1-101 Tucker Trimmer I® and Shaded Four Patch Learn how to use a Tucker Trimmer I® to create half square triangles, quarter square triangles, and combination units. You will also learn how to expand the use of your Tucker Trimmer I® by creating a Shaded Four Patch unit. By using Deb Tucker’s method of strip piecing the construction of a shaded-four patch, the quilter eliminates the need to stitch fabrics on an unsecured bias.

*Required tools: Tucker Trimmer I® and Quilter’s Magic Wand®

*Required Technique Sheet: Shaded Four Patch

*Required Design Sheet: Tucker Trimmer I

Basic Sewing Supplies

Sewing Machine with
power cords and manual (just in case)
Thread
Machine needles
Snips or trimming scissors
Seam ripper

Basic Quilting Supplies

Rotary cutter with a sharp blade
Marking Pencil (mechanical will do)
Small cutting mat
Straight edge ruler approx. 6" x 12" or so
Invisigrip (Optional)
Best Press or light starch (Optional)

Pre-Cutting Instructions

- Fabrics are denoted with an A or B to indicate that this should be different fabric colors.
- Strips are cut on the width of the fabric or wof based on 40" of usable fabric
- Cutting will provide you with plenty of practice material for the purpose of class participation.

Half Square Triangle 4" finished Unit	Fabric A Cut (2) 5" x 5" squares Fabric B Cut (2) 5" x 5" squares
Combination Unit 4" finished Unit	Fabric A Cut (2) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares Fabric B Cut (2) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares Fabric C (4) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares
Hourglass Units 4" finished Unit	Fabric A Cut (4) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares Fabric B Cut (4) 5 ½" x 5 ½" squares
Shaded Four Patch Unit 4" finished	Fabric A Cut (1) strip 2 ¾" x wof Fabric B Cut (1) strip 3 ¾" x wof Fabric C Cut (2) 5" x 6" rectangles
