Quilt Show Results

Thanks to the co-chairs

Here are the financials for our "Sunshine, Lollypops & Rainbows" Quilt Show. We all worked very hard to make this a great show, and one to remember for years to come.

Total income was \$55,705 - \$10,500 more than budget and \$7,300 more than the incredibly successful 2016 show.

Vendors - \$15,615 Opportunity quilt tickets - \$13,671 Admissions - \$11,641 Auction results - \$7,231 Boutique - \$4,036 Raffle Baskets - \$3,061 Pins - \$353

Total expenses were \$21,156 Material (as in significant, not fabric) expenditures included: Facility including table, chair and linen rentals - \$17,844 Opportunity quilt – construction and tickets - \$1,154

Net Cash \$34,551


BLOCK PARTY

That means there are only 2 more blocks to complete this year's offering, however, there will be 8 more bonus blocks so you can complete your top of 20 blocks like the one we've been showing at Guild each month. So - how do you get these "extra" blocks? We will be publishing a booklet containing ALL 20 blocks that will be available at the September and October meetings for \$5. Block Party – 2017-2018

June 2018

CHISHOLM TRAIL

Fabric A: (Darkest Fabric)

Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 7". Sub-cut into 2 – 3 1/2" squares.

Fabric B: (Medium Fabric)

Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 28 1/4". Sub-cut into 8 – 3 1/2" squares.

Cut a strip 4" x 12 1/4". Sub-cut into 3 – 4" squares.

Fabric C: (Background Fabric)

Cut a strip 3 1/2" x 26 1/4". Sub-cut into 4 – 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" rectangles.

Cut a strip 4" x 12 1/4". Sub-cut into 3 – 4" squares.

Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on the back of Fabric C 4" squares. Make HSTs by laying Fabric C squares right sides together on Fabric B 4" squares. Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line; cut on the drawn line and press toward the darker fabric. Square up these 6 HSTs to 3 1/2".

Draw a diagonal line corner to corner on the back of Fabric B 3 1/2" squares. Place a Fabric B square right sides together on the right side of a Fabric C rectangle. The drawn line should go from the upper middle down to the right corner of the rectangle.



Stitch on drawn line. Lay a ruler on the stitched line and trim excess fabric to 1/4" toward the corner. Press to corner.



Repeat the process above on the left side of the Fabric C rectangle; watch orientation of the drawn line.



Your rectangle should now look like this diagram that is known as a Flying Geese unit. Make 3 more of these units.



Sew the center 4-patch in Row 2 together. Lay out all completed units and Fabric A squares as shown in the diagram at the top. Sew the horizontal rows together, pressing the seams on Rows 1 and 3 to the left and Row 2 to the right. Sew completed rows together, pressing away from the center row.

The unfinished block should measure 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".

WORKSHOPS

General Information for Workshops

Place:

Our workshops are held at Community Presbyterian Church, 32202 Del Obispo Street, San Juan Capistrano, CA 92675.

Time: 10:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. You may arrive 15 minutes early to set up your work space. Remember to bring your lunch/drink/snack.

Fee: \$40.00 payable at sign-up. No refunds, but you may find a substitute to fill your spot and have them pay you.

A quote from Tanya Alexander. Our July guest speaker:

"Class Full." Those are delightful words for a teacher offering a class – a bummer if you were trying to get into the class too late! Do you take classes at your local quilt shop, at conferences, or with your guild? Classes can be so much more than learning a specific technique or quilt pattern. As a teacher and as a student myself, here's what I love about them:

- -shared passion, excitement for our craft and truly the art of quilting
- -support and encouragement from other quilters
- -Idea overload in a good way!
- -a different perspective
- -learning a new project, the actual content of the class itself...



Exit Stage Left - modern string quilts workshop

Teacher/Designer: Tonya Alexander

This workshop will explore several possibilities for using 1 ½"-wide scrap strips. The focus project is "Exit Stage Left" but an assortment of additional scrap projects will also be explored as well. In addition to basic project directions, instruction will include: alternative grid work, block scale, scrap fabric selection, effects of value, working with scraps & neutrals, layout tips and tricks, and lots of time to play with fabric!



Suggested materials/tools:

- Your copy of Stash Lab Manual: String Theory
- · Sewing machine and all regular sewing supplies
- Personal pressing station supplies, if desired and possible in the space.
- Cutting mat, rotary cutter, 6" x 12"ruler, or similar size of your preference for cutting strips
- 6 ½" x 6 ½" square ruler.
- · Temporary marking pen or pencil
- · Fabric as listed in project directions

Preparation/before class:

I recommend that you cut your fabric strips and piece the white and gray strip set units before class so that you have more time for actual block construction and quilt top layout during class time.

A note on fabric selection:

class.

Low volume fabrics are light printed background fabrics that can include white, beige, gray, or even light pastels. In this project, the white background fabrics and gray fabrics create subtle contrast that give the arrows their definition. Take a look at the sample as well as pictures in the lab manual when making your fabric selections. The more the better! The gradient yellow/orange fabrics can be switched out with any color of your choosing, just bring a wide range to choose from. We'll piece the orange row together so no need to pre-sew the strip sets for these before

I hope you'll join us. I'm looking forward to spending the day with you and playing with fabric – we're going to have a great time!

Friday, September 14, Brenda Jennings will teach Improv Drunkard's Path

Curved piecing for the timid. These wonky blocks are cut freehand and sew together quickly. Fun to sew with no pinning necessary. The blocks will be trimmed to size - no need to be perfect!



PHILANTHROPY



July, 2018

We're having such a successful year in Philanthropy. It's truly a wonderful thing to see how this entire Guild contributes to the community via this program. We touch so many lives. Thank you to each and every one of you for your participation in the guild, which results in our Guild having this terrific philanthropic program.

Between the May and June meetings, we donated 47 quilts, 20 NICU blankets, and 35 pillowcases. Quilts went to Dana West Yacht Club (an auction quilt for a cancer research and treatment benefit), Sea Crest Hospice (1 quilt for a veteran), individuals in need (3 quilts), Orange County Child Abuse Prevention (19 quilts and 18 pillowcases), UCI Oncology (7 quilts), Royale Therapeutic Treatment Center (1 quilt and 17 pillowcases), UCP (1 quilt for a resident and 1 auction quilt for their benefit), CHOC (13 quilts). We also donated 20 NICU blankets to the Neo Natal Unit at Saddleback Hospital.

When we showed the philanthropy quilts at the meeting, there was some interest in a patriotic quilt with large white stars. The pattern for that quilt is from Missouri Star Quilters. It is called Big Wonky Star – made with 10" squares and a yard of other fabric for the stars. We made it a little smaller than the pattern. There is a tutorial on the MSQ website.

I want to say a special thanks to all those that are helping quilt baby quilts. If we can keep doing that, it will be easy to keep up with the need. Well, maybe not easy, but we certainly will be able to help the military families.

The next Sewing Day will be Monday, July 2nd, at the Laguna Niguel Library, 30341 Crown Valley Parkway, in Laguna Niguel. We will be there from 10:30 until about 4:00. We have such a good time and really accomplish an amazing amount of work. Show and Tell is at 11:00.







Blocks:

Prints: 2 Charm Packs[™] (80-5" squares) Solid: 1 Charm Pack[™] (40-5" squares)

Solid Inner Border: ½ yard Final Border & Binding: ¾ yard

Backing: 3 yards

X'S AND O'S

Quilt is 45" x 45".

Fabric requirements for Roadies Give Back:

The 2½" Squares (Solid - Under the Directions) must be in solid, or printed fabric black - but the print should be mostly black.

The 5" Square (Print - Under the Directions) must be in brights - any color is appropriate.




Instructions include a 1/4" seam allowance.


Blocks

Solid Charm Pack™: Cut each square in half twice to make 4 matching 2½" squares. Press the 2½" squares in half on the diagonal (or draw a line on the diagonal). Press 160 squares.


2 Block: Layer a two 2½" Solid squares on the lower left and upper right corner of the one 5" Charm square, right sides together. Sew on the diagonal lines.




 Trim ¼" from the seam lines. Press to the corners to form triangles. Repeat to make a total of 100 Blocks that are 5" square



3 Large Block: Take 4 Blocks and lay them solid to solid and print to print.



4 Assembly: Sew the Large Blocks into 5 rows that each have 5 Large Blocks. Press the rows in alternating rows. Combine the rows.
