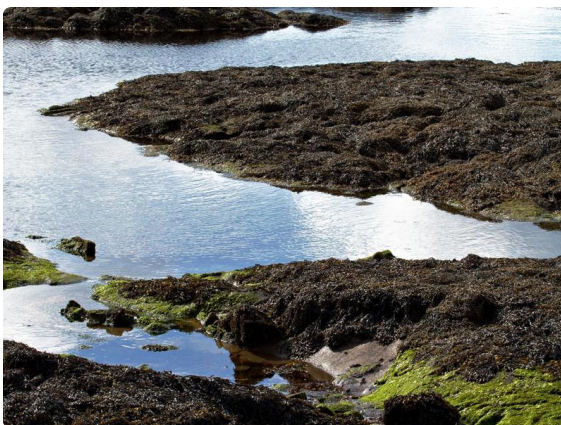
