
PRESIDENT'S BLOCK

It's time for us to make blocks for Mary Mulcahey, President. She has chosen a fun theme with wonderful batiks for the background.

Blocks are due by the June general meeting, June 13. I'm looking forward to seeing the rest of the contributions. The quilt is starting to gel. Fondly, Sherri Peltier

BLOCK INSTRUCTIONS for **<u>UNDER THE OCEAN</u>**

- 1. Your design must fit within a 5" square in the middle of your block fabric. The committee will square up all blocks after they are turned in, so please do not cut your block down. There must be a minimum of 1 inch all around your design.
- 2. All methods of applique, embroidery, piecing, etc. are welcome. If you apply a raw edge applique, please zigzag the edges.
- 3. Embellishments are fine, just don't attach them to your block. Put them into a small baggie with your name on it and staple it to the edge of your block. The committee will attach them after quilting.
- Your name is very important. Please write your name close to the edge of your design so it doesn't get cut off when the blocks are squared up. I will have some pens to use if you forget to sign your name.
- 5. Be creative and have fun. Blocks are due at the June guild meeting.



You are invited to join in the fun with this year's Block Party event! Many of you have already joined in the adventure, but there are many of you who haven't. Why not???


This year we are doing sampler blocks - some very old, well-known ones, and some old ones that are not so well known. If you are a beginning quilter, you will find the instructions easy to follow. If you are a more advanced quilter and have done these blocks before, we invite you to grab your stash and make the blocks into a top that you can donate to Philanthropy. They can always use some larger sized quilts and will welcome your donation. OR - here's an idea: make the blocks in red, white and blue, and that will make a perfect quilt for a veteran.

You can pick up the instructions for the blocks each month at the Block Party table in the front of the room near the stage. You can also see what the quilt can look like when entirely finished. That's just shown for inspiration -- and we're sure you can envision it in colors of your own choice. Once you pick up the block instructions for the current block, make it up and bring it with you the following month. Show it to the ladies sitting at the Block Party table, and your name will go into a bag for a drawing that evening. What will you win if your name is picked? It could be a gift card to somewhere like Starbucks or JoAnn's or - who knows? Or it could be a stack of fat quarters. Or it could be another item related to quilting.

At the end of this year's Block Party event, there will be a grand prize (as yet unrevealed) that you will want to win! How do you qualify for the grand prize? Block Party – 2017-2018

LOUISIANA

Fabric A: (Darkest Fabric) Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 26 1/2". Sub-cut into 4 – 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.

Fabric B: (Medium Fabric) Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 14 1/4". Sub-cut into 4 – 3 1/2" squares.

Fabric C: (Background Fabric)

Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 26 1/2". Sub-cut into 4 - 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles. Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 14 1/4". Sub-cut into 4 - 3 1/2" squares.

NOTE: For Fabric C you can cut 1 strip of 3 1/2" x WOF, then make all your sub-cuts.

Draw a diagonal line on the back of all Fabric B and C 3 1/2" squares. Place a Fabric B square on the right side of a Fabric A rectangle (right sides together); orienting your drawn line from upper middle to lower right corner.


Stitch on drawn line. Lay a ruler on the stitched line and trim excess fabric to 1/4" toward the corner . Press to medium fabric.



drawn line from upper middle to the lower left corner.



Repeat sewing on line, trimming to 1/4" and pressing to background fabric. Assemble 3 more rectangles using instructions above. Square up all the Rectangles to 3 1/2" x 6 1/2". Sew a Fabric C rectangle to the top of each of the above completed rectangles, pressing toward the background fabric.



This block should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".


Our workshops are held at Community Presbyterian Church, 32202 Del Obispo Street, San Juan Capistrano, CA 92675.

Supplies:

- 1. "My Basket Collection" pattern by Sandy Corbin. --- I will bring them for purchase @ \$11.00 each.
- 2. Matching thread to top-stitch the handles
- 3. An open toe foot is really nice, so that you can see best for top-stitching
- 4. Cutting mat (at least 18"x 18" or bigger is better) and Rotary cutter
- 5. 6" x 12" Ruler, and a 6" x 24" Ruler. Also a 12" Square Ruler is nice if you already have one.
- 6. Sewing machine with all the supplies; scissors, seam riper, pins, thread, etc.
- 7. Clover Yo-Yo maker size small optional
- 8. Pencil and a few color pencils
- 9. Mini iron and pad if you have one
- 10. 16 safety pins (any size)

1 Dreamed 1 Was A Butterfly

A workshop with Sandy Corbin 2018

The Butterfly & Flower designs are made with invisible machine appliqué.

The class supply list .;

- 1. "I Dreamed I was a Butterfly" pattern by Sandy Corbin. I will bring them for purchase @ \$11.00 each.
- 2. An open toe foot is really nice, so that you can see best for machine appliqué.
- 3. Medium size permanent marker Red and fine tip black.
- 4. Spray starch (can) (if you don't have it , not to worry I'll bring mine also).
- 5. FREEZER PAPER --- lots ... we will be layering it ..
- 6. Pencils that will show up on your fabric!
- 7. Clear no-melt Mylar template plastic. 91/2" x 121/2" sheet.
- 8. Clear thread both smoke and clear.
- 9. Basting glue such as Roxanne's.
- 10. Scraps of fabric to practice appliqué.
- 11. Machine thread for piecing. A lighter weight thread for the bobbin is best, if you have it..
- 12. Cutting mat, rotary cutter, and 6" x 24" & 61/2" x 61/2" rulers.
- 13. Sewing machine with all the usual supplies; scissors, seam ripper, pins, thread, etc.

Fabric requirements: For the PILLOW 18" x 18" "This doesn't have to be a pillow"

1/4 yard Shoo Fly (pieced solid section)

- 1/3 yard Background area (dots in the photo)
- 1 fat quarters-top wing section

<u>There needs to be a repeat in this fabric to match the top wings</u> **3 fat quarters**—One each for wing bottom, stem/leaf, flower spiral.

5" sq. Flower background. Use a coordinating solid or tone on tone.

¹/4 yard Brown for the body.

1/4 yard Binding. Coordinate with or the same as the Butterfly wings.

Brown Floss DMC for antenna

Bring two fat-quarters and a 14"zipper (or longer) if you would like to make your pillow back.

Fabric requirements: For the TABLE RUNNER 141/2" x 43"

1 yard Background

1/3 - 3/8 yard Shoo Fly (gold) and binding

10 to 12 fat quarters for butterfly wings. The more the better so there are choices There needs to be a repeat in this fabric to match the top wings

¹/₄ yard Brown for the body

¹/₄ yard Binding (If you want something different). Brown embroidery floss DMC for antenna

brown embroidery noss Divic for ane

Please do before class ! ! !

For <u>Pillow</u> cut: \rtimes \rtimes \rtimes

Background fabric; One 5" strip and a 6"strip. From the 5" strip cut two 5" squares and four $4\frac{1}{2}$ "squares. Set aside the 6" strip and bring to class. **Shoo Fly fabric**; Cut two 5" squares and one $4\frac{1}{2}$ " square.

Draw a diagonal line on the back of 5" squares.

Please do before class ! ! ! For <u>Table Runner</u> cut: × × ×

Background fabric; Two - 5" strips. Set aside 2 strips and bring to class.
One 3 ¹/₂" strip, cut into eleven 3¹/₂" squares.
One 4" strip, cut one 3 ¹/₂" square and six 4" squares.
Shoo Fly fabric; Cut one 4" strip. Cut into six 4" squares.
From remaining piece cut three 3¹/₂" squares.
Draw a diagonal line on the back of 4" squares.

Exit Stage Left – modern string quilts workshop

Teacher/Designer: Tonya Alexander

This workshop will explore several possibilities for using 1 ½"-wide scrap strips. The focus project is "Exit Stage Left" but an assortment of additional scrap projects will also be explored as well. In addition to basic project directions, instruction will include: alternative grid work, block scale, scrap fabric selection, effects of value, working with scraps & neutrals, layout tips and tricks, and lots of time to play with fabric!



Suggested materials/tools:

- Your copy of Stash Lab Manual: String Theory
- · Sewing machine and all regular sewing supplies

Personal pressing station supplies, if desired and possible in the space.

• Cutting mat, rotary cutter, 6" x 12" ruler, or similar size of your preference for cutting strips

- 6 ½" x 6 ½" square ruler
- · Temporary marking pen or pencil
- Fabric as listed in project directions

Preparation/before class:

I recommend that you cut your fabric strips and piece the white and gray strip set units before class so that you have more time for actual block construction and quilt top layout during class time.

A note on fabric selection:

Low volume fabrics are light printed background fabrics that can include white, beige, gray, or even light pastels. In this project, the white background fabrics and gray fabrics create subtle contrast that give the arrows their definition. Take a look at the sample as well as pictures in the lab manual when making your fabric selections. The more the better! The gradient yellow/orange fabrics can be switched out with any color of your choosing, just bring a wide range to choose from Woll piece the errors are used to non-selection to fabric selections.

from. We'll piece the orange row together so no need to pre-sew the strip sets for these before class.

I hope you'll join us. I'm looking forward to spending the day with you and playing with fabric – we're going to have a great time!

Philanthropy Newsletter Report – June, 2018

First, let me tell you about the storage unit status. After the fire at Public Storage, where we have the BCQG unit, we were so worried about smoke and water damage. We knew the unit was intact. The great news is that everything is just fine. No hint of smoke damage at all. What a blessing! We are so sorry for those that lost a great deal, including many treasures.

In the month between the April and May Guild meetings, we donated 69 quilts and 74 miscellaneous baby items. 35 baby quilts went to Operation Showers of Appreciation at Camp Pendleton. Along with them went 35 taggie lovies, 28 handmade chicks and bears, 7 special blankets, 1 handknit baby sweater, 2 diaper changing pads, and 1 embroidered burp cloth. Prototypes received 1 baby quilt and 2 kids quilts. Seacrest Hospice received 5 quilts for veterans in hospice. United Cerebral Palsy received 2 quilts for resident's rooms. UCI Oncology received 10 quilts. Royale Therapeutic Treatment Center received 4 quilts. Mission Internal Medicine Infusion received 7 quilts. 2 quilts went to individuals in need and 1 quilt went to the BCQG quilt show auction.

If you are so inclined, we could use some more help with baby quilts. We have a break over the summer – with no baby showers, but then we have 3 more in the balance of the calendar year. We gave every baby quilt we had on hand for the May shower. We received more at Sewing Day and again at Guild. We have quite a few in the quilting pipeline, but we know the time will fly by and we do love helping our military families.

The next Sewing Day will be on Monday, June 4th, from 10:30 until about 4:00, at the Laguna Niguel Library, 30341 Crown Valley Parkway, Laguna Niguel. Liz Pickering and Jana McDonough will be in charge again. It's always a fun day. You are most welcome to join us, even if only for Show and Tell at 11:00 a.m.





Prints: 2 Charm Packs[™] (80-5" squares) Solid: 1 Charm Pack[™] (40-5" squares) Solid Inner Border: ½ yard Final Border & Binding: ⅔ yard Backing: 3 yards

X'S AND O'S

Quilt is 45" x 45".

Fabric requirements for Roadies Give Back:

The 2½" Squares (Solid - Under the Directions) must be in solid, or printed fabric black - but the print should be mostly black. The 5" Square (Print - Under the Directions) must be in brights - any color is appropriate.



Blocks


Solid Charm Pack[™]: Cut each square in half twice to make 4 matching 2½" squares. Press the 2½" squares in half on the diagonal (or draw a line on the diagonal). Press 160 squares.




Block: Layer a two 2½" Solid squares on the lower left and upper right corner of the one 5" Charm square, right sides together. Sew on the diagonal lines.



• Trim ¼" from the seam lines. Press to the corners to form triangles. Repeat to make a total of 100 Blocks that are 5" square




B Large Block: Take 4 Blocks and lay them solid to solid and print to print.





Assembly: Sew the Large Blocks into 5 rows that each have 5 Large Blocks. Press the rows in alternating rows. Combine the rows.
