Beginning Watercolor Techniques Supply List

If you have similar supplies, you can bring them and we'll see if they work.

- Watercolor paper pad Cold press, ~8x10 or 9x12
 - Fluid, Bee Paper, Fabriano, Strathmore Vision, Canson XL
- Watercolor Paint Basic set of 18-24* pans**
 - Gansai Tambi set of 24 or more (basic set, not Art Nouveau set)
 - Sakura Koi Watercolor set of 18 or more
- *Set should include both cool and warm primary colors. If you're making your own set, look for:
 - Cool Red (ex. Carmine, Rose Madder, Quin. Red, Crimson Lake)
 - Warm Red (ex. Scarlet, Vermillion, Cadmium)
 - Cool Blue (ex. Phthalo, Cerulean, Cobalt, Cyan)
 - Warm Blue (ex. Ultramarine)
 - Cool Yellow (ex. Light Cadmium, Lemon, Hansa Light)
 - Warm Yellow (ex. Permanent Deep, Deep Cadmium, Aureolin)

**If using paint in tubes, let them dry in *full size* pans in an empty watercolor tin

- Brushes You only need the 3 brushes listed below for this class. If you have other watercolor brushes you want to play with, feel free to bring them. Princeton Select or Princeton Aqua Elite are great.
 - Round 6 & 10 or 8 & 12
 - Flat/Wash ¾" or 1"
 - more on following page

- Mixing tray or palette (ex. plastic or ceramic paint tray with 6-10 wells)
- Board Rigid, smooth, non-absorbent board for taping paper to, ~14"x18"
 - (ex. masonite, a drawing board, or a large cutting board)
- Tape 2 sizes (ex. art tape, washi tape, painters tape, masking tape)
 - Wide (~.75" or 2cm)
 - Narrow (~.5" or 1cm)
- Pencil Any mechanical, HB, or 2B pencil
- Eraser ex. Staedtler Mars Plastic
- Ruler, 12"-18"
- 2 cups for water

White cotton rag - Cut up old white t-shirts are perfect (if you don't have one, I'll give you one at the first class)
