



From the Treasurer

Hi everyone, many thanks to everyone who came out to the BCQG September Guild meeting, our 2023-2024 BCQG Budget was approved! We have already made a change to that Budget, more on that below.

Our September 2023 Profit & Loss Report (P&L) will be available on the September 24, 2023 snippet.

Beach Cities Quilters Guild is a member of the Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG), which, among other things, provides our insurance for slips and falls. Our insurance premium - which is based on the number of members in the guild - was significantly raised for the 2023-2024 Fiscal Year, which, for us, begins October 1, 2023. The Board approved increasing the budget by \$500 to ac-

commodate that increase on September 21, 2023.

We hope that our upcoming Tea & Tour will provide a little income, and look forward to a successful Quilt Show in April. That being said, the Board will look for economies to work within the approved budget, and plan for changes as explained in the 2023-2024 Budget Committee report:

"The Committee believes if we - as a guild - diligently advertise our upcoming Quilt Show, and have a discussion about other ways to reduce expenses in the future (i.e., going dark one month in the year, increase membership dues slightly, find local speakers to reduce hotel and travel expense, etc.) we can continue in a more fiscally responsible way."


Lastly, we need to fill 2 more positions on the Quilt Show Committee...WE NEED YOU!

Volunteer to white glove at the Road to California Quilt Show in January 2024. See details below.

As we do each year, we schedule our Opportunity quilts to have a day at ROAD 2 CA to sell raffle tickets. Our day for 2024 is Wednesday, January 17 the first day of the show. To be able to sell tickets, we are responsible for 20 volunteer hours of white glove service. That means 10 volunteers doing 2 hour shifts. Volunteers may work <u>any day</u> to satisfy our commitment for white gloving. Volunteers are assigned time periods. Volunteers may not split shifts. Three guild members can sign up for each time period. <u>EACH 2 HOUR VOLUNTEER WILL RECEIVE A FREE ENTRY</u> BRACELET.

The following are the times as scheduled by ROAD for white glove:

Tuesday, January 16 - (this is the preview night) - 6:00 - 8:30

From Wednesday January 17 – Saturday January 20 the times are:

9:00 - 11:0011:00 - 1:001:00 - 3:003:00 - 5:30

(Please note: already have 2 signed up for the 9:00 AM slot on 1/17; could possibly have 1 more as only 3 are allowed per time slot)

Practice on pre-basted fabric and batting samples or use up leftover quilt blocks. Philanthropy News

Thank you to all who have contributed to philanthropy, it's been another incredible year of giving. To date BCQG has donated 1316 quilts, 876 pillowcases, 170 NICU blankets, 65 fleece blankets and a total of 1557 comfort items to our community! So proud of BCQG and its generous members!

Our drive for quilts for Maui, lead by Pat Price, has been SO successful! 95 quilts collected so far! A HUGE thank you to Hoffman Fabrics who stepped up to ship all 95 quilts to Maui for us in September!! Just amazing!

Donations from members totaling \$713, including one generous member who put a \$100 dollar bill in the collection box on guild night, should cover quilts we will ship in October. Thank you all so much for your generosity!

October starts our new Philanthropy year and new, more manageable quilt collection plan. See below for all the details.

Back To Our Roots

The Philanthropy Team is working hard to make things more manageable. With the support of BCQG's board, will be implementing these changes starting in the month of October:

- We will be accepting **finished quilts only**. No tops, blocks or partially finished quilts.
- We will continue to offer baby and children quilt kits, they will include batting and must be returned quilted and bound.
- We plan to help members connect with longarm quilters who are willing to donate their help on a limited basis.
- We plan to demonstrate domestic machine quilting techniques at Sew Day meetings to enable and encourage members to finish their quilts. Dates to be announced.
- We will continue to have NICU, pillowcase, Teddy bear kits and tops paired with batting, backs and bindings ready for quilting available at Sew Day and guild meetings.



Featured Advertiser

This year we are offering our advertisers a chance to tell you about their business.

This month we are featuring "Sewing Center of OC".

The Sewing Center first opened in SoCal when we took over the last two "Fabric City" stores in September of 2001, one in Anaheim and the other in Temple City. Sadly, the fabric store was centered around a sewing machine department business model which was no longer viable in SoCal, so we closed the two locations. Subsequently, we became the Singer Sewing Center of Orange County and set up shop across the parking lot from M & L Fabrics where we sold Singer and Baby Lock machines and a limited selection of fabric. When the Calico House Quilt Store sadly closed its doors, Sheri (the owner of the Quilt Cupboard) and I felt like their old location was a definite upgrade from our Garden Grove location. And as luck would have it, our lease was up so we moved to the wonderful city of Placentia and became neighbors again. Since then, we have added the Juki and Janome machine lines.

- We are the only shop in Orange County that always has a factory trained Tech on duty.
- We perform all repairs and services in our location, your machine does not leave our location.
