Our Guest Speaker: Joe Cunningham

Our speaker for January 2026 is Joe Cunningham, Joe has been shaping the modern quilt world since 1979. A nationally known artist, speaker and instructor, his work has been featured on PBS's award-winning Craft in America, HGTV's Simply Quilts, and The Quilt Show with Ricky Tims and Alex Anderson.



His quilts are in the permanent collections of the DeYoung museum, The Shelburne Museum, The Newark Museum, The San Jose Museum of Quilts and Textiles and many private collections.

He is the author of ten influential quilting books, including Men and the Art of Quilting — the first of its kind — and Quilting with Style, considered a definitive guide to quilt marking.

Joe has received prestigious grants and residencies, including a Shulte Grant from the Fort Mason Foundation, he has been an artist residency at the DeYoung Museum in San Francisco, and has studied with the Gees Bend quilters in Alabama.

Joe lectures and teaches across the U.S. and online.

Philanthropy News

This month 100 quilts were donated to: CHOC Irvine & Mission Viejo, Harbor Point Church Marine Brunch, Persons in need, Priority Center, Silverado Memory Care, UCI Oncology Orange & Irvine, United Cerebral Palsy, VA Long Beach, Vets in Hospice, and Village of Hope. 108 other items were donated including 15 fleece wraps to CAST, 43 Pillow cases to Project Foster, CHOC, & Vitas Hospice, place mats and table toppers to Silverado Memory Care and Village of Hope.

Please join us for our next sew day to be held on Jan 5. We meet at Presbyterian Church of the Masters. 26051 Marguerite Pkwy, Mission Viejo, 92692. (Corner of Oso and Marguerite park in lot closest to Oso). Set up starts at 9:00. Meeting at 10:00 (or when ever you get there). Show and tell is at 11:00. We usually start cleanup around 2:30. Helpers are always appreciated for setup and take down. Irons, ironing boards, cutting mats, rulers and cutters are provided. We also have kits for quilts, NICU blankets and pillow cases to be worked on. Batting is provided for quilts to be donated to Philanthropy.

At the January meeting we will have a demo to make a Bowl Cozy using a Accuquilt GO cutting machine. There will be fabric and wrap-n-zap for you to sew after the demo. Please be sure to have 100% cotton thread to use. If you use our supplies we ask that you donate the finished bowl cozy to the boutique. You are welcome to bring your own fabric and batting to cut on the machine and sew up for yourself. You will need: 2 - 9 1/2 " squares of 100% cotton fabric, 2 9 1/2" squares of 100% cotton batting , 100% cotton thread. WARNING: Anything other than 100% cotton can catch fire in the microwave. Do not use insulated batting or batting with scrim.
